### Song of Gathering

Hymn 220, Stanza 1

**All people that on earth do dwell,  
sing to the Lord with cheerful voice;

The author of the Song of Gathering, having been exiled from Scotland during a religious persecution, was influenced by psalm paraphrases sung in Geneva. He had in mind the famous "doxology" tune. The text is the oldest English metrical psalm in use today.

### Call to Worship

Then God said, "Let there be light"; and there was light,  
and God saw that the light was good.

To illustrate the text, “And on his head were many crowns” (Revelation 19:12), two different authors wrote different texts, each with six stanzas. Most hymnals make a selection from both texts. The tune name suggests “diadems” or “crowns.”

Worshippers may greet each other by saying, “The peace of Christ be with you,” and responding, “And also with you.”
