





Deck Thyself, My Soul, with Gladness

The anthem was composed for the 1923 Annual Festival of the Rochester Diocesan Church Choirs Association and is still a universal favorite. Martin Shaw was an English composer of over 300 published works.

Few Welsh hymns are as well known or loved as the 18th-century Hymn 281. The text did not gain its popular tune until the early 20th century. In both its original text and in the English translation, it is a stirring hymn of pilgrimage filled with vivid imagery from Hebrew Scripture.

The Nicene Creed was the first official doctrinal statement of the whole Christian church. It developed from the work of the first two ecumenical councils, Nicaea in 325 and Constantinople in 381. It is the only creed accepted and used by all three major branches of Christendom: Eastern Orthodox, Roman Catholic, and Protestant.

This ecumenical version of the Lord's Prayer is a modern translation of Matthew 6:9-13 plus the traditional concluding words of doxology ("For thine is the kingdom....").
