H.B. No. 109

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

relating to residential treatment facilities for certain juveniles.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Section 554.001(a), Health and Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:

(a) The department shall designate state facilities for use ~~[the Waco Center for Youth]~~ as ~~[a]~~ residential treatment facilities ~~[facility]~~ for emotionally disturbed juveniles who:

(1) have been admitted under Subtitle C to a facility of the department; or

(2) are under the managing conservatorship of the Department of Family and Protective Services and have been admitted under Subtitle C to a state facility designated by the department under this section ~~[the Waco Center for Youth]~~.

SECTION 2. Section 554.002, Health and Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 554.002. SERVICES. (a) The department shall provide without charge appropriate education services for all clients residing at state facilities designated by the department under Section 554.001 ~~[the Waco Center for Youth]~~.

(b) The department shall pay for the ~~[those]~~ services described by Subsection (a) from funds appropriated ~~[to the center]~~ for that purpose.

1 (c) A client of a state facility designated by the
2 department under Section 554.001 [~~the center~~] who is not a resident
3 of the school district that serves the geographical area in which
4 the facility is located [~~Waco Independent School District~~] may
5 receive education services from the district [~~Waco Independent~~
6 ~~School District~~] only with the prior approval of the superintendent
7 of the district.

8 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

6 SECTION 1. Section 551.007, Health and Safety Code, is
7 amended by adding Subsection (c) to read as follows:

8 (c) If the legislature appropriates money to the commission
9 for the purpose of the construction, expansion, or operation of
10 certain inpatient mental health facilities under authority
11 conferred by Sections 2155.144(b-2) and 2166.251, Government Code,
12 the commission may award the money as a one-time grant directly to
13 an entity for that purpose.

14 SECTION 2. Section 554.001(a), Health and Safety Code, is
15 amended to read as follows:

16 (a) The department shall designate state facilities for use
17 [the Waco Center for Youth] as [a] residential treatment facilities
18 [facility] for emotionally disturbed juveniles who:

19 (1) have been admitted under Subtitle C to a facility
20 of the department; or

21 (2) are under the managing conservatorship of the
22 Department of Family and Protective Services and have been admitted
23 under Subtitle C to a state facility designated by the department
24 under this section [the Waco Center for Youth].

1 SECTION 3. Section 554.002, Health and Safety Code, is
2 amended to read as follows:

3 Sec. 554.002. SERVICES. (a) The department shall provide
4 without charge appropriate education services for all clients
5 residing at state facilities designated by the department under
6 Section 554.001 [~~the Waco Center for Youth~~].

7 (b) The department shall pay for the [~~those~~] services
8 described by Subsection (a) from funds appropriated [~~to the center~~]

10 (c) A client of a state facility designated by the
11 department under Section 554.001 [~~the center~~] who is not a resident
12 of the school district that serves the geographical area in which
