#### "ONE-TIME SUPPLEMENT FOR RETIREES OF THE TEACHERS' AND STATE EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM, THE JUDICIAL RETIREMENT SYSTEM, AND THE LEGISLATIVE RETIREMENT SYSTEM

SECTION 12.2.(a) G.S. 135-5 is amended by adding a new subsection to read: 6 7 "(aaaa) On or before October 31, 2024, a one-time cost-of-living supplement payment shall 8 be made to, or on account of, beneficiaries who are living as of September 1, 2024, and whose 9 retirement commenced on or before September 1, 2024. The payment shall be two percent (2%) 10 of the beneficiary's annual retirement allowance payable as of September 1, 2024, and shall not be prorated for date of retirement commencement. If the beneficiary dies before the payment is 11 12 made, then the payment shall be payable to the member's legal representative. No beneficiary 13 shall have a vested right to any future supplemental payments under this Article." 14

**SECTION 12.2.(b)** G.S. 135-65 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:

On or before October 31, 2024, a one-time cost-of-living supplement payment shall 15 (ll)be made to, or on account of, beneficiaries who are living as of September 1, 2024, and whose 16 retirement commenced on or before September 1, 2024. The payment shall be two percent (2%) 17 of the beneficiary's annual retirement allowance payable as of September 1, 2024, and shall not 18 19 be prorated for date of retirement commencement. If the beneficiary dies before the payment is 20 made, then the payment shall be payable to the members legal representative. No beneficiary shall have a vested right to any future supplemental payments under this Article." 21

22 SECTION 12.2.(c) G.S. 120-4.22A is amended by adding a new subsection to read: 23 In accordance with subsection (a) of this section, on or before October 31, 2024, a "(ff) 24 one-time cost-of-living supplement payment shall be made to, or on account of, beneficiaries 25 who are living as of September 1, 2024, and whose retirement commenced on or before September 1, 2024. The payment shall be two percent (2%) of the beneficiary's annual retirement 26 allowance payable as of September 1, 2024, and shall not be prorated for date of retirement 27 commencement. If the beneficiary dies before the payment is made, then the payment shall be 28 29 payable to the member's legal representative. No beneficiary shall have a vested right to any 30 future supplemental payments under this Article."

SECTION 12.2.(d) The State Controller shall reserve to the Retiree Supplement 31 Reserve established in Section 2.2(f) of S.L. 2023-134 from funds available in the General Fund 32

Section 39.1(a1), as amended by Section 8.1 of S.L. 2024-1, reads 10 as rewritten: 'SECTION 39.1.(a1) Effective July 1, 2024, except as provided by subsection (b) of this 11 12 section, a person (i) whose salary is set by this Part, pursuant to the North Carolina Human 13 Resources Act, or as otherwise authorized in this act and (ii) who is employed in a State-funded 14 position on June 30, 2024, is awarded: 15 (1)A legislative salary increase in the amount of three percent (3%) five percent 16 (5%) of annual salary in the 2024-2025 fiscal year. 17 Any salary adjustment otherwise allowed or provided by law.' (2)18 19 **POSITION FUNDSHIFT RESERVE** 20 SECTION 12.4. State Agencies are authorized to use the funding provided in the 21 Position Fundshift Reserve to fundshift receipt-supported positions in the General Fund, in whole 22 or in part, to net appropriation support. 23 24 ENHANCED LABOR MARKET ADJUSTMENT RESERVE 25 SECTION 12.5. Sections 39.2 of S.L. 2024-134 reads as rewritten: 26 'SECTION 39.2.(a) Of the Enhanced Labor Market Adjustment Salary Reserve funds 27 appropriated in this act, agencies shall award salary adjustments to identified employees pursuant 28 to the following requirements: 29 Any increase provided to an employee shall not exceed the greater of fifteen (1)30 thousand dollars (\$15,000) or fifteen percent (15%) of their current base 31 salary. 32 (2)Any increase provided to an employee may not result in the employee's salary 33 exceeding the maximum salary of the salary range associated with the 34 position. 35 (3) No-If an agency has 500 or more employees, then no more than twenty-five percent (25%) of the agency's permanent employees may receive a salary 36 37 increase from the funds appropriated for this purpose. If an agency has fewer 38 than 500 employees, then 50% of the agency's permanent employees may 39 receive a salary increase. 40 (4) Funds may not be awarded to employees in positions with salaries set in law or paid based on an experience-based salary schedule that is eligible to receive 41 42 funding from the Pay Plan Reserve.

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1 (5)Funds must be used to increase salaries paid to employees and shall not be 2 used to supplant other funding sources or for any other purpose. 3 SECTION 39.2.(b) The provisions of subsection (a) of this section do not apply to the State 4 Highway Patrol or the State Bureau of Investigation, and no allocations shall be made to those 5 agencies for labor market adjustments. Notwithstanding G.S. 143C-6-6(b), agencies may use Enhanced Labor Market Adjustment Reserve funds to award salary adjustments to any General 6 Fund employee regardless of the proportionate part of the employee's current salary supported 7 8 from net appropriations or receipts. 9 **SECTION 39.2.(c)** The Director of the Budget may adjust a State agency's budgeted receipts to provide an equivalent one and one-half percent (1.5%) Labor Market Adjustment Salary 10 Reserve for the 2023-2025 fiscal biennium subject to the requirements in subsection (a) of this 11 12 section, provided that sufficient receipts are available. Agency receipts needed to implement this 13 section are appropriated for the 2023-2024 fiscal year and the 2024-2025 fiscal year. 14 SECTION 39.2.(c1) The Director of the Budget may adjust a State agency's budgeted receipts to provide an equivalent two percent (2%) Labor Market Adjustment Salary Reserve for 15 the 2023-2025 fiscal biennium subject to the requirements in subsection (a) of this section, 16 provided that sufficient receipts are available. Agency receipts needed to implement this section 17 18 are appropriated for the 2024-2025 fiscal year. SECTION 39.2.(d) The Office of State Human Resources (OSHR) shall compile a single 19 20 report detailing how these funds were distributed by each agency. The OSHR shall develop a 21 uniform reporting mechanism for agencies that display the salary increases made for each 22 position classification, the average increase provided to employees in each position classification, 23 and the market-based justification for the awarded salary increases. Agencies receiving Labor 24 Market Adjustment Salary Reserve appropriations shall report to the OSHR by December 15, 25 2023. By January 15, 2024, the OSHR shall submit the report containing the agency responses 26 to the Fiscal Research Division.' 27

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# **RETENTION BONUS AWARDED FOR FISCAL YEAR**

29 SECTION 12.6.(a) Any person (i) whose salary is set by this Part, pursuant to the 30 North Carolina Human Resources Act, or as otherwise authorized in this act and (ii) who is 31 continuously employed by the State or a public school unit from July 1, 2024 to September 30, 32 2024 shall be awarded a retention bonus for the 2024-25 fiscal year in the amount of five hundred 33 dollars (\$500.00), payable during the month of October 2024. For otherwise eligible local 34 education employees, eligibility for the bonus shall be measured beginning not on July 1, 2024, 35 but on the first day when staff report for the 2024-2025 school year.

**SECTION 12.6.(b)** Any person (i) whose salary is set by this act in Part 7A or this 36 37 Part, pursuant to the North Carolina Human Resources Act, or as otherwise authorized in this act 38 and (ii) who is continuously employed by the State or a public school unit from October 1, 2024, 39 to March 31, 2025, shall be awarded an additional retention bonus for the 2024-25 fiscal year in 40 the amount of one thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500), payable during the month of April 41 2025.

42 **SECTION 12.6.(c)** Employers of State employees and local education employees 43 shall provide an additional retention bonus of one thousand dollars (\$1,000), payable during



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the month of October 2024, to all permanent full-time State employees and local education 1 2 employees who are continuously employed by the State or a public school unit from July 1, 2024, 3 to September 30, 2024, and who earns an annual salary that does not exceed seventy-five 4 thousand dollars (\$75.000). 5 **SECTION 12.6.(d)** Employers of State employees and local education employees 6 shall provide an additional retention bonus of one thousand dollars (\$1,000), payable during the month of April 2025, to all permanent full-time State employees and local education 7 8 employees who are employed by the State or a public school unit from October 1, 2024, to March 9 31, 2025, and who earn an annual salary that does not exceed seventy-five thousand dollars 10 (\$75,000). 11 SECTION 12.6.(e) Notwithstanding Section 39.25 of S.L. 2023-134, any funds 12 appropriated for retention bonuses in excess of the amounts required to implement the bonuses 13 shall revert and not be credited to the Pay Plan Reserve. 14 **SECTION 12.6.(f)** Notwithstanding G.S. 135-1(7a), the compensation bonuses 15 awarded by this section are not compensation as defined by Article 1 of Chapter 135 of the 16 General Statutes, the Teachers' and State Employees' Retirement System (TSERS). SECTION12.6.(g) The compensation bonuses awarded by this section are not part 17 18 of annual salary and shall be paid out separately. The compensation bonus shall be awarded to 19 eligible permanent employees without regard to an employee's placement within the salary range, 20 including employees at the top of the salary range.
