Hymn 420, used at the opening of Riverside Church in New York in 1930, was penned by its widely-known and influential pastor, Harry Emerson Fosdick. It has gained a firm place in English-language hymnals around the world. The Welsh tune name honors the Riondda Valley in Glamorganshire.

Worshippers may greet each other by saying, "The peace of Christ be with you," and responding, "And also with you."

The Prayer for Illumination is a reminder that the reason to gather for worship is to hear the Word of God. This text was designed to be sung before the sermon. Originally there were seven stanzas, but usually only three are sung, and sometimes only one.

The Spirit enables people to become believers. The Spirit enabled people of all races, classes, and nations to accept the good news of what God had done in Christ, repent of their sins, and enter the community of faith.

Hymn 421 is a challenging text by a British Methodist minister. The odd-numbered stanzas develop the image of “the servant church,” while the second surveys the many needs and the fourth describes the true source of strength for the task.

The Affirmation of Faith is an excerpt from a contemporary statement of faith which the church adopted as “a reliable aid for Christian study, liturgy, and inspiration.”

But after we have trusted and repented we recognize that the Spirit enables us to hear and act. It is not our faith but God's grace in Jesus Christ that justifies us and reconciles us to God. Yet it is only by faith that we accept God's grace and live by it.
