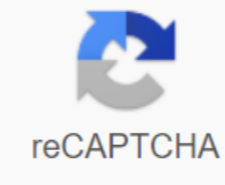

It is the only high school in the Fremont City School District, and one of the two high schools in Fremont, the other is Saint Joseph Central Catholic High School. The school enrolls 1,096 students in October 2017. Fremont Ross is named W. W. Ross (1834-1906), who served as the first superintendent of Fremont City Schools from 1864 to 1906 at the age of 71. The boys' sports teams are called the Little Giants, and the girls' teams are lady giants. The colors of the school are purple and white. The football team has a rivalry with Sandusky High School, which dates back to 1895, making it the biggest competition in Northwest Ohio. Since the 2011-2012 school year, the school has been a member of the Three Rivers Athletic Conference. Daniel Carson | Fremont News Messenger FREMONT - A fight involving Fremont Ross High School students forced a short level one lockdown in the school building Friday morning. Inspector Jon Detwiler said some students got into a fight at the front of the building. Detwiler said he did not know how many students were present, or there were injuries. Police responded to the high school about 11 a.m., according to a police scanner for traffic. The supervisor said the lockdown ended at noon. Fremont City Schools sent a warning to parents who reported the situation. Unfortunately, we had an altercation at Ross High School, which leads to the police called and the building went to level one lock down. We got all the clear and classes again as usual, the message read. Fremont Police Chief Dean Bliss said many students will be charged with disorderly conduct. He said he didn't know Friday afternoon how many students would be charged. I know we're going to continue to look with the school video, Bliss said. The Fremont Police Department and the Sandusky County Sheriff's Office responded the fight, Bliss said.dacarson@gannett.com419-334-1046Twitter: @DanielCarson7 Daniel Carson | Fremont News-Messenger FREMONT - Fremont Ross High School will hold a graduation ceremony as planned on May 31, but the beginning of this year will have a more parade feel than in previous years. In addition to discounting social distances amid coronavirus concerns, Fremont City Schools have devised a plan that will make 2020 Ross alumni and their families parade route through the city before they celebrate their graduation at Grace Community Church in an afternoon ceremony. We tried hard to create a scenario where kids can be in one place together, said Jon Detwiler, fremont city schools superintendent. Ross 2020 alumni will arrive in the high school student parking lot with their family in the vehicle and depart the parade route around 2 p.m. Alumni are asked to be in the front seat and wear a cap and dress. Detwiler said there is a limit of one graduate per car. There will be no oversized, recreational or commercial vehicles allowed. From ross parking lot, the vehicle will turn right onto Fangboner Road and then right on north street before they reach Dickinson Street.After turning left Dickinson, to State Street, where they will be left and go over the State Street Bridge on the city's east side. Then the vehicle will turn straight from State Street to Smith Road and move to Grace Community Church.Detwiler said the church was gracious in allowing the school to set up a graduation ceremony where Grace usually has an outdoor church service, with a giant LED display in the church parking lot to broadcast the event. There, Detwiler and Fremont Ross principal Brian Zeller will address graduation class. Part of the ceremony will be pre-established and part will take place in real time. Detwiler said the alumni have been going to Ross for the past three days to videotape portions of the ceremony. He said the ceremony will be broadcast live on several platforms so that people at home who are unable to attend will be able to watch the start of the internet. There are 265 Ross alumni in the 2020 class, Detwiler said. The school district encourages residents to gather on State Street, with appropriate social distanceing, and show support for this year's graduates. I think the community is really coming out of these students, Detwiler said. Detwiler said the school district was working with the church, the city and the Sandusky County Department of Health to put together the case. Bethany Brown, The Sandusky County Health Commissioner, issued a statement Friday that said she has worked with local supervisors over the past few weeks to figure out how to celebrate graduation, in line with these new guidelines. Even though it's at the end of the school year we were expecting, I think our young people are resilient and will grow up doing a lot of things regardless, and, in some cases, because of this experience, Brown said.
