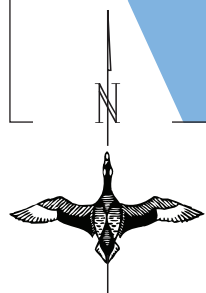

PROVINCIAL WILDLIFE PARK SHUBENACADIE, NOVA SCOTIA, CANADA

The captive animals at our Park are most active and best viewed in the morning and late afternoon when temperatures are lower and public attendance drops. This is a reflection of their natural behaviour as most animals rest during the mid-day period. Binoculars are highly recommended as the larger enclosures provide more opportunity for the animals to hide from public view. Most animals in the Park are captive raised or born and are at ease around humans but remain dangerous. Some animals, although rehabilitated, have permanent injuries or have become too imprinted on humans and can therefore not be released back into the wild. We ask you not to tease any of the animals as this causes undue stress and to accept direction from Park staff and follow instructions on signs to ensure all visitors can enjoy their visit to the fullest potential.

PLEASE NOTE THE FOLLOWING:

The feeding of bread, chips, popcorn, or any other food items and excessive quantities of fruits or vegetables to the mammals and birds reduces their intake of essential proteins, minerals and fats and is therefore not allowed. If you do wish to feed some of our animals, please use the feed dispensers installed through out the Park which contain the proper diet supplement and quantities. ***Please use this feed for deer and waterfowl only as indicated on the dispensers.***

WE DO NOT PERMIT THE FEEDING OF ANY FEED OTHER THEN THAT PROVIDED IN THE DISPENSERS AND ONLY TO DEER AND WATERFOWL.

DO NOT FEED ANY OTHER ANIMALS.

Please discard all garbage and recyclable items in the appropriate containers found throughout the Park.

NOTE:

You may have observed that some of the deer no longer have fawns with them in their enclosures. We have eliminated reproduction of some species as we could no longer ensure the quality of life for these fawns after leaving the Park. Although this may be disappointing for some of our valued visitors, we felt that the well-being of animals leaving our facility is of top priority and we hope you understand and accept our position.

You are encouraged to note any comments that you may have on the Park/animals/operation/staff in our "comment" binder at the Park's exit and which will be reviewed by management on a regular basis.
