9	UNNECESSARY REGULATORY BURDEN ON MASTER'S LEVEL

24	(1) Provide information regarding all of the following to each patient receiving
25	the prescription:
26	a. <u>The potential dangers of opioids.</u>
27	b. <u>Overdose prevention.</u>
28	c. <u>The availability and use of a drug approved by the federal Food and</u>
29	Drug Administration as an opioid antagonist for the complete or partial
30	reversal of opioid-induced respiratory depression.
31	(2) <u>Provide the information described in sub-subdivisions (1)a. through (1)c. of</u>
32	this subsection to one or more persons if designated by the patient receiving
33	the prescription or, for a patient who is a minor, to the minor's parent,
34	guardian, or person standing in loco parentis.
