2	department of social services represented in the multicounty team has the powers and duties
3	enumerated in subsection (a) of this section.

18	(1) Performing reviews of selected active cases in which disabled adults or older
19	adults are being served by adult protective services through local departments
20	of social services.
21	(2) Providing, arranging, or coordinating services on behalf of disabled adults or
22	older adults whose cases have been or are currently under review by the Case
23	Review Multidisciplinary Team.
24	(b) The local director of social services shall not share any information that discloses the
25	identity of individuals who have reported suspected abuse, neglect, or exploitation of a disabled
26	adult or older adult to the local department of social services, except as allowed by State or federal
27	<u>law.</u>
28	(c) Meetings of the Case Review Multidisciplinary Team are not subject to the provisions
29	of Article 33C of Chapter 143 of the General Statutes.
30	(d) The authority of a Case Review Multidisciplinary Team to disclose information
31	pursuant to this section terminates when a case is no longer an active case in which a disabled
32	adult or older adult is being served by adult protective services through a local department of
33	social services, including if the inactive status of the case is due to the disabled adult's or older
34	adult's failure to give consent to receive protective services or due to the disabled adult's or older
35	adult's withdrawal of consent to receive protective services.

38	(a) <u>All information and records acquired or generated by a Case Review</u>
39	Multidisciplinary Team during its existence and in the exercise of its duties are confidential and

41	Multidisciplinary Team as described in this Article or as otherwise permitted by State or federal
42	law. This subsection does not preclude a court of competent jurisdiction from compelling the
43 44	disclosure of any information or records acquired or generated by a Case Review
44 45	<u>Multidisciplinary Team if, in the court's opinion, disclosure is necessary to a proper</u> administration of justice and disclosure is not otherwise prohibited by State or federal law.
