7	SEC	<b>FION 1.(a)</b> Definitions. – The following definitions apply in this section:			
8	(1)	Department. – The Department of Health and Human Services.			
9	(2)	Home care services. – The following services:			
10		a. In-home companion, sitter, and respite care services provided to an			
11		individual.			
12		b. Homemaker services provided in combination with in-home			
13		companion, sitter, respite, or other home care services.			
14		c. Non-hands-on care services, as defined in 10A NCAC 13J .1501(2).			
15	SEC	<b>FION 1.(b)</b> Request for Proposal. – The Department shall develop and issue a			
16	request for proposal (RFP) no later than July 1, 2023, to contract with a third-party organization				
17	to establish and administer a three-year home care services pilot program in North Carolina,				
18	beginning no later than January 1, 2024. The Department shall select a third-party organization				
19	that has an existing presence delivering home care services in at least one other state to deliver				
20	at least the follo	wing home care services to residents of North Carolina as part of the pilot			
21	program:				
22	(1)	Home-based services such as meal preparation, cleaning and organizing,			
23		caring for pets, and other home management services.			
24	(2)	Community-based services such as grocery shopping, retail shopping, and			
25		pick-up and drop-off of items such as library materials, mail, and donations.			
26	(3)	Transportation-based services such as travel to and from medical			
27		appointments, social events, and community activities.			
28		<b>FION 1.(c)</b> Contract Requirements. – The contract between the Department and

31	(1)	A requirement that the third-party organization use an electronic scheduling			
32		platform for the delivery of home care services.
