**WORSHIP**

EVERY SUNDAY @ 10:00 AM

I used to have a little notecard in my house that said, “Don’t drive through life like a Jehu.” Jehu is a guy from 2 Kings. The prophet Elisha anointed him king of Israel during a complex, violent time in Israel’s history. In 2 Kings 9:20, we learn that people knew Jehu by his driving. He’s on his way to another king named Joram. Joram sent his messenger to greet whoever was coming up the road. Joram’s lookout sees Jehu coming.

“Well?” the king asks. “Who’s coming? Did my messenger reach him?”

“He reached him, but he isn’t coming back this way,” answered the messenger. He can’t see the driver’s face, but he can see the driving. He continued, “The driving is like that of Jehu son of Nimshi — he drives like a maniac.”

The little card in my house wasn’t to remind me to avoid road rage just on the road: it’s to avoid road rage through most of life. And it’s not just about rushing, though it’s so tempting to rush through things. I grew up a rusher. I would get in trouble as a kid because I would rush to be the first one done a project in school, but I rushed so it wasn’t my best work. The story of Jehu doesn’t just remind me to slow down, though, no matter how often I might need that reminder (especially as a Jersey girl where red means stop, green means go, and yellow means challenge accepted). In the Bible, Jehu is recognizable by his maniacal driving. Jehu’s story reminds me that maniacal driving isn’t how I want to be recognized.

It reminds me of something my aunt said to me once when I was a kid, experimenting with perfume for the first time. She told me that people should know where I’ve been; they shouldn’t smell me coming. This is how we ought to choose to live our lives as God’s children. People should see evidence of God’s love and compassion where we’ve been. They shouldn’t smell us coming.

People can smell us coming if we are rude and overbearing with our faith. They can smell us coming if we preach one thing but practice another. They can smell us coming if we say we are Christian but do not guard one another’s dignity, work alongside each other, or treat others the way Christ calls us to treat our brothers and sisters. When we use the Bible as a weapon to push our own agenda, when we let politics (church and civic) get in the way of being able to do God’s work in our church, and when we talk about our faith like it’s a chore instead of a joy, people can smell us coming.

On the other hand, when we are slow to anger and quick to forgive, when we celebrate our faith, when we pray with one another, and when we do all we can to light our world, people will be able to sense the love and compassion of God in our wakes. Sometimes you'll hear me use this blessing in worship: "May the light of Christ go with you in all you say and in all you do. May you see that light in others and may others see that light in you. Go light your world." It's a reminder to do what we can to light our world. Jesus tells us in Matthew 5 that we are the light of the world. It's not our light that we shine: it's *Christ's* light. We are the light bearers, doing our best to follow Jesus' commands to love God and love our neighbors as we love ourselves.

There will always be times where we struggle with this. We will be tempted to rush. We will be tempted to get angry. We will be tempted to wear blinders to

everything else in the world while we face our own pain and struggles. Sometimes, people will smell you coming. In those moments, we especially need to remember the joy of Easter that we celebrate this time of year. Remember the joy of Easter: that God's love is so much bigger than our struggles. God's capacity to forgive is so much bigger than our mistakes. When you are tempted to drive through life like a Jehu, remember that we want people to know we are Christians by our love (as the song goes). We want people to know the story of Christ not just in our words, but in our actions. We want to do all we can to leave this world a better place. How will you light this world knowing that the light of Christ shines in and through you? How will you bring God's love to people in ways that they know where God is and has been and don't just smell you coming? May God bless you in your choice to bear His light in world that God loved so much, He gave His only Son.

#### *Current Events Through the Eyes of Faith*

Using "The Wired Word" curriculum, we will have a brief synopsis of a news story, followed by probing questions and a time for confronting the issue with scriptures and hope. We gather in room #7 (Brick Classroom) at 11:20 sharp.

**Mar. 11** – *(Daylight Savings Time Begins)* A church pastor tells of a week he spent on a retreat with the youth from his congregation. He offers what he describes as "a completely unscientific set of impressions about characteristics of today's teenagers." There is useful learning in his observations, and today we will use these as a place to start talking about how to instill the Christian faith in young people.

**Mar. 18** – Pope Francis said in a homily that Christians should resist the devil and flee temptation. Regardless of which Christian denomination we belong to, we likely realize the need to beware of temptation, whether we understand it as a tool of a devil outside of ourselves or as an inclination from somewhere within us. In either case, surrendering to temptation can be destructive to our spiritual well-being. Today we look at some of what the Bible says about temptation.

**Mar. 25** – Last spring, U.S. Attorney General Jeff Sessions sent a memo to all federal prosecutors instructing them to pursue the "most serious, readily provable offense" for their cases. The move is a reversal of the criminal-charging policy directive of former Attorney General Eric H. Holder Jr., and, in the view of many, a return to failed practices of the war on drugs, which gives long sentences to nonviolent offenders and disproportionately affects minorities. Today we will look at matters of justice, mercy and effectiveness.



This food helps to assist GROCERIES PLUS (held at Bethel Bible Fellowship Church, Emmaus) by providing fresh food for needy families in the Emmaus area.

This program includes four distribution days each month. These times are every 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Tuesday of each month from 10:00 AM - 12:00 noon, and every 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Wednesday of each month from 12:00 noon - 2:00 PM. There are up to 30 plus different families pick up food during each time!

The Mission Committee communicates with this vital program more intentionally each year. We at Faith, continue to seek ways to support needy families in the surrounding Emmaus community. **The Mission Committee would like to continue to collect Hygiene products for GROCERIES PLUS throughout the year.** As many of you know, hygiene and cleaning products are expensive and are not provided on a regular basis at the food bank.






### *Mark Your Calendars*


## *Did You Know?*
