Conference Workshops

Session I-Thursday, Sept. 24 9:15 a.m. -10:45 a.m.

SI-A) Building Communities of Choice Through Business Partnerships

Learn how neighborhoods and businesses can work together to create communities of choice through their partnerships, how these partnerships work and how to maintain them.

SI-B) Re-Charging Your Leadership Batteries

SIV-A) Broad Creek-15 years of Successful Neighborhood Revitalization (requires walking)
