#### A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2 AN ACT TO CREATE THE RURAL COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT GRANT PROGRAM 3 AND THE DOWNTOWN REVITALIZATION GRANT PROGRAM AND TO 4 APPROPRIATE MONEY FOR PURPOSES CONSISTENT WITH THOSE PROGRAMS. 5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

6 SECTION 1.(a) There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Commerce (the Department) the sum of forty million dollars (\$40,000,000) in nonrecurring funds 7 for the 2024-2025 fiscal year to be allocated to the Rural Economic Development Division 8 9 (REDD) and used for purposes consistent with subsection (b) of this section. Funds appropriated 10 in this section must be encumbered by December 31, 2026. The Department may use up to three 11 percent (3%) of the funds appropriated in this section for administration of the Program created 12 in subsection (b) of this section.

13 SECTION 1.(b) Rural Community Development Grant Program. – The funds 14 allocated to REDD by subsection (a) of this section shall be used to create the Rural Community 15 Development Grant Program (the Community Grant Program). The Community Grant Program 16 shall provide grants to local governments in the State to attract business investment and to 17 promote population and revenue growth within those communities for the purposes of (i) reversing the trend of rural depopulation and (ii) transitioning those communities to "commuter 18 19 towns" or "bedroom communities" that promote and sustain the growth of larger adjacent 20 communities. All county and municipal governments within the State are eligible to apply for 21 grant funding under the Community Grant Program. REDD shall establish guidelines for 22 providing for administration of the Program. Those guidelines shall include the following 23 provisions, which shall apply to each grant under the Program:

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- Funds shall only be used for purposes that REDD determines are likely to (1)improve a community's economic and living conditions such that the community is better able to sustain consistent economic and population growth and is better able to balance (i) the livability of the community, (ii) the provision of government services, (iii) full employment and full housing, and (iv) maintaining public order.
- Grants may only be awarded to local governments that REDD determines (2)have satisfactorily demonstrated that a lack of community amenities within their locale has previously prevented them from attracting business investment and promoting the population and revenue growth necessary to stimulate job and revenue growth within their community. Examples of relevant community amenities include restaurants, hotels, child care centers, grocery stores, pools, parks, and hiking trails.
