South Carolina made its return to the NCAA Championship during the 2018-19 season, fueled by a strong spring that featured three wins. The Gamecocks took down Colorado State in a five-man playoff for the final spot out of the NCAA Pullman Regional. Carolina missed the 15-team cut at NAAs after 54-holes by just two shots and finished the campaign ranked No. 17 in the final Golfstat Team Rankings. Overall, Carolina had nine top-five finishes in 13 stroke play events - T-2nd most for a single season in program history. The team's 285.33 scoring average was the second lowest all-time. The Gamecocks won the Palmetto Intercollegiate, Hootie at Bulls Bay Intercollegiate and the Southern Intercollegiate. At Palmetto Golf Club, Carolina won by 35-shots while setting the school record for lowest 54-hole score at 813 (268-269-276). Carolina also made it to match play at the SEC Championship for the second time in three seasons under the new format. All-American Scott Stevens led the team with three top-five finishes, while logging the second lowest scoring average in program history (70.59). He was named First Team All-SEC and PING All-Southeast Region. Stevens did not miss a tournament in four seasons and finished his illustrious career with the lowest scoring average all-time at Carolina (71.57 in 148 rounds played). He matched a career-best performance at the NCAA Pullman Regional, shooting 198 (-12) with a final round 65 (-5). All-American Will Miles won twice in the spring at the Palmetto Intercollegiate and the Southern Intercollegiate. At Palmetto Golf Club, Miles shot 197 (64-65-68) en route to a nine-shot win, T-2nd lowest 54-hole total ever by a Gamecock. Miles tallied a 70.97 scoring average, the fifth-best mark all-time for a single season. His career scoring average of 72.40 was the sixth-best all-time. Miles earned Second Team All-SEC honors and was named PING All-Southeast Region. Freshman Ryan Hall logged the lowest scoring average by a freshman in program history at 71.00 en route to earning PING All-Southeast Region honors.

ROCKY FACE, Ga. -- South Carolina tallied a 3-under 285 in the final round of the 2018 Carpet Capital Collegiate on Sunday. Freshman Ryan Hall paced the Gamecocks with a 3-under 69, the low round of the tournament for the Gamecocks.

"We played really well today, but it's disappointing to lose a few shots on the inward nine," said head coach Bill McDonald. "Our freshmen had solid debuts this week, and I thought it was a good start to the season overall. We're going to make a couple of adjustments to our lineup and get ready for another great event in Chicago next week at Olympia Fields."

Hall had five birdies today, tying with senior Will Miles for a team-high in the third round. It marks the first career round of par or better for the Knoxville, Tenn., native. His 69 also marks the first round in the 60s for a Carolina player in the 2018-19 season. He shot 34 (-2) on the front nine and 35 (-1) on the back. Hall climbed up the leaderboard to finish T-27th (+3) in his first collegiate tournament. He finished second on the team with 12 birdies this weekend.

Miles carded a 71 (-1), his third consecutive round of par or better, to lead the team with a T-11th (-2) finish. He had 11 birdies at The Farm en route to his 11th career top-20 finish. The Hilton Head Island, S.C., native was bogey free on the front Sunday, making the turn at 3-under. Today's under par round marks the 30th career round of par or better for Miles.

Senior Scott Stevens continued his steady play with an even par 72 in round three to finish T-16th (E). The Chattanooga, Tenn., native had three birdies on the front nine and made the turn at 1-under (35). He was 1-over down the stretch with pars on eight of his final nine holes. It marks the 22nd career top-20 for Stevens in his 38 starts at Carolina. He now has 60 career rounds of par or better as well.

Junior Caleb Proveaux (T-46th, +6) was the final counting score in the lineup with a 1-over 73. The Lexington, S.C., native made the turn at 1-over and shot even par down the stretch with two birdies and an eagle. Freshman Harry Corbin entered the day even for the tournament, and he stayed that way through nine holes. He made two double bogeys on the back nine and carded a final round 77 (+5). Corbin led the Gamecocks with 14 red numbers in his 54 holes at The Farm.

He T-41st at 5-over alongside fellow freshman Teddy Tetak, who was playing as an individual for the Gamecocks this weekend. The Limbach, Slovakia, native had a great final round Sunday carding a 1-under 71. He shot a bogey free 3-under 33 on his first nine holes.

OLYMPIA FIELDS, Ill. -- South Carolina men's golf shot 297 (+17) in the final round of the OFCC/Fighting Illini Invitational to finish ninth in the team's second event of the 2018-19 season. Senior Scott Stevens finished T-10th to lead the Gamecocks at Olympia Fields Country Club.

"We really struggled today, but a lot of teams did as well," said head coach Bill McDonald. "The golf course just plain whipped our tails, and hopefully our guys can learn from their experience this week. Scott (Stevens) and Ryan played well and both had really solid finishes against a tough field. We're looking forward to a couple weeks off to do some qualifying and work on our games before we head to Muirfield."

Stevens shot even par (70) for the second consecutive day to finish the tournament at 1-over. The Chattanooga, Tenn., native had a bogey free 2-under round going through 15 holes. He bogeyed two of his final three holes to shoot 70. Stevens, who tallied his third-straight top-20 finish dating back to the 2018 NCAA Bryan Regional, now has 16 career top-10s. That's T-6th all-time in program history with All-Americans Keenan Huskey, Will Starke and Eric Ecker. He finished T-4th in the field in par-4 scoring average this weekend (E, 4.00).

Freshman Ryan Hall tallied his first career top-20 showing with a T-16th finish (+4). The Knoxville, Tenn., native shot 73 (+3) on Sunday. He bounced back from a 3-over (38) front nine and shot even par (35) coming in with a pair of birdies. Hall was one of just 11 players in the 75-mand field to post a scoring average below par on the par-3s (-1, 2.92).

Senior Will Miles (T-31st, +9) and freshman Teddy Teak (T-49th, +14) each shot 77 (+7). Junior Jamie Wilson (T-66th, +20) shot 79 (+9).

No. 1 Oklahoma State went wire-to-wire for the win, shooting under par as a team every round. The Cowboys set a new 54-hole team score tournament record by eight shots, finishing at 11-under (829). Oklahoma State's Matthew Wolf (204, -6) shot 70 (E) on Sunday to win the individual title by a shot over Cal's Collin Morikawa (205, -5). Ten of the 14 teams in the field this weekend in Chicago are ranked in the Preseason Bushnell Golfweek Coaches Poll.

DUBLIN, Ohio -- No. 22 South Carolina fell, 4-2, to No. 4 Georgia Tech in the semifinals of the inaugural Jack Nicklaus Invitational on Tuesday morning at Muirfield Village Golf Club. The Gamecocks finished T-3rd with No. 10 Georgia, as the place matches were cancelled due to previous travel arrangements made by competing schools.

"Tech played really well and deserved the win today," said head coach Bill McDonald. "I'm really proud of how hard our guys fought in both matches this week, and I think this experience will really pay off down the road. Muirfield Village Golf Club and Ohio State were great hosts and the opportunity to compete in match play was a unique experience for our program."

Semifinal matches resumed this morning at 9 a.m. ET after play was suspended at 6:45 p.m. ET on Monday evening.

Carolina was led by senior Ryan Stachler in the semis, as he defeated the Yellow Jackets' Connor Howe 4&2, to cap a perfect 2-0 week. The Alpharetta, Ga., native led the match the final 11 holes. Stachler is 3-0 all-time in match play dating back to the 2017 SEC Championship.

Senior Scott Stevens and freshman Harry Corbin each halved their matches against Tech. Stevens trailed the first 10 holes in his bout with Luke Schniederjans but battled back to square things at hole 11. From there, they went back-and-forth the rest of the way. Stevens is now 3-0-1 in four career matches at Carolina dating back to the 2016 NCAA Championship. Corbin had a 1-up lead heading into the 18th hole, but the Yellow Jackets' Andy Ogletree won the final hole to earn a half point.

Senior Will Miles and sophomore Andrew Spiegler each fell 2&1. Freshman Ryan Hall lost 5&3. Miles finished the week 1-0-1 to move his all-time match play record for the Gamecocks to 1-1-1 dating back to the 2017 SEC Championship.

WINDERMERE, Fla. -- No. 24 South Carolina had a solid finish at the 2018 Tavistock Collegiate Invitational on Tuesday, shooting a final round 286 (-2). The Gamecocks finished 12th with a final score of 879 (+15). Senior Scott Stevens, senior Ryan Stachler and freshman Ryan Hall all posted red numbers in round three today.

"We had some great play this week from Scott (Stevens) and Ryan Hall," said head coach Bill McDonald. "Overall, it was a better effort today by the team and nice to have three guys shoot under par. It's been frustrating at this event and Olympia this fall to not have everyone contributing. We need to definitely figure that out before we head to Hawaii next week."

Stevens finished just outside the top-10 in 13th place at 3-under for the tournament. The Chattanooga, Tenn., native had five birdies on his way to a 2-under 70 in the third round. He led the team with 11 birdies at Isleworth this week. He's finished in the top-20 in all three stroke play events so far in the 2018-19 season for the Gamecocks. Stevens, who has started every tournament the past four seasons for Carolina, has 24 top-20s in his career now in 40 career starts.

Hall fired a final round 71 (-1) to finish T-20th at 1-over for his second career top-20. The Knoxville, Tenn., native was 2-over through six holes, before holing out for eagle at the par-4 16th. He birdied the next hole and was bogey free with 10 consecutive pars to close the final round. Hall was one of 12 players in the field to record an eagle during the tournament.

Stachler had a strong finish on Tuesday as well, carding a 71 (-1). He led the team with six birdies on the day. The Alpharetta, Ga., native tallied red numbers on three of his five final holes. He finished T-55th at 10-over.

Senior Will Miles shot 74 (+2) and finished T-52nd at 8-over for the tournament. Freshman Harry Corbin shot 82 (+10).

No. 13 Vanderbilt continued its hot play en route to a wire-to-wire win, shooting a tournament-best 275 (-13) en route to a 20-shot victory today. The Commodores' Will Gordon also held on for the wire-to-wire win with a final round 66 (-6). He finished the tournament at 16-under (200), posting an opening round 64 (-8) on Sunday afternoon.

LAHAINA, Hawaii -- No. 24 South Carolina was unable to get the low final round it needed, shooting 280 (-4) on Sunday at the Ka'anapali Collegiate Classic. The Gamecocks finished seventh in the 21-team field despite shooting a season-best 54-hole score of 830 (-22).

Senior Scott Stevens led Carolina with a T-6th finish after shooting 203 (-10), marking his second top-10 of the 2018-19 season. He's finished in the top-20 in all four of the team's stroke events this fall. The Chattanooga, Tenn., native posted a 69 (-2) today with four birdies. He shot 36 (-1) on the front (-1) and finished with a bogey free 33 (-1) on the back nine. He started the tournament with a bang on Friday, shooting a career-best 64 (-7) thanks to sinking a 40-foot birdie putt on his final hole of the opening round.

Stevens now has 17 career top-10s in 41 starts, which ties him for fifth all-time in program history with three-time All-American George Bryan IV.

Freshman Ryan Hall continued his solid play, also shooting 69 (-2) on Sunday. He posted a red number every day at the Royal Ka'anapali Course to finish T-18th at 6-under (207) for the tournament, marking his third top-20 of the fall slate. The Knoxville, Tenn., native had four birdies today. He shot an even par 37 on the front, and was bogey free on the back nine with a 2-under 32. Hall's 207 is the fourth-lowest 54-hole score in program history by a freshman.

"Scott (Stevens) had a really good tournament and a very solid fall season for that matter," said head coach Bill McDonald. "I'm really impressed with Ryan Hall's game and he had another good week for us. Overall, we just never got it going today, and we got smoked by some very good teams. It's frustrating to not finish better because we were really close to putting it all together this weekend. We're going to get to work in the offseason. Coach (Ben) Dietrich and I have to figure out how to get our best five guys on the bus if we're going to be a highly competitive team this spring."

Senior Ryan Stachler bounced back from a 74 (+3) yesterday with a 1-under 70 today. Stachler was bogey free on the front nine with an eagle on the par-5 sixth hole -- he shot 35 (+1) coming in. The Alpharetta, Ga., native finished T-50th at even par for the tournament. Senior Will Miles finished T-24th with a 5-under 208. The Hilton Head Island, S.C., native tallied a 1-over 72 on Sunday with a pair of birdies. Miles just missed out on his 12th career top-20. Sophomore Andrew Spiegler struggled with a 76 (+5) in the final round Sunday.

No. 25 Cal, who led going into today, ran away with an 11-shot win thanks to a 20-under 264 in the final round. The Bears' Sebastian Crampton took home medalist honors with a 196 (-17). He shot 63 (-8) today to come from behind for the victory. Quade Cummins of No. 5 Oklahoma was runner-up medalist with a score of 198 (-15).

HUMBLE, Texas -- Due to heavy rain throughout the day in the Houston area, the final round of the 2019 All-American Intercollegiate has been cancelled. The Gamecocks finished T-4th with a final 36-hole tally of 582 (+6). Senior Will Miles, senior Ryan Stachler and junior Jamie Wilson all tallied top-15 finishes for the Gamecocks.

Miles led the way, shooting 2-under (142) to place T-7th. It marks his sixth career top-10 in 31 events and first since a career-best fourth place finish at the 2017 Ka'anapali Collegiate Classic last fall. The Hilton Head Island, S.C., native, is T-2nd on the team now with seven rounds of par or better during the 2018-19 season.

Wilson, who competed as an individual this week, shot 1-under (143) to place T-9th and record his second career top-10. The Mount Pleasant, S.C., native, finished T-5th as a freshman helping Carolina win the team title at the 2017 Hootie at Bulls Bay Intercollegiate. This week, he recorded his first two scores of par or better this season and now has 19 for his career in 56 rounds played.

Stachler bounced back from a 75 (+3) in the opening round with a team-best 70 (-2) yesterday to move 41 spots up the leaderboard and finish T-12th, his fourth career top-20. The Alpharetta, Ga., native, missed the entire season last year with a hip injury. His top-15 this week at the All-American is his best finish since back-to-back top-10s in the spring of his sophomore year at the General Hackler Championship at the Palmetto Intercollegiate.

Senior Scott Stevens finished T-22nd at 3-over par, just missing out on the 26th top-20 of his career. The Chattanooga, Tenn., native, leads the Gamecocks in nearly every statistical category and has finished inside the top-25 now in all five starts this season.

Junior Caleb Proveaux finished T-43rd (+6) and sophomore Jack Parrott placed T-63rd (+10) in his collegiate debut.

AIKEN, S.C. -- South Carolina ran away with the title at the 2019 Cleveland Golf Palmetto Intercollegiate on Tuesday, winning by a staggering 35-shot margin. The Gamecocks shot a new school and tournament record 813 (-27) en route to the team's first win of the 2018-19 season. Senior Will Miles led Carolina, going wire-to-wire for his first collegiate win. He shot 197 (-13) to earn an impressive nine shot victory.

"It was unbelievable -- a great team victory," said head coach Bill McDonald. "Four guys in the top-five which was pretty special for us. Then Will Miles -- I can't say enough great things about him and how well he played. I couldn't be happier for him with how hard he's worked and to see it pay off. Not just Will, but our (three) seniors in general. They've just been incredible leaders and put in a ton of work -- really cool seeing it all come together this week."

Miles carded a final round 68 (-2) with six birdies. He was even at the turn and posted a 2-under 34 coming into the clubhouse today. The Hilton Head Island, S.C., native led the field with 15 birdies over 54 holes. His victory marked the third top-five finish of his career. He set the tournament scoring record, surpassing former Gamecock All-American Will Starke (shot 201 in 2015) and current PGA TOUR player Bud Cauley (shot 201 in 2011 playing for Alabama).

"It feels awesome, it feels really good," said Miles. "I had some tricky up-and-downs to start yesterday, and it just kind of got me rolling. I was pretty locked in with the short game this week."

The Gamecocks had three more players finish in the top-five. Seniors Scott Stevens and Ryan Stachler T-2nd with final tallies of 206 (-4) while junior Caleb Proveaux T-5th after shooting 207 (-3). Stachler and Proveaux's top-fives this week at Palmetto Golf Club marked new career-best for each player.

Stevens took home the hardware for runner-up medalist with the low final round of the three players tied for second. He shot 69 (-1) for his third-straight round in the 60s and finished second in the field behind Miles with 14 red numbers on the week. Stevens, a 2017 All-SEC and PING All-Southeast Region selection, has started every tournament the past four seasons for Carolina. Today marked his sixth career top-five and third runner-up finish.

Junior Jamie Wilson played great golf in the final round, tying Stevens with a team-best 69 (-1). He climbed 25 spots on the leaderboard to finish T-19th, his fourth career-top 20 (second straight).

Wind was a factor today, but Carolina still managed to shoot 276 (-4) in today's third round, the only program in the 18-team field to shoot under par.

In seven Palmetto Intercollegiate appearances under McDonald since 2012, the Gamecocks have now won three titles (2015, 2016 and 2019). Carolina also won Palmetto Intercollegiate titles in 2004 under Puggy Blackmon and in 1991 under Steve Liebler.

PALM CITY, Fla. -- South Carolina finished third in a stacked, 15-team field on Tuesday at the 2019 Valspar Collegiate Invitational. With inclement weather forecasted for today, the team's squeezed in the final 36 holes on Monday, finishing up last night. Results were not final until this morning as three players (two from Duke, one from USF) had to come back to the course to finish their rounds. Carolina finished with a 54-hole total of 837 (-15).

"I'm really proud of the guys and their effort this week," said head coach Bill McDonald. "It's really gratifying to have my three seniors all finish in the top-15 in such a strong field. Ryan (Stachler) looked great all three rounds and his game just continues to impress me. I thought we ran out of gas and got a little sloppy in the afternoon/evening round yesterday, but overall it was a really solid showing for our team. The strength of the field this week, the windy conditions, and the golf course should give the guys the confidence that they can compete with the best teams in the country from here on out."

The Gamecocks were one shot off the lead at 19-under, trailing No. 6 Wake Forest after the second round early yesterday afternoon, after shooting the fourth-best score in the field with a 271 (-13). Scoring conditions got tougher as the day wore on and Carolina shot 289 (+5) in the final round falling back one spot to third. The Demon Deacons were one of three teams to post a red number in the final round, winning with a final 54-hole tally of 25-under. No. 13 Auburn finished second at 19-under for the tournament with a field best 276 (-8) in round three.

Carolina, who came into the tournament ranked 31st in the latest Golfstat Team Rankings, finished in front of 10 teams ahead of them in the rankings. Five of those teams are ranked in the top-10: defending NCAA Champion and top-ranked Oklahoma State, No. 2 Duke, No. 3 Vanderbilt, No. 8 Texas and No. 9 Georgia Tech.

The Gamecocks were led again this week at the Floridian by their senior trio of Ryan Stachler (T-5th), Will Miles (T-14th) and Scott Stevens (T-14th). Stachler shot 206 (-7) en route to his third-straight top-15 finish to start the spring (T-12th at All-American Intercollegiate on Feb. 19 and T-2nd at Palmetto Intercollegiate on March 12). He shot 68 (-3) in the second round and tallied an even-par 71 in round three. The Alpharetta, Ga., native had a team-low four bogeys in 36 holes on Monday to go alongside seven birdies.

After starting with a double-bogey in the second round on the par-4 first hole, Miles went 5-under the rest of the way with six birdies en route to a 3-under 68. He followed that up with a 72 (+1) in the final round. Miles was even with two holes to play but was hurt by a double on the par-4 17th hole. He finished strong however with a birdie on 18.

Stevens carded the low 18-hole score of the tournament for the Gamecocks in the second round with a lights-out 66 (-55). The Chattanooga, Tenn., native was even through five holes, then went bogey free over his final 13 with five birdies including three-straight red numbers on 13, 14 and 15. Stevens was 4-over in the final round through 13 holes, but closed strong with three birdies to get into the clubhouse with a 1-over, 72. Stevens, a four-year starter who has played in every tournament the past four seasons, leads the team with six top-20 finishes in seven events during the 2018-19 season. He led the team with 17 birdies (T-3rd in the field) this week and blew-away the field finishing with a par-4 scoring average of 3.67 (-9), four strokes ahead of anyone else.

Junior Caleb Proveaux finished T-55th at 5-over (220). The Lexington, S.C., native, shot 74 (+3) in round two and 73 (+2) in round three. Fellow junior Jamie Wilson finished T-72nd at 11-over (224). The Awendaw, S.C., native, had his best score of the tournament with a 69 (-2) in the second round on Monday. He followed that with a 76 (+5) in the final round later in the day.

In five Valspar Collegiate Invitational appearances under McDonald since 2015, this marks Carolina's third top-five finish and a new 54-hole low at the event. The previous low came when the team shot 841 (-17) en route to a third-place finish in 2015.

All five players in the lineup posted red numbers today as the Gamecocks shot a field-best 277 (-11) in the final round to run away with a seven-shot victory.

"They came out on fire to start the round today," said head coach Bill McDonald. "I was a little concerned about them to be honest with you. It's been an awful lot of golf for us over the last couple of weeks. The guys showed up this morning and really played a great front nine. I couldn't say enough about Jamie Wilson, finishing third in his hometown - just played really rock solid golf for us. It's been an amazing couple of weeks. Carolina was led by Wilson, who fired his third-straight 69 (-3) to take third place with a 54-hole total of 207 (-9). AUGUSTA, Ga. -- No. 19 South Carolina came up just shy in the final round at the Augusta Haskins Award Invitational, taking second after blowing away the rest of the field with a 273 (-15) on Sunday. No. 3 Wake Forest, the leader going into today, edged out the Gamecocks by three shots thanks to several birdies coming in on holes 17 and 18. Carolina finished with a 54-hole total of 831 (-33), its second lowest three-round score of the 2018-19 season. The 15-team field got off to an hour late start this morning due to rain and fog at Forest Hills Golf Club.

Junior Jamie Wilson continued his standout play earning runner-up medalist honors after shooting 67 (-5) in the final round. The Mount Pleasant, S.C., native, posted a new career-best score of 204 (-12). He finished second in the field with 15 birdies this week. Wilson, who took third while helping the Gamecocks comeback to win the Hootie at Bulls Bay Intercollegiate two weeks ago, has three top-five finishes in 23 career events played. He was bogey free today shooting 34 (-2) on the front nine and 33 (-3) coming in with red numbers on his final two holes. He hit the flag off the tee at the par-3 16th and just missed another birdie on the scorecard. Wilson nearly sunk an eagle putt on 18 as well after driving the green on the short par-4.

Fellow junior Caleb Proveaux also went low today, leading Carolina with a career-best 65 (-7) fueled by eight birdies. The Lexington, S.C., native, led the field in par-5 scoring average this week at 4.33 (-8). He climbed nearly 40 spots on the leaderboard to finish T-14th at 4-under overall, his third top-20 (fifth career) in the last four outings. Proveaux's lights out 65 was the lowest score in the 75-man field during the third round.

"The guys, particularly Jamie and Caleb, played some lights out golf today," said head coach Bill McDonald. "Yesterday afternoon, the second round, was really strong as well. We lost this golf tournament in the morning round yesterday. We were a little bit loose, really all three rounds, particularly with some par-5 play. Got to give it up to Wake, they played really well and we just came up a little bit short."

The Demon Deacons shot 281 (-7) today to hold on for their fourth win of the 2018-19 season. Cameron Young, the 22nd ranked player in the latest Golfstar player rankings, ran away with the individual title shooting 197 (-19) while accounting for half his team's final mark of 36-under (828). The Gamecocks came into today 11 shots off the pace in fourth place. Carolina surpassed No. 7 Texas, who finished third at 30-under (834), with its impressive final 18 holes today. The Gamecocks also picked up an SEC victory over Arkansas, improving the team's record to 12-10 against league opponents during the 2018-19 season.

ATHENS, Ga. -- No. 17 South Carolina finished the regular season on a high note after winning the 2019 Southern Intercollegiate Monday evening, a one-day, 36-hole event hosted by the University of Georgia. The Gamecocks ran away with the victory in breezy conditions at Athens Country Club, winning by 20 shots with a final tally of 562 (-14) after two under par rounds of 284 (-4) and 278 (-10).

Senior Will Miles took home medalist honors at 8-under par to lead the team. He shot 71 (-1) in the first round and 65 (-7) in round two en route to his second collegiate win. Miles led the field in red numbers with 14 as he was the only player in the 85-man field to post double-digit birdies today. ST. SIMONS ISLAND, Ga. -- No. 15 South Carolina advanced to match play at the SEC Championship with an eighth-place finish in the stroke play portion of the event on Friday. The Gamecocks finished with a 54-hole total of 856 (+16), one shot in front of No. 12 LSU for the final match play slot.

Winds were steady at around 30 miles per hour at Sea Island Golf Club's Seaside Course, making scoring conditions extremely tough. Ten of the 14 teams in the field shot double-digit over par today, with only one squad posting a red number.

Carolina had a tough stretch on the front nine and shot 20-over today, its first round of the year 300 or higher.

The Gamecocks were led by junior Caleb Proveaux for the third-straight day as he shot 71 (+1) to finish the tournament T-9th at 2-under. It's the third top-10 of the 2018-19 season (fourth career) for the Lexington, S.C., native, in eight starts. Proveaux is making his debut at the SEC Championship this week. He bogeyed two of his final three holes after sitting at 1-under for most of his round today.

Seniors Will Miles and Ryan Stachler T-26th at 5-over for the tournament. Stachler shot 76 (+6) while Miles finished with a 77 (+7). Senior Scott Stevens was the final counting score for the Gamecocks with a 6-over, 76. The Chattanooga, Tenn., native, didn't register a birdie all round. He finished T-52nd at 12-over par. Junior Jamie Wilson shot 78 (+8) and finished T-46th at 10-over.

The Gamecocks will face No. 16 Auburn in the SEC Match Play Quarterfinals on Friday morning. The winner advances to the semifinals in the afternoon, which will air on SEC Network+. The Tigers are the top seed after running away with the stroke play portion of the event. Auburn's Jovan Rebula defeated teammate Graysen Huff in a playoff for medalist honors late this afternoon.

The Tigers, the defending SEC Champions, earned the top overall seed for match play with a low score of 24-under in stroke play earlier in the week.

“We had a good chance to win this match today, and I’m proud of how the guys came out prepared and ready to compete this morning,” said head coach Bill McDonald. “All credit to the other team, they just simply played better.”

Senior Scott Stevens posted the lone victory for the Gamecocks, a 2-up win against Trace Crowe. He led for all but two holes during the match. He had four birdies before his match was stopped through 14 holes.

Senior Ryan Stachler led off for Carolina at 7:30 a.m. ET against Jacob Solomon. He was three down through five holes but battled back with two birdies to pull within one at the turn. The duo exchanged pars the first four holes (10-13) on the back nine. Solomon pulled back in front by three with birdies at 14 and 15. Stachler birdied 16 but made par on 17, falling 2&1.

Junior Caleb Proveaux played great golf against individual medalist Jovan Rebula. He was 2-up with five holes to play, but Rebula went on a birdie tear posting red numbers on his final five holes. The match was all square at 17 after both players birdied the par-4 16th. Rebula stuffed his tee shot to a foot at a pin location up front, tucked behind a bunker to take a 1-up lead. Both players birdied 18 giving Rebula the 1-up victory.

Auburn then sealed its quarterfinal win with a 5&4 victory by Brandon Mancheno over junior Jamie Wilson in the anchor position. They were all square through six, but Mancheno heated up making four birdies over the next five holes to take control of the match.

PULLMAN, Wash. -- No. 17 South Carolina is headed back to the NCAA Championship after taking down Colorado State in a dramatic, sudden-death playoff for the fifth spot out of the NCAA Pullman Regional on Wednesday afternoon. Senior Scott Stevens sealed the victory with a short par putt.

“Really proud of these kids and how hard they fought today to bring us back into this thing” said head coach Bill McDonald. “Scott Stevens made birdie at 16 and 17 and a bunch of guys made birdie at hole 18. I guess it was just meant to be. It’s one of those things you can’t explain. They found a way this week, and it’s just really cool to be going back to the National Championship.”

All five players from each team went back to play the tough par-4 ninth hole after the teams finished stroke play tied with a 54-hole total of 819 (-21). Each score counted with the low total advancing to next week’s National Championship at the Blessings Golf Club in Fayetteville, Ark.

They went off in two five-somes, junior Caleb Proveaux and freshman Ryan Hall in the first wave for the third-seeded Gamecocks – seniors Will Miles, Ryan Stachler and Stevens in the second wave.

Hall and Proveaux each made par after missing birdie looks. The Rams made birdie, par and bogey to leave the scoreboard all square. All five players in the second wave had birdie putts. Miles was furthest away at about 50 feet while the others all had makeable 3s. He put his to about six feet with a great lag putt. Stevens left his birdie attempt just shy, and Colorado State made two pars. Stachler had the best birdie look out of all 10 players after stuffing his tee shot tight above the hole. He sunk a clutch putt for a three to give the Gamecocks a leg up. Miles made his par putt then Stevens sealed it with his short putt. Nine of the 10 players in the playoff hit the fairway off the tee, and nine of the 10 players all had birdie putts.

The Gamecocks made a dramatic comeback in stroke play to force the playoff with CSU. Carolina shot the second-best round of the day behind a BYU, a 13-under 267. The Gamecocks, who were four shots out of fourth going into today’s final round, trailed by 10 shots heading into the back nine. Miles, Proveaux and Hall all birdied the par-5 18th. Stevens made huge birdies on 16 and 17 and then made a clutch par save on 18 to send it to the sudden-death playoff.

The Chattanooga, Tenn., native, played lights out golf this week, finishing T-3rd after matching a career-best 54-hole score with a 198 (-12). He shot in the 60s every round, closing with a bogey free 65 today. Stevens had just two bad numbers on his scorecard all week, a bogey and a double bogey.

Hall, who was playing in his first tournament in the lineup this spring, also had a bogey free round with a 4-under 66. He tied for 24th in his postseason debut at five-under overall. Miles, who struggled the first two rounds, showed up in a big way with a final round 66 (-4) with five birdies. He made a huge par save on hole 15 from 30-feet out after an errant tee shot. Proveaux was the final counting score with an even par 70. He made the turn at 1-over and fought hard coming in with a 1-under 34 on the back nine. The Lexington, S.C., native, also made a huge par at 15 after flying his second shot over the back of the green. Stachler shot 75 (+5) closing with a birdie on 18.

FAYETTEVILLE, Ark. -- No. 15 South Carolina saw its 2018-19 season come to an end on Sunday in the third round NCAA Championship. The Gamecocks finished 17th with a 54-hole total of 902 (+38), two shots off the cutline for the top-15 behind No. 9 Southern Cal.

"I'm really proud of these seniors and I'm sorry their career has come to an end," said head coach Bill McDonald. "They're great kids, and they've been an absolute pleasure to coach. We just didn't have our best stuff this week, but I believe we had an incredible year as a team. I really appreciate all the hard work the entire team put into this season and the support from the parents as well."

Carolina was paced by its senior All-SEC duo of Scott Stevens and Will Miles in the third round today as they each shot even par 72s. Stevens started his day 2-under with consecutive birdies at holes 14 and 15. He missed an 8-foot par save on 16 and then caught a tough break on the tee at the par-3 17th hole. Stevens slipped on his tee shot and hit it into the hazard, making a six on the hole. He made the turn at 2-over (38) and shot 34 (-2) on the back nine with three birdies and just one bogey. Miles played great coming in as well with three birdies and just one bogey as he shot 34 (-2) on his back nine.

2007 NCAA West Regional Champions

South Carolina finishes 44-under-par to set course record en route to program's first regional title

TEMPE, Ariz. – Behind a record-breaking performance, the South Carolina men's golf team claimed a two-stroke victory over UCLA to win the 2007 NCAA West Regional at Karsten Golf Course (Par 72, 7,057 yards) in Tempe, Ariz. The Gamecocks recorded a three-round score of 820 to finish 44 strokes under par and set a course record.

"The guys were focused all week and nothing fazed them," South Carolina associate head coach Bill McDonald said. "I kept talking about winning the tournament, not so much advancing (to the NCAA finals). I wanted them to taste victory. I felt like we were good enough to win earlier in the season. We had some opportunities and didn't get it done. I am proud of the effort they gave."

South Carolina entered the final round one stroke behind regional leader and No. 4 UCLA. The Gamecocks shot 10-under par (278) as a team Saturday to beat the Bruins, who were seven under (281). No. 10 Southern California and No. 18 Arizona State, the regional host, shared third place with a final score of 824 (-40). Fellow Southeastern Conference team Vanderbilt caught fire on Saturday, finishing the third round at 21 under to surge into fifth place.

It was the first regional title for the Gamecocks, who reached the top 10 in three of the previous four NCAA Regionals. In 1999, South Carolina fell just shy of the East Regional title, finishing second in Barrington, R.I., despite Kyle Thompson's individual victory at the event.

The Gamecocks, who entered the tournament as the No. 11 seed, held a slight lead on UCLA for most of the final day, and freshman George Bryan IV's strong finish secured the win. The last player on the course for South Carolina, Bryan eagled No. 17 and sank a 40-foot putt for birdie on No. 18. The Chapin, S.C., product tied for 10th individually with a three-day total of 68-67-69=204 (-12). His tournament total of 204 tied him for fourth place in school history for a three-round individual score and was the best individual performance ever by a Gamecock in regional play. Bryan's 10th-place finish was the best by a Carolina golfer since Thompson won the 2001 NCAA West Regional in Corvallis, Ore.

Sophomore Florian Fritsch and junior Mark Anderson tied for 16th on the individual leader board after posting three-day totals of 206 (-10), which tied for the eighth-best three-round effort in school history. Anderson closed with a 70 (-2) on the final 18 holes, while Fritsch carded a 71 (-1) Saturday.

Sophomore Mark Silvers III fired a final round 69, and junior Warren Thomas posted a 70 on the final 18 holes. Silvers and Thomas both tied for 43rd with a three-day total score of 211 (-5).

"I noticed early on that both teams (South Carolina and UCLA) seemed tight," McDonald said. "It really helped us that Mark Silvers got off to such a good start. He made a couple of birdies early and made the turn at 32 (four under par). I think when our guys started to see the board and that we had a lead, that really helped. We got a burst of energy on the back nine knowing we had a chance to win."

As a team, South Carolina opened with a round of 273 on Thursday before shooting 269 on Friday. Those scores are among the five lowest rounds in school history. The team victory was the first for South Carolina since capturing the title at the 2005 Bank of Tennessee Intercollegiate (Oct. 15-16). In 2007, the Gamecocks' previous best performance was fourth place on three occasions.

"I told the team in a meeting a little while ago that this will mean more to them as the years go by," McDonald said of winning the title. "It will really mean a lot. To me, it gives our program validity. Instead of just talking about what we want to do, we went out and did it. It will really help from a recruiting and coaching standpoint. The more they win, the more they will believe and expect to play this way. That will develop tradition and have a long-lasting effect."

Mark Anderson

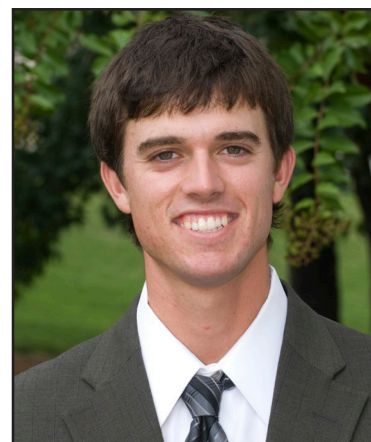
2005 - Third Team • 2008 - Honorable Mention

Mark Anderson put All-American bookends on his career, earning GCAA PING All-America honorable mention status as a senior after picking up third-team honors from the organization as a freshman. In his final season in the Garnet and Black, Anderson turned in seven top-20 finishes, reaching the status in six of the seven tournaments in the spring, to grab a spot on the All-SEC first team for the second time in his career. As a freshman, he also earned first-team all-conference honors and was named the league's Freshman of the Year. Anderson earned his PGA Tour card for 2012.

George Bryan IV

2007, 2009 - Honorable Mention • 2010 - Third Team

George Bryan IV joins David Seawell (1994-96) and Kyle Thompson (1999-2001) as the only three-time All-Americans in South Carolina annals. He earned a selection to the PING All-America Third Team in 2010 after being named an Honorable Mention selection in 2007 and 2009. Bryan wrapped up his career this season as one of the most prolific golfers in South Carolina history. His career scoring average of 72.37 stands atop the record books, as does his average of 71.35 for the 2009-10 season. Ranked 39th in the nation in the final *Golfweek/Sagarin* release, he tied for medalist honors twice during his senior season - including the SEC Championship - falling in playoffs on both occasions. The native of Chapin, S.C., earned four top-five finishes and eight top-20 showings in 11 events this season. For his career, he posted 17 career top-10 finishes in 46 tournaments, ranking fourth in school history.



Michael Christie

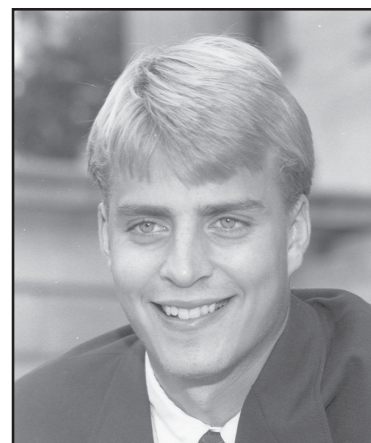
1992 - Honorable Mention

Michael Christie was an all-SEC selection and an honorable mention All-American in 1992. He had seven top-10 finishes in tournament play, including a third-place finish at the 1991 Metro Conference Championship. After a successful collegiate career, Christie completed his degree in retailing and participated in the PGA qualifying school.

Eric Ecker

1998, 1999 - Honorable Mention

Eric Ecker was named honorable mention All-America in both his sophomore and junior seasons. As a sophomore he captured the 1998 SEC Championship with a two-day score of eight-under. He participated in every South Carolina tournament in his four years at the school and ranked as one of South Carolina's all-time bests in terms of low tournament score and single-round low.





Webb Heintzelman

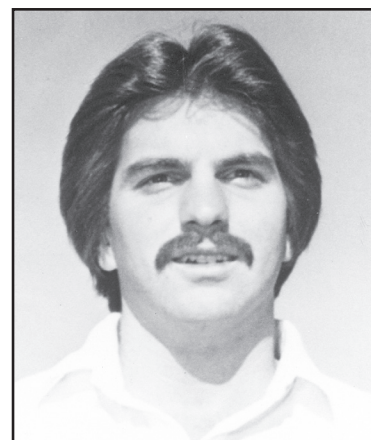
1984 - Honorable Mention

A 1984 graduate of South Carolina, Webb Heintzelman earned All-American honors his senior year. While playing for the Gamecocks, Heintzelman claimed the 1984 Tar Heel Invitational crown and established a new course record with a round of 65.

Mike Holland

1978 - Honorable Mention

A 1978 graduate, Mike Holland earned All-America honors his final season. Holland won the S.C. Amateur in 1976, finished ninth in the NCAAs in 1978 and played five years on the PGA Tour. Holland teamed with Vance Heafner to win the Walt Disney Team Championship in 1981, and, in 1982, finished second in the St. Jude Memphis Classic.



Jeff Hull

1989 - Honorable Mention

Jeff Hull earned All-America honors in 1989 as a senior. Hull finished 13th in the 1989 NCAAs. He was also named an All-American Scholar and played in the United States Amateur Championship.

Keenan Huskey

2017 - Honorable Mention (Golfweek)

Huskey, a Greenville, S.C. native, logged the third lowest scoring average (70.63) in program history during the 2016-17 season en route to Honorable Mention All-America honors from *Golfweek*. He won the 2017 Camden Collegiate Invitational for the second consecutive season (third career win) after shooting a 64 in the second round, T-4th lowest 18-hole score in school history. He finished in the top-20 in nine of his 12 starts. He led the team with six top-10s and four top-fives while shooting in the 60s 14 times. The All-SEC and PING All-Southeast Region selection finished his career second on the all-time scoring list (71.66), just behind his teammate for two seasons Matt NeSmith (71.65). Huskey's seven career top-fives are T-8th all-time and his 16 top-10s are T-6th. He won the 2018 All-American Intercollegiate, shooting 201 (-15) for his fourth career victory, tying him with NeSmith and fellow All-American Carl Paulson for second all-time.

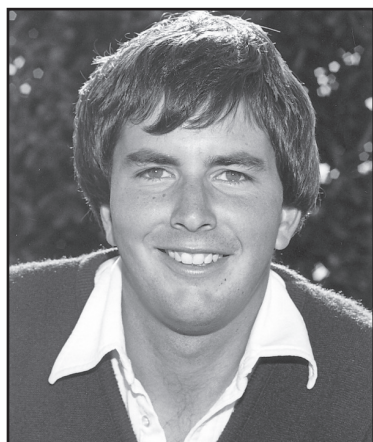




Eirik Johansen

2003, 2006 - Honorable Mention

Eirik Johansen earned honorable mention All-America honors as a freshman and again as a senior. Johansen shined during his first season as a Gamecock, leading the team with a 72.53 stroke average. He went on to become a three-time first-team All-SEC selection after playing in every tournament South Carolina entered during his career. Johansen concluded his career with 20 top-10 finishes.



Steve Liebler

1980, 1981 - Honorable Mention

A 1981 graduate, Steve Liebler was a two-time All-American in 1980 and 1981. Liebler claimed four top-10 finishes during his career. He captured the Eastern Amateur in 1981 and won the 1979 Guilford College Intercollegiate Tournament. After five years on the professional golf tour, he returned to his alma mater as head coach. The Virginia native coached South Carolina to six NCAA Championship tournaments in his tenure.

Will Murphy

2014 - Honorable Mention (PING)

Will Murphy was named a PING Honorable Mention All-American in 2014. He earned the honor with his tie for 15th showing at the NCAA Championship with a total of 208 (-2), the lowest 54-hole NCAA Championship total in program history. On the season, Murphy played in all 12 tournaments and helped the Gamecocks match the school record with nine top-five finishes, including three wins. He recorded five top-20 finishes and wrapped up the season with a stroke average of 72.63, which was the lowest in a single season by a junior in school history at the time.



Will Miles

2019 - Honorable Mention (Golfweek)

Will Miles was named a 2019 Honorable Mention All-American by *Golfweek* following his senior season in 2018-19. The Hilton Head Island, S.C., native, won twice in the spring of 2019 and was one of just two players in the SEC to win multiple times. He was also named PING All-Southeast Region and Second Team All-SEC. Miles ranked second on the team in scoring average (70.97 - T-5th lowest all-time), rounds of par or better (22) and top-20 finishes (7). He shot 197 (64-65-68) en route to a nine shot victory at the Palmetto Intercollegiate (March 11-12), marking the first win of his career. His low score T-2nd lowest 54-hole mark in school history. Miles won again at the Southern Intercollegiate (April 15) with a 36-hole total of 144 (71-65). The team won as well both times Miles took home individual medalist honors. A three-year starter, he finished his career with the sixth-lowest scoring average all-time at South Carolina (72.40 in 114 rounds played).



Matt NeSmith

**2013 - Honorable Mention • 2015 - Third Team (Golfweek, PING)
2016 - First Team (PING), Second Team (Golfweek)**

Matt NeSmith finished his standout career one of the most decorated golfers in program history. The North Augusta, S.C., native, was named a PING First Team All-American following his senior season in 2015-16, the first in Gamecock golf history. NeSmith led South Carolina to a program best T-5th finish at the NCAA Championship that season and won two twice while earning Semifinalist honors for both the Ben Hogan and Jack Nicklaus Awards. NeSmith was also a two-time medalist in 2014-15, including winning the SEC Individual Championship. He earned Third Team All-America laurels as a junior and was an Honorable Mention pick as a freshman. NeSmith also took home PING All-Southeast Region honors four times for Carolina. He currently is playing on the PGA TOUR after finishing second on the points list in the 2019 Korn Ferry Tour finals, where he won the Albertsons Boise Open.

Carl Paulson

1993 - Honorable Mention

Carl Paulson earned All-America honors in 1993. As a Gamecock, Paulson compiled four individual medalist honors, more than anyone ever to wear the garnet and black. He was the Metro Conference Champion in 1991 and was named SEC Player of the Year in 1993. Paulson won the 1995 PGA Tour Qualifying School.



Allen Powers

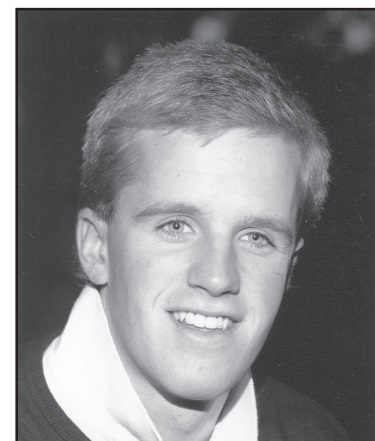
1968 - Honorable Mention

In 1968, Allen Powers was named to the All-America team and finished in the NCAA top five. A 1968 graduate of the University of South Carolina, Powers won the Carolinas' Four-Ball Tournament four times and captured the S.C. Amateur in 1982. Powers' other collegiate victories included the 1967 South Carolina Intercollegiate and the 1968 Palmetto Intercollegiate.

Brett Quigley

1991 - Honorable Mention

A 1991 graduate, Quigley earned honorable mention All-America honors in his senior season. Quigley also garnered Academic All-America laurels and made first team All-Metro Conference that season. He was second in the 1989 Metro Conference Tournament and posted a 72.9 stroke average his senior year. The Barrington, R.I., native is currently having a successful professional career, including a top-20 finish on the PGA's money list in 2006.





David Seawell

1994 - Second Team • 1995, 1996 - Honorable Mention

David Seawell was named second-team All-America as a sophomore. He won the Carpet Capital Collegiate in 1994 and led the nation in stroke average at one time. Seawell tied for fourth in the NCAA East Regional and qualified as an individual for the NCAA Finals. He qualified for the NCAA Championships in Columbus, Ohio, as a junior, en route to honorable mention All-America honors.

Mark Silvers III

2009 - Honorable Mention

Mark Silvers III earned Honorable Mention All-America status his senior season at South Carolina with a team-best 72.74 stroke average and an 18th-place finish at the NCAA Championship. He recorded four top-10 and eight top-20 showings, the most impressive of which was a tie for 10th at the NCAA Southeast Regional. He fired a final-round 64 to vault the Gamecocks up the leaderboard and into the NCAA Championship. Silvers was also named the 2009 SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year.



Will Starke

**2015 - Second Team (Golfweek, PING) •
2016 - Honorable Mention (Golfweek)**

Will Starke was a second-team All-American selection by both *Golfweek* and PING in 2015. He led the team with a stroke average of 70.27, which is the lowest for a single season in school history. He finished 16th or better in 10 of 12 events, including one tournament win, and matched the school record for top-five finishes in a season with six. Starke, a first-team All-SEC and PING All-Southeast Region selection, shot under par in 26 of 37 rounds, including 19 rounds in the 60s. As a senior, Starke earned Honorable Mention All-America laurels from *Golfweek* after finishing T-13th at the NCAA Championship. His heroic final-round 66 led the Gamecocks into the match play portion of the event for the first time in school history.

Scott Stevens

2019 - Third Team (PING, Golfweek)

Scott Stevens was named a Third Team All-American by both PING and *Golfweek* following his senior season in the spring of 2019. The Chattanooga, Tenn., native, led Carolina in nearly every statistical category during the 2018-19 season. He ranked first in scoring average (70.59 - third lowest all-time), rounds of par or better (26), top-five finishes (3), top-10s (5) and top-20s (10). Stevens finished T-3rd at the NCAA Pullman Regional, matching a 54-hole career best score of 198 (-12). He shot 65 (-5) in the final round to help lead the Gamecocks back to the NCAA Championship with a top-five finish. A four-year starter, Stevens did not miss a tournament while playing for Carolina. He finished his illustrious career the all-time scoring average leader in program history, tallying a career average of 71.57 in 148 rounds played. A two-time PING All-Southeast Region selection and 2019 First Team All-SEC pick, Stevens' 20 career top-10 finishes are T-3rd most all-time in program history.

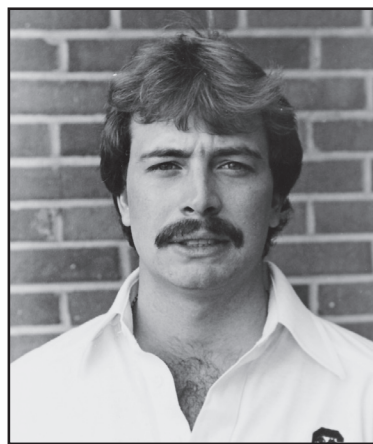
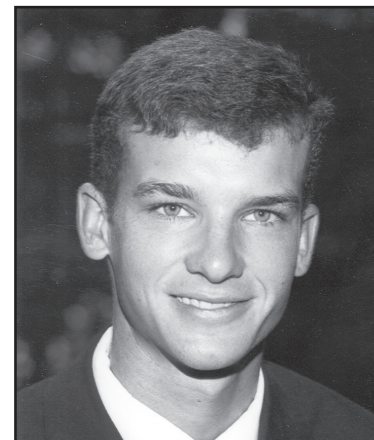




Kyle Thompson

1999 - Second Team • 2000, 2001 - Honorable Mention

Kyle Thompson was named an All-American three times (1999, 2000, 2001). In 1999, he captured individual championships in both the Seminole Classic and the NCAA East Regional, where he set a school record of 63 in the final round. After winning the 2001 NCAA West Regional, Thompson broke Carl Paulson's school record for most individual titles with five. Thompson held his PGA TOUR card on three different occasions (2008, 2012, 2018). He won five times on the Web.com Tour and had 36 career top-10 finishes before retiring from competitive golf in 2019.



David Tolley

1984 - Honorable Mention

David Tolley earned All-America honors in 1984 and graduated from South Carolina the same year. Tolley gained national recognition while at South Carolina by playing in the 1983 Masters Tournament. Tolley shot a 77-74 at The Masters, missing the cut by only four shots. He was runner-up in the 1982 U.S. Amateur before losing to Jay Sigel.

Fred Wadsworth

1984 - Second Team

Fred Wadsworth was named to the 1984 All-America squad. As a senior, Wadsworth placed ninth at the NCAA Championships. He collected victories at the Imperial Lakes Invitational and the South Carolina Invitational. In 1986, Wadsworth joined the PGA Tour and captured the Southern Open Championship. He was the last Monday qualifier to win on the PGA Tour for 24 years until Arjun Atwal captured the 2010 Wyndham Championship.



Rick Williams

1990 - Honorable Mention

Rick Williams was named to the 1988 All-America and All-Metro squads. Williams earned All-Metro honors again in 1990 by capturing the conference individual title. He finished his collegiate career with a 44th-place showing at the 1990 NCAA East Regional.

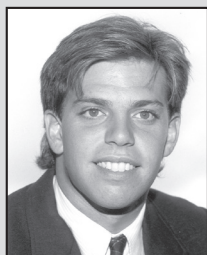

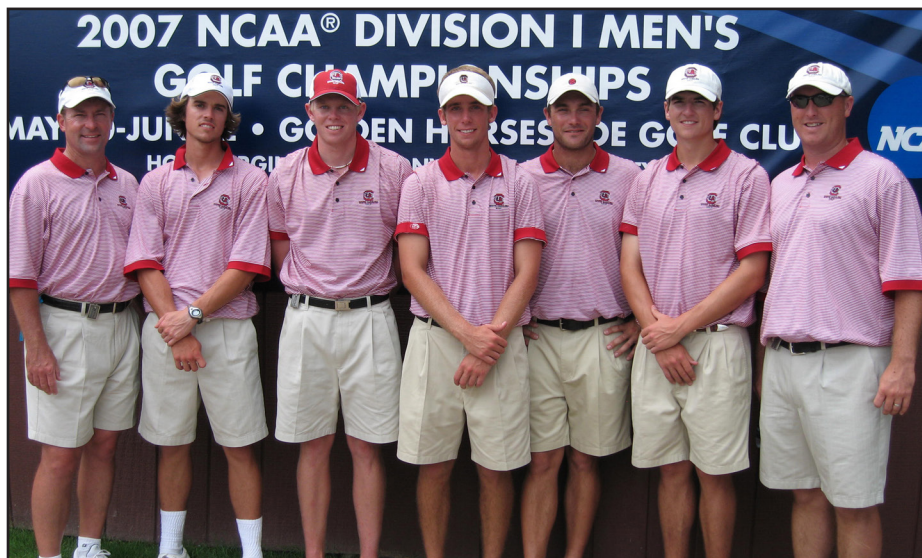

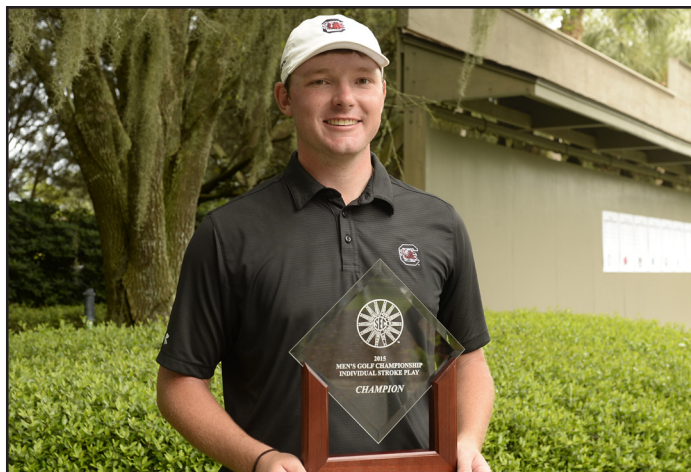
