# HOW FOURSQUARE MISSIONS INTERNATIONAL FUNCTIONS



## FOURSQUARE MISSIONS FUNCTIONS IN KEY WAYS GLOBALLY.

Foursquare Missions International (FMI) is the **worker-sending arm of the U.S. Foursquare Church**. We partner with U.S. churches to train, send, and care for FMI workers as we serve God's mission around the world.

FMI also **partners globally with national Foursquare movements** to advance the gospel, strengthen leaders, plant churches, and reach unreached people groups.

## HOW DO WE DO THIS?

*FMI operates through a structured leadership model that supports global mission expansion.*

### Field Leadership + Workers

#### Global Associate Directors (GADs)

Lead mission expansion and partnership across major world regions. They collaborate with national leaders, FMI workers, and church movements. GAD salary and regional budgets are supported primarily through the Global Mission Fund (GMF).

#### Regional Coordinators (RCs)

Serve within specific regions under the leadership of GADs. They receive regional budgets from the GMF and raise personal support and project funding beyond that budget.

#### FMI Workers

These include long-term, mid-term, short-term, field-based and emissary roles. Each worker completes FMI training and serves under a ministry assignment developed collaboratively with field and global leadership.

### U.S. Based Leaders Who Support the Mission

*FMI is supported by U.S.-based leaders who strengthen global engagement:*

**Vice President of Global Operations** – Serves as liaison to U.S. Church leadership and Global Council while giving oversight to FMI Director.

**FMI Director (CEO)** – Oversees global operations, GADs/RCs, and U.S. sending.

**Worker Supervisor (TDC Team)** – Oversees Training, Deployment, and Care of all FMI workers.

**Foursquare Disaster Relief (FDR) Director** – Leads global disaster response.

**Foursquare Missions Press (FMP) Director** – Provides print and digital ministry resources.

**Field Services Director** – Oversees mission finances and donor services.

**Communications Lead** – Leads promotion, marketing, reports, and digital presence.

**District Mission Mobilizers** – Connect local churches to global mission and worker recruitment.

## HOW DO WE FUND GOD'S MISSION?

*FMI operates through four primary revenue streams:*

### Global Mission Fund (GMF)

Funds GADs/RCs, regional initiatives, new nation engagement, global partnership, and the training and care of FMI workers.

### Project Fundraising

GADs and RCs raise additional funds for strategic regional and global projects beyond GMF budgets.

### 10% Missional Support Fee

Applied to FMI giving to offset financial administration and worker care costs.

### Annual Contribution from the U.S. Foursquare Church.

Determined each fiscal year by the Foursquare Board to support operations.

### How Other Parts of Global Mission Are Funded

**FMI Workers** (except GADs) raise their own personal support.

**Foursquare Disaster Relief** raises its own funding.

**Foursquare Missions Press** raises support through donors and partnerships.

Foursquare denominational financial departments provide stewardship and administrative support across all areas.

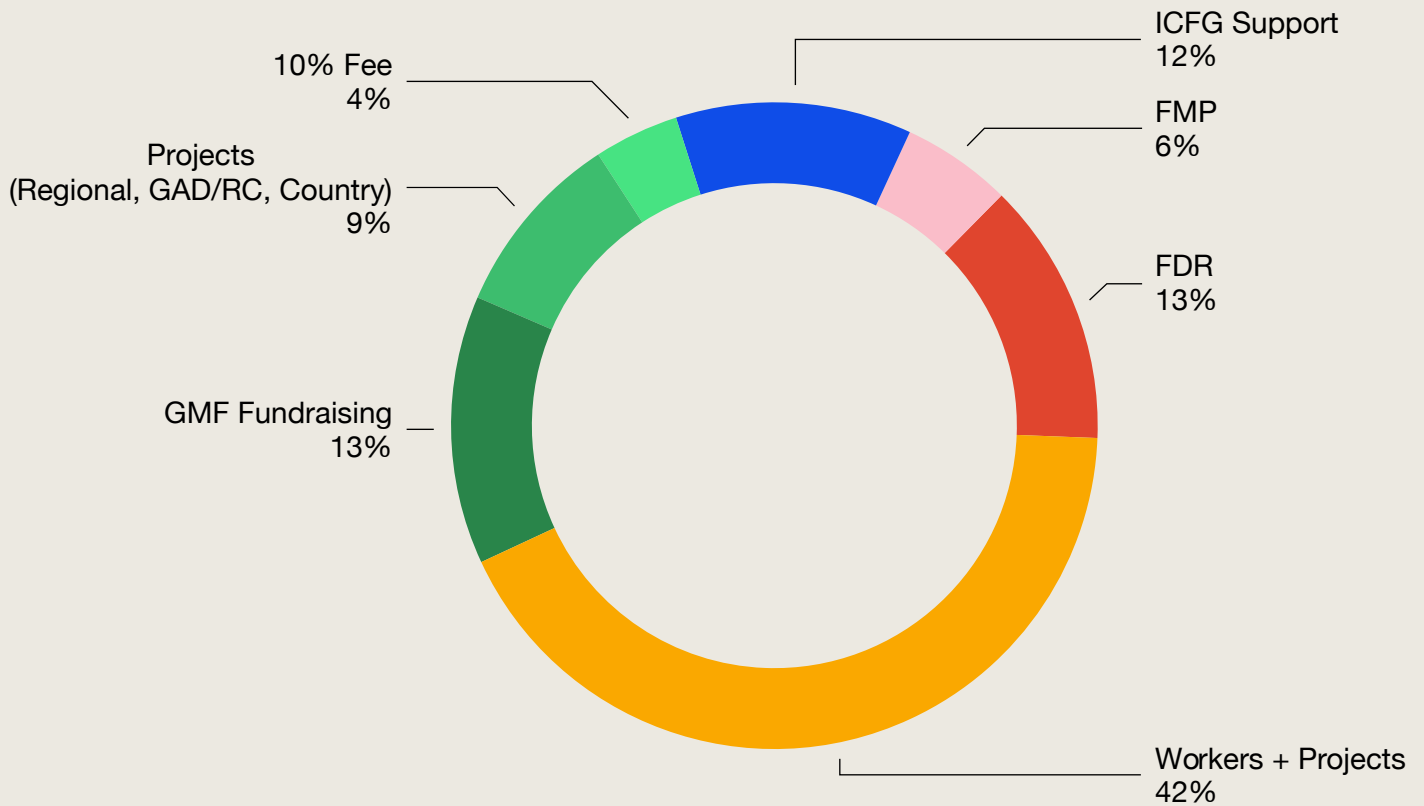

# AMERICAS

## From Reopening to Reaching Forward.

God opened new doors across the Americas as momentum grew in both new fields and longstanding national works. In 2025, Trinidad launched as a new nation with a missionary couple arriving and establishing a worshipping community. At the same time, Saint Lucia reopened as a retired worker responded to a fresh call to return. Across the region, leaders strengthened structures, NextGen gatherings drew hundreds, and national churches gained renewed stability and alignment.



## Discipleship + Leadership Training

**Regional DLTs expanded leadership formation:** Medellín (70+), Dominican Republic (60), and Rosarito (50) equipped leaders around the Identity module.

**Central America leadership maturity increased:** Panama's national leader helped organize training for boards and pastors, showing growing ownership and unity.

**Regional collaboration deepened:** Partnerships and cross-border relationships strengthened the pace and health of disciple-making leadership.

## NextGen Momentum

hundred young people gathered for worship and mission inspiration, with many reporting Holy Spirit ministry.

**Mexico leaders under 40 were equipped:** "Me40" gathered 60 emerging leaders to focus on finishing well and long-term leadership health.

**Latin America youth workers were strengthened:** "Equipados" trained 175 children's and youth leaders to disciple and mobilize the next generation.



## Regional Highlights

### Trinidad

A Brazilian missionary couple launched a new worshipping community by securing a facility and beginning evangelism.

### Saint Lucia

Jacqueline Antoine returned from retirement to reopen ministry presence and re-engage mission work.

### Argentina

The national church reached financial stability for the first time in 25 years and advanced government legal compliance.

### Venezuela

The national church reconnected with Foursquare International and renewed vision for a church planting movement.

### Colombia

A regional young adult gathering mobilized 500 young people for worship, calling, and mission.

### Latin America

"Equipados" trained 175 children's and youth leaders to disciple and reach the next generation.

### Mexico + Northwest District

A district partnership committed significant church planting support toward Mexico.

### Caribbean

Matt and Anna Bryan coordinated response and support during hurricanes and strengthened partnership with local churches.

# CENTRAL AMERICA

Regional Coordinator: Jared Mueller



## Strengthening Leaders Across Central America

Central America strengthened what is already established as leaders invested in healthy churches across all seven nations. In 2025, Honduras continued to stand out for training, mobilization, and church planting through both the national Foursquare church and La Cosecha International Ministry working in parallel. In Panama, strong national church health and missional focus were matched by an intentional push to raise up new pastors for the years ahead. Across the region, DLT training and the second annual Youth Summit in Cali helped deepen shared identity and develop emerging leaders for the future.



## Discipleship + Leadership Training

**Regional DLT strengthened identity:** In March 2025, the region hosted DLT using the "Identity" module to reinforce shared foundations for leaders and churches.

**Next training is already scheduled:** March 16-20, 2026 in Medellín, Colombia, the region plans to train leaders through the "Holy Spirit" module.

**Leadership pipeline remains the priority:** With long-term pastoral transition needs rising, especially in Panama, training focus is increasingly tied to raising and equipping younger pastors and emerging leaders.

## NextGen Momentum

**Youth summit continued building momentum:** The region held its second annual regional Youth Summit in Cali, Colombia (August 2025), gathering young adults from the Caribbean, Central and South America.

**NextGen is being built regionally, not in isolation:** The summit model continues to strengthen shared identity and relationships across borders, helping young leaders see themselves as part of a larger movement.

**Future focus is already on global engagement:** Youth mobilization is being shaped with an eye toward major moments ahead, including the projected 2027 youth summit in the Philippines



## Regional Highlights

### Honduras

Two strong parallel works, the national church and La Cosecha International Ministry, continue fueling training, mobilization, and church planting.

### Nicaragua

While the Foursquare church is not currently under government pressure, other ministries and nonprofits are being shut down with confiscations reported.

### El Salvador

FMI workers Pablo and Michelle Peña deployed to El Salvador to support the leadership development and church multiplication.

### El Salvador

A national state of exception has led to prolonged detentions, including three pastors and their spouses currently incarcerated with no clear timeline for release.

### Panama

A strong national church with missional focus is facing a growing pastoral transition gap, with roughly 30% of churches needing replacement pastors now or within five year

# WEST AFRICA (WAMCO)

## Courage and Care in a Challenging Year.

In West Africa and the Indian Ocean, God opened quiet but meaningful doors. A first-ever visit to Comoros revealed pockets of believers and house churches in an overwhelmingly Muslim context, alongside real resistance in the capital. Across the region, ministry continued amid hardship, with practical care for communities affected by violence and displacement. Meanwhile, Nigeria celebrated a major national milestone that strengthened unity and visibility for the movement.



## Regional Highlights

### Comoros

Underground believers and house churches welcomed initial connection despite resistance.



## NextGen Momentum

**NextGen leaders aligned region-wide:** Leaders gathered in Ghana to plan a regional youth movement for the first time.

**Youth movement structure took shape:** Executive leaders were appointed and an operational document was developed to guide the work.

**Future youth mobilization advanced:** Planning momentum moved toward a first regional youth conference in 2026.

## Discipleship + Leadership Training

**New field engagement in sensitive contexts:** Initial relationship-building in Comoros created a pathway for future ministry presence.

**Regional strengthening through national moments:** Nigeria's 70th celebration reinforced shared identity and momentum.

**Support for churches under pressure:** Practical assistance helped believers recover and rebuild in areas affected by persecution and violence.



### Nigeria

The national church celebrated 70 years, commissioning new projects and hosting President Randy Remington and global delegates.

### Northern Nigeria

Churches and families received recovery support after violence and displacement impacted northern communities.

### Ghana

NextGen leaders gathered for the first time to form a regional youth movement plan and appoint executive leaders.

### Equatorial Guinea / São Tomé + Príncipe

Oversight transitioned to the Central Africa/Francophone region through a July 2025 handover trip.

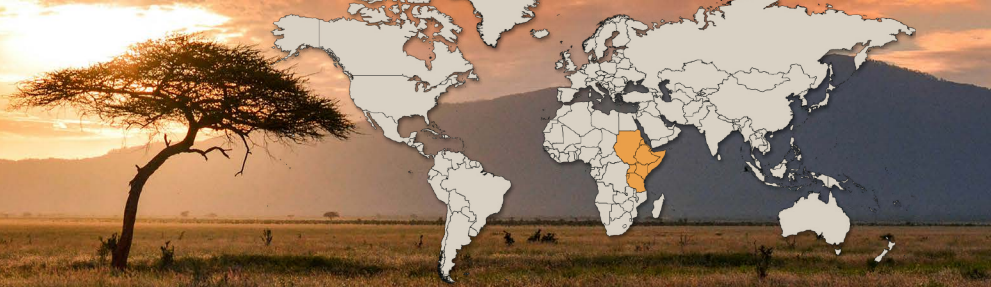

# EAST AFRICA

Regional Coordinators: Mike + Stacy Collins



## Kenya's "home" is rising, and it is restoring hope for the next generation.

Across East Africa, God is strengthening both infrastructure and leadership. In Kenya, the national headquarters project moved from long-held hope to visible progress, helping provide stability and a shared "home" for the movement. A memorable provision of \$80,000 helped launch the effort. By December 2025, all four floors were complete, and the region is believing for roughly \$25,000 to finish and dedicate the building at the Kenya National Convention.



## Discipleship + Leadership Training

**Tanzania marked a first-ever breakthrough:** Leadership ordinations opened the door for 14 ministers to be ordained at the national convention, a historic milestone for the nation.

**Regional DLT strengthened identity and multiplication:** The 2025 East Africa DLT (Identity module) intentionally included young leaders for the first time, fueling replication back in local contexts.

**Children and Teens discipleship training expanded region-wide:** A first-ever East Africa DLT focused on discipling children and teens gathered 72 participants representing all seven nations, and leaders reported deep discipleship impact alongside training.

## NextGen Momentum

**Uganda youth movement grew:** A youth convention gathered 450+ young people with testimonies of Holy Spirit ministry and bold evangelistic witness.

**NextGen leadership development gained traction:** Young leaders (age 25 and under) were intentionally included in regional training, with early signs of immediate replication after returning home.

**Youth-led compassion and witness expanded:** A first-time medical outreach in Uganda served 1,150 patients and reported 170 salvations, while helping develop a young leader as a future regional disaster-response resource.



## Regional Highlights

### Kenya

Bible camps placed 2,000 Swahili Action Bibles into children's hands, with reports of 260 salvations and 254 Holy Spirit baptisms.

### Tanzania

First-ever leadership ordinations unlocked the ordination of 14 ministers at the national convention.

### Uganda

Youth momentum and practical ministry expanded through regional training and a major medical outreach.

### Burundi

Refugee response matured from relief to discipleship communities, churches, a school, and livelihoods.

### Rwanda

Church closures created a challenging reopening path, yet community advocacy helped reopen key congregations and youth leaders are bearing fruit. South Sudan: Leaders replicated children and teens discipleship training locally after receiving regional equipping.

### Ethiopia

Leadership development continues through regional structures, though travel and stability dynamics shape access and pace.

### Sudan, Eritrea, Djibouti, Somalia

Ongoing security risks limit travel and require wisdom, prayer, and long-term strategy for future access.

# FRANCOPHONE WEST + CENTRAL AFRICA

Regional Coordinator: Daouda Traore



## A Movement Multiplying.

Across Francophone West Africa and Central Africa, God is growing a multiplication culture. Nations reported new church plants and expanding disciple-making movements, including breakthrough engagement among least-reached communities. Medical outreach opened doors with compassion, and pioneer villages in Niger began sustained gospel presence through prayer and listening groups. The region's story is one of widening reach and deepening foundations for long-term disciple-making.



## Discipleship + Leadership Training

**Regional training strengthened alignment:** Regional DLT gatherings in Abidjan and Central Africa equipped leaders around cultural challenges and identity formation.

**School of Missions fueled multiplication:** Graduates were mobilized into active church planting, reinforcing a consistent pipeline for pioneer ministry.

**Frontier engagement expanded strategically:** Outreach and medical evangelism opened doors among Muslim and minority ethnic communities across multiple nations.

## NextGen Momentum

**Youth mobilization reached regional scale:** A regional youth conference in Côte d'Ivoire gathered about 1,000 youth from five nations.

**Youth revival strengthened national momentum:** Niger saw growing youth spiritual hunger and leadership emergence.

**Adolescent discipleship movements developed:** Côte d'Ivoire's emerging "Light" movement signaled intentional next-generation formation.



## Regional Highlights

### Côte d'Ivoire

Wade and Bea Preston graduated 40 School of Missions students, many now actively planting churches.

### Gabon (Libreville)

A medical mission served 875 people, with reports of 144 receiving Christ and many healings/deliverance.

### Niger

Leaders initiated new pioneer listening and prayer groups in Tamou and Niakatire as first sustained gospel presence.

### Cameroon

A thriving church among the Baka people strengthened gospel presence deep in forest communities.

### Central African Republic

A new church plant among Pygmy communities marked first sustained presence in that area.

### Togo

A focused outreach among least-reached communities resulted in a new church plant.

### Benin

A church planting movement expanded with new churches among minority ethnic communities.

### DR Congo

Churches reported significant growth with 29 new churches planted and expanded regional alignment.

### Senegal

Medical evangelism outreaches opened doors among unreached communities through compassion witness.

# SOUTHERN AFRICA

## Resilience and Renewal Across Southern Africa.

Southern Africa saw resilience and healthy leadership in a year marked by transition and growth. Malawi navigated a complex season and experienced a notably healthy national leadership change, strengthening trust and stability. Across the region, practical ministry expanded through water wells and Scripture distribution in schools, and women's leadership advanced in Zimbabwe. The year's story highlights steady foundations for long-term disciple-making.



## Discipleship + Leadership Training

**National leadership health improved:** Malawi experienced a notably healthy national leader transition amid complexity and tension.

**Pastoral strengthening continued across nations:** Vision exposure and leadership connection efforts supported pastors and district development.

**School-based Bible engagement expanded influence:** Ongoing government openness sustained large-scale Scripture access in schools.

## NextGen Momentum

**Students were reached through Scripture distribution:** Schools received Bibles at scale, reinforcing discipleship pathways among young people.

**Women leaders advanced in Zimbabwe:** Female pastors were licensed and women now represent 42% of the national board.

**UPG exposure increased through education access:** Malawi reported growing connection with the Yao people group through school engagement.



## Regional Highlights

### Malawi

Pastor Christopher Chilombe was elected national leader in a notably healthy transition, strengthening national unity.

### Malawi

WWFA reported 70 water wells established and 26,000 Bibles distributed in 157 schools reaching 100,000+ students.

### Zimbabwe

Pastor Juliana Muskwe licensed new female pastors and strengthened women's leadership representation on the national board.

### Namibia

Long-term worker Marcia Gilmore was honored for faithful service, with ongoing influence through education impact.

### Angola

National leadership moved closer to securing HQ property, supporting progress toward national registration.

### Mozambique

The national church continues with a broad footprint of approximately 250 churches.

### Zambia

Leaders prepared for a likely national leadership transition as the current national leader seeks succession planning.

# EUROPE

## Quiet Breakthroughs Across a Changing Continent.

Across Europe, the gospel continues taking root through steady discipleship, resilient churches, and emerging national identity. Ukraine pressed on with ministry under ongoing attack, serving communities and planting churches. Romania moved forward in credentialing and early national formation steps. Meanwhile, stories of transformation surfaced in places like Spain and Albania, reminding us that even in secular contexts, Jesus is building His church.



### Discipleship + Leadership Training

**Romania took formation steps forward:** Pastors engaged credentialing processes as early groundwork for a national church.

**Ukraine sustained ministry under pressure:** Churches continued discipleship, community service, and church planting despite ongoing attacks.

**Worker care and oversight increased capacity:** Regional administration roles strengthened support for works and workers across nations.

### NextGen Momentum

**A Europe-wide youth movement continued growing:** Annual gatherings drew 400+ students with ongoing momentum into 2026.

**MK teen discipleship deepened intentionally:** The first MK teen retreat launched in Vienna with continued peer Bible studies.

**Ukraine youth ministry expanded nationally:** Leaders continued developing a nationwide youth movement in challenging conditions.



## Regional Highlights

### Wales

The Richards' work saw church growth with new believers and baptisms during 2025.

### Ukraine

Ministry continued under attack with community service, teen camps, and at least three church plants.

### Romania

Pastors entered a Foursquare credentialing cohort as early steps toward forming a national church.

### Croatia

NextGen growth drove expansion at Mario Ducic's church, including adding a second service and a church plant.

### Italy

Foursquare Italy is more stable and positioned for fruitfulness than at any point in its history.

### Spain

A discipleship community formed among former atheists and spiritual seekers, with baptisms and families engaging church.

### Ireland

The O'Tooles completed counseling degrees and are serving as counselors alongside their ministry.

### Germany

Toby Huyssen became NextGen rep and is developing a retreat and summer camp pathway for teens.

# MENACA (Middle East, North Africa, Central Asia)

## Resilient Witness Across the Unreached.

MENACA saw doors open through relationships, training, and resilient witness in difficult places. Afghan outreach continued through Tajikistan with house churches, Bible studies, and retreats. A new connection formed with leaders from Uzbekistan through regional DLT engagement. DLT also expanded in new languages and settings, strengthening a shared Foursquare identity across Central Asia and the Caucasus while ministry continued under pressure.



## Discipleship + Leadership Training

**DLT expanded into new language access:** DLT was translated and presented in Kazakh for the first time.

**Regional alignment grew through convening:** A Foursquare Connect in Georgia gathered 70 leaders and launched ongoing DLT engagement.

**Local discipleship communities continued forming:** House churches and relational discipleship expanded in places like Tajikistan and Jordan.

## NextGen Momentum

**A new regional youth milestone launched:** The first Central Asian youth conference gathered young people in Kyrgyzstan.

**Cross-region discipleship exposure increased:** MENACA young adults participated in wider youth gatherings and national camps.

**National camps strengthened calling and formation:** Youth camps and retreats continued building resilience and mission vision.



## Regional Highlights

### Tajikistan

Local church growth and Afghan outreach expanded through camps and discipleship.

### Iran

Networks continued expanding amid instability and persecution pressures.

### Kazakhstan

New language access strengthened leadership training and ministry formation.

### Kyrgyzstan

Youth network development accelerated through the first regional youth conference.

### Jordan

A house church formed and discipleship continued through relational community.

### Egypt

Stories of breakthrough and ministry impact in Egypt encouraged the region, with growing focus on expanding long-term fruit there.

### Morocco

A “small, quiet harvest” of local believers continued growing through steady, relational presence.

# NORTH ASIA

## New Churches, New Connections, New Momentum.

North Asia is building unity across languages and nations through the growing Sinophone movement and emerging partnerships. Malaysia celebrated new church plants, Hong Kong strengthened shared formation through DLT use, and Taiwan received renewed encouragement



through unexpected connections. Looking ahead, Mongolia represents a strategic opportunity as diverse groups move toward shared identity and collaboration.



## NextGen Momentum

**Young Adult Camp continued shaping leaders:** Ongoing camps created space for encounter, calling clarity, and mission formation.

**Cross-cultural fellowship increased participation:** Youth and young adults connected across nations through shared gatherings.

**Future mission sending vision strengthened:** Sinophone networks continued developing pathways for global church planting.



## Discipleship + Leadership Training

**Hong Kong unified leadership formation:** The DLT Holy Spirit module trained leaders and became the 2025 convention theme.

**Sinophone leadership pipelines strengthened:** North America launched a Sinophone Ministry School using DLT as core curriculum.

**Mongolia unity strategy advanced:** Plans moved toward a DLT camp to gather leaders from five distinct groups into shared identity.

## Regional Highlights

### Malaysia

The Sinophone movement planted five new churches, strengthening momentum and leadership confidence.

### Hong Kong

The national leader unified teaching by using the DLT Holy Spirit module for leader training and convention focus.

### Taiwan

Two Filipino Foursquare churches were discovered, renewing encouragement and strengthening the Taiwan movement.

### Mongolia

Five distinct Christian groups are moving toward unity through a planned DLT camp for shared formation.

### Japan

Leaders are guiding interested partners toward longer-term mission engagement for sustained ministry impact.

### North America (Sinophone)

A Sinophone Ministry School launched using DLT modules to equip emerging leaders.

### South Korea

Asia Life University hosted international students from multiple nations for leadership equipping and formation.

### Region-wide

Leaders from Hawaii partnered to encourage and strengthen the North Asia Regional Workers' Retreat.

# SOUTH ASIA

## Patient Discipleship, Lasting Fruit.

South Asia continues to move forward through patient, persistent disciple-making among unreached and marginalized communities. In Sri Lanka, a simple approach of feeding children and teaching Scripture opened a new house church among the dhoby community. India strengthened leadership training and reported renewed fruitfulness, while Nepal's churches remain a powerful testimony as believers from many unreached people groups worship together. Pakistan's long-term presence also deepened through established ministry infrastructure.



## Discipleship + Leadership Training

**India leadership development accelerated:** A certified training program graduated its first cohort and expanded with new extension campuses.

**DLT training spread across nations:** Multiple modules were taught in India, Bangladesh, Pakistan, Nepal, and Sri Lanka throughout the year.

**Nepal discipleship reflected UPG diversity:** Leaders reported discipling believers from 25 unreached people groups worshipping together across caste and tribe.

## NextGen Momentum

**Nepal youth formation remained consistent:** Annual programs continued discipling young people and introducing missions pathways.

**Sri Lanka youth movement development progressed:** Regional relationships and youth leadership inputs strengthened local momentum.

**India younger leaders were intentionally raised:** Emerging leaders were disciplined through training systems and national momentum growth.



## Regional Highlights

### Sri Lanka

Three Sunday school teachers opened a new house church among the dhoby community through children-focused feeding and Bible stories.

### India

DLT training covered leadership across four locations, strengthening national equipping and shared formation.

### Nepal

FMI workers continued rescuing, discipling, and educating young people through faithful ministry.

### Pakistan

A long-term ministry base strengthened permanence through a national property serving HQ, Bible college, and local church.

### Bangladesh

Pastor Andy Lovelace taught DLT modules and strengthened national training momentum with 50+ participants.

### North India

Christian Dresbeck built a restaurant platform that employs and disciples disadvantaged young people.

### Northeast India

Long-term outreach produced two new congregations now meeting among targeted unreached groups.

# SOUTHEAST ASIA

## Rising Leaders, Emerging Fields.

Southeast Asia is seeing steady growth through discipleship, training, and creative access. Laos continues developing as an emerging field through three distinct expressions, including ministry among tribal peoples. Myanmar's ministry gained new momentum as relief efforts contributed to new church presence in key areas. Across the region, DLT is strengthening identity and leadership formation, while NextGen gatherings are shaping a rising generation toward holiness and mission.



### Discipleship + Leadership Training

**DLT Identity training expanded across nations:** DLT modules were used widely in Thailand, Vietnam, Myanmar, and Malaysia to strengthen identity and leadership.

**Vietnam and Myanmar increased movement ownership:** Leaders used DLT language to articulate Foursquare identity and deepen training culture.

**Laos ministry continued through diverse expressions:** The emerging field developed through business, education, and tribal discipleship engagement.

### NextGen Momentum

**Beyond Borders deepened spiritual formation:** The fourth gathering marked a shift toward holiness with strong reports of Holy Spirit ministry.

**National youth events sustained momentum:** Vietnam and Thailand held national youth gatherings while children's and youth ministry development continued.

**Regional vision is building toward future mobilization:** Leaders are preparing toward larger youth momentum in Manila 2027.



## Regional Highlights

### Laos

Three ministry expressions advanced the emerging field through business roles, education platforms, and discipleship groups.

### Myanmar

Leaders celebrated new fellowships and first churches in Mandalay following relief momentum and discipleship growth.

### Vietnam

National pastors increased DLT adoption, strengthening identity and leadership ownership in the movement.

### Thailand

Churches expanded identity formation through DLT training and national youth events.

### Philippines

The national church continues active church planting and improved tracking of closures, strengthening long-term health.

### Philippines (Manila)

Chris and Melda Palmer grew in language and leadership and prepared to plant their third church.

### Malaysia

Leaders reported healing testimonies and continued church planting momentum through national ministry.

### Region-wide

Mark and Debbie Ayres transitioned to emissary roles while continuing curriculum and translation support.

## A Wave of Growth Across the Islands.

Across the South Pacific, the movement continued expanding through church planting, leadership training, and renewed spiritual momentum. Palau became a hub for outreach, training, and sending, including strengthened steps toward opening Yap. New Caledonia experienced renewal and emerging leaders, and Micronesia continued developing new ministries that meet both spiritual and community needs. The year reflects breadth, energy, and a growing foundation for future national leadership.



## Discipleship + Leadership Training

**DLT remained the core training framework:** Leaders were equipped using DLT materials across multiple island nations, including children's ministry leadership.

**Regional leadership capacity expanded through training:** Pastors and leaders gathered across locations to strengthen biblical foundations and ministry skill.

**Bible school development progressed across nations:** Training and resourcing continued strengthening long-term leadership pipelines.

## NextGen Momentum

**Youth outreach addressed urgent needs:** Micronesia initiatives responded to rising youth hopelessness and spiritual hunger.

**Children's ministry development expanded region-wide:** Children's ministry leaders are being developed across the South Pacific, strengthening disciple-making among kids and families through intentional equipping.

**Palau outreach rhythm sustained evangelism:** Monthly open-air outreaches continued across all eight districts, creating consistent opportunities for young people and families to hear the gospel and receive ministry.



## Regional Highlights

### Palau

Pastor William Yakumbu led training and outreach momentum while developing mission candidates for new fields.

### Yap

Initial cell groups and leader appointments moved the field toward a new nation opportunity.

### New Caledonia

Renewal, new members, and emerging young leaders encouraged the church.

### Micronesia

Leaders reported growth and new calls to serve as ministry development continued across island communities.

### Chuuk

House fellowships formed in new areas while outreach expanded through schools, hospitals, and prisons.

### Solomon Islands

Church planting began on Russell Island while a new Bible college building developed in Honiara.

### Samoa

Bam + Helen Lauvao advanced youth outreach and discipleship among young people.

### Region-wide

Shanon Hladek strengthened children's ministries across multiple nations through leader development.

### Region-wide

Brandy + Tevita Fifita ignited youth movements and evangelism efforts across Micronesia and beyond.
