- * Maintaining Healthy Relationships in Your Community - focusing on how to maintain safe and healthy relationships with family, friends, and others
- * Get Smart About Credit-Avoid Pitfalls and Traps learning about responsible use of credit and how this can lead to a healthy financial future
- * Project Safe Neighborhoods an initiative created by the Attorney General to reduce the gang and gun violence in the City of Norfolk among the young population.

Conference Workshop Sessions

Session I Town Hall - Friday, Sept. 22 9:45 a.m.-11:15 a.m.

Understanding Asset Based Community Development

Asset Based Community Development (ABCD) builds on the assets that are already found in your community and mobilizes individuals, associations, and institutions to come together to build on their assets-- not concentrate on their needs. Participants will learn about ABCD and how doing so can benefit your community.

Session II - Friday, Sept. 22 11:30 a.m.-1:00 p.m.

SII-A) Five Stages of Community Life: Developing Strategies for Your Neighborhood at Any Stage

Every neighborhood is in a stage of progress: The Waiting Place, Impasse, Catalytic, Growth, and Sustain/Renew. Do you know which stage of community life your neighborhood is in? Don't stay in a rut! Find out which of these stages your neighborhood is in and how to develop strategies that lead to progress, growth, and neighborhood success!

SII-B) "Making Your Neighborhood Millennial Friendly"

The Millennial generation is generally defined as those born between about 1980 and 2000, and it is beginning to make its mark on the national economy and culture. The priorities and preferences of the Millennials tend to differ from those of preceding generations, including in the realm of housing and neighborhoods. Learn what these differences are, what could they mean for your neighborhood, and how can you keep it vibrant by attracting members of this generation.

SII-C) How to Plan an Exciting, Civic Educational Event on a Shoe String Budget of \$100.00

Participants will collectively create the agenda for a training event to increase civic education using a hypothetical \$100 budget. Participants will leave this session with a rough draft of a training event they can modify and implement themselves while learning successful group facilitation techniques.

SII-D) A TEAM UNITED

Participants will learn best practices on how to include everyone's opinion through effective communication regardless of race or culture with an emphasis on being united in your community to address and accomplish set goals while understanding we are all important pieces to a much bigger puzzle that form the communities where we live.

Session III - Friday, Sept. 30 2:45 p.m.-4:30 p.m.

SIII-A) Ex-Offenders, Neighborhoods, and You

Participants will explore the impact offenders and ex-offenders may have on our neighborhoods and discuss ways to promote their successful transition back into our communities.

SIII-B) "Do-It-Yourself" Community Partnerships

What do you get when housing organizations, local government, businesses, nonprofits, faith groups, college students, and local military groups ALL partner together? Better housing, better lives, and better neighborhoods. Learn how you can build strong partnerships between these various community organizations to achieve common goals.

SIII-C) Applying Community and Media Engagement Strategies to Build Healthier African American and Latino Communities

Participants will learn about successful health communications campaigns that were adopted by grassroots leaders to improve healthy behaviors through strategic community and media engagement strategies.

SIII-D) Building Healthy Communities through Collaboration, 50+ Southside Splash

Building Healthy Communities through Collaboration" will focus on the process by which the 50 and Older (50+) Southside Splash was created. The 50+ Southside Splash was created out of community health concerns on the Southside of Norfolk, Virginia. Several members of the program have been able to decrease medications, lose weight, decrease cholesterol numbers, and decrease the use of adaptive devices such as wheel chairs and walkers.

SIV-A) Why Equity Matters

This workshop will introduce participants to the concept of an equity lens. Participants will learn how equity is different from equality, diversity and inclusion. In addition, participants will learn how the use of an equity lens advances racial and social equity. Facilitators will provide examples of how they use the equity lens in their community engagement efforts in Fairfax County. This session will include group exercises/activities, videos and networking.

SIV-B) Building a Successful Community Program Using Asset Based Community Development Concepts and Model Following upon the Town Hall held on Friday, participants will learn about a successful Community Leadership program called "In Unity There is Strength," where partnerships and assets of minds, hands and hearts helped create a program that benefited neighbors, friends and family with the knowledge and motivation to start their own businesses, find new jobs, volunteer, go back to school & become community leaders.

SIV-C) Inclusion, Control, Openness: Improving Group Maturity

At the last meeting you attended, did you feel welcome, significant, and productive? Explore the three stages of group maturity that allows groups to be high performing teams. Begun to understand the behaviors, fears, and feelings that group members are experiencing every time they gather. Learn some ways to effectively lead a group through those stages by recognizing cues and adjusting your leadership style to meet the group's needs

SIV-D) Building Coalitions With Our Youth (Note: This workshop concludes at 12:15p)

Participants will learn from a panel of experts on what has worked in other cities to engage, encourage, and empower our youth to become involved in their community.
