Satan has Jesus and the disciples together in a single boat on the lake. It is his opportunity to wipe out the ministry in a single stroke. It has all the hallmarks of a demonic attack."






And they feared exceedingly, and said one to another, What manner of man is this, that even the wind and the sea obey him?



Mark 4:41 they were filled with great fear. This was not fear of being harmed by the storm, but a reverence for the supernatural power Jesus had just displayed. The only thing more terrifying than having a storm outside the boat was having God in the boat!

A Great calm – comes about as Jesus exercises his authority over the wind and sea!

A Great fear – filling the souls of the disciples as they realize they are in the very presence of God!

"How often in the trials of life we are prone to imitate the faithless disciples and cry out, "Lord, don't You care?" Of course, He cares! He arose and rebuked the storm, and immediately there was a great calm. But Jesus did not stop with the calming of the elements, for the greatest danger was not the wind or the waves: it was the unbelief in the hearts of the disciples."

"Our greatest problems are within us, not around us. This explains why Jesus gently rebuked them and called them "men of little faith." They had heard Him teach the Word and had even seen Him perform miracles, and yet they still had no faith. It was their unbelief that caused their fear, and their fear made them question whether Jesus really cared. We must beware of 'an evil heart of unbelief' (Hebrews 3:12)."
