GAMECOCKS IN THE SEC... AND SOME FUN NOTES

- South Carolina comes into the SEC week with a 260-360 (.413) record all-time in SEC play.
- The Gamecocks have won the SEC once in program history (1997, the first year of the conference). Carolina went 25-1 that year in SEC play on its way to a first-place finish in the SEC East Division.
- Carolina has won 20+ SEC games in a season twice (1997 and 2002) and has won 10+ 13 times (1997, 1998, 1999, 2000, 2001, 2002, 2003, 2004, 2005, 2007, 2014, 2015 and 2018).
- The Garnet and Black posted a 9-14 record in 2019 SEC play. Carolina went 1-2 last year with a series loss to Georgia before the season was ended.
- South Carolina opened the SEC slate in 2018 on the road against Ole Miss and took the series 2-1 while outscoring the Rebels 12-6. Carolina has won the past two three-game series in Oxford.
- The Gamecocks hit .262 as a team in those three games. Alyssa VanDerveer led the way at the plate with a 5-for-10 weekend. Mackenzie Boesel posted a 4-for-10 series with three RBI. Kenzi Maguire had a team-best six RBI.
- Cayla Drotar finished the weekend with nine innings of work with a 0.78 ERA and a win while holding the Ole Miss hitters to a .212 batting average.
- Dixie Raley stole the show in the circle, as well, throwing a complete-game performance with just one earned run allowed and seven strikeouts. She held Ole Miss hitters to just three hits (.125 batting average).
- Kelsey Oh earned the win in the 2019 meeting between the two teams that ended in a 1-1 split. She went seven innings with just three hits allowed and nine strikeouts.
- Alyssa Kumiyama and Alexis Lindsey had the two RBI in the series for Carolina.
- The two games against Charleston Southern on Wednesday will be just the third and fourth games against South Carolina foes in 2021. Carolina took down Coastal Carolina twice on Feb. 24, outscoring them 18-0 in 11 innings of work.

South Carolina has seen its star rise again in the collegiate softball world, and head coach Beverly Smith has guided that process since arriving as head coach in July of 2010. She oversees all aspects of the program and works most closely on the field with the pitchers. As a head coach, Smith's overall record is 350-234, becoming only the second Gamecock softball coach with over 300 career wins.

From 2013-19, Smith guided the Gamecocks to a program record seven-consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances. Carolina was well on its way to its eighth-consecutive postseason trip in 2020 before the season was ended early due to the Covid-19 Pandemic. If the Gamecocks were to achieve a postseason berth in 2021, the consecutive trips streak would continue on to eight.

The Gamecocks have competed in the regional championship four-consecutive completed seasons (also a program record), while the 2018 team reached the program's second-ever super regional.

Carolina closed the 2020 season with a 17-6 record after the season was cut short due to the Covid-19 Pandemic. In the shortened season, the Gamecocks recorded wins over Ohio State, Kansas, No. 8 Michigan, Iowa State and No. 13 Georgia, among others. Haley Simpson led the way with a .353 batting average while Kenzi Maguire posted a team-best 20 hits. Katie Prebble had a team-high six home runs and 25 RBI. In the circle, Karsen Ochs posted an SC-best five wins while Kelsey Oh led the pitching staff with 51 strikeouts in 32.2 innings of work.

South Carolina finished the 2019 season with a respectable 38-19 record and reached its fourth-straight regional final under Smith. Under her leadership, the Gamecocks have now won 30 or more games each of the past seven years, the first time the program has done so since 2002 when it had 16-straight years of 30 or more-win seasons. South Carolina notably had a 15-game winning streak for the second-consecutive season, marking the first time since the 1996 and 1997 seasons the program won 10-straight games (or more) in back-to-back years. Smith earned her 300th career win as head coach at South Carolina in a 5-4 victory over Duke on March 20, 2019. The Gamecocks earned back-to-back series wins over Alabama and Auburn, becoming just the third team in the conference since 2005 to do so (11 chances). Carolina outscored the two rivals 30-20 over the two weekends with eight home runs. It was the first time since 2009 Carolina took the series over Alabama. Another notable streak continued in 2019 as the Gamecocks have had more than 30,000 fans come to Carolina Stadium for the past six-consecutive years. Carolina tied the program record for largest single-game crowd against Alabama with 2,250 which was previously set in 1997.

Many Gamecocks have broken out with their hard work under the watchful eye of Smith and her coaching staff. The 2018 leaders proved to be Mackenzie Boesel at the plate and Cayla Drotar in the circle. For the second-straight season, Boesel led the Gamecocks in nine different offensive categories (at bats, on-base percentage, hits, triples, batting average, runs, total bases, RBI and slugging percentage) while she paced the Gamecocks in two categories (doubles and walks) for the first time in her career. In the circle Drotar led the Gamecocks with 21 wins, becoming the first 20-game winner since 2015 and just the second in the past 16 years at Carolina. Drotar became the first pitcher not named Jessica Elliott or Nickie Blue to lead the team in innings pitched and wins since 2013. In league honors the Gamecocks had two players (Maguire and Tiara Duffy) named SEC Player of the Week while Johns became the first freshman in program history to be named SEC Freshman of the Week twice.

Prior to coming to South Carolina, Smith served as the top assistant at North Carolina, working mostly with the pitchers and catchers. The final three years, she was the associate head coach after nine as an assistant. Smith helped the Tar Heels to two Atlantic Coast Conference titles in 2001 and 2008 and eight of their nine NCAA Tournament appearances. She served as the lead recruiter for the Tar Heels during that time, helping to bring in five All-Americans into the UNC program. She also helped North Carolina achieve a top-25 ranking in the USA Today/NFCA Coaches Poll at least once per season from 2006-10.

THIS IS CAROLINA - TRADITION LIVES HERE

- South Carolina softball has made 22 trips to the postseason, a number that started in 1982. The Gamecocks have reached two super regionals and three WCWS. In conference play, Carolina owns two SEC Championships.
- Carolina rolls into the 2021 season with a 45-48 record all-time in those crucial postseason games and a 14-15 mark under Beverly Smith.
- Fans and opponents have become accustomed to seeing the Gamecocks play on Sundays in the postseason. Carolina has reached the regional final four-straight completed years. The Gamecocks are 2-3 in those past five Sunday games.
- A historic trend Carolina will look to change is its record against host schools in regionals. Since 1982, the Gamecocks are just 2-11 against host schools and 0-7 under Smith. On the flip side, South Carolina is 4-2 at home in the postseason under Smith having advanced to just the program's second super regional in 2018 with two win-or-go-home games against Liberty.

THE GAMECOCKS

- South Carolina comes into the 2021 season looking to build off a 17-6 shorted season highlighted with wins over Ohio State, Iowa State, No. 8 Michigan and No. 12 Georgia.
- The Gamecocks are set to welcome 10 freshmen to the program (Maddie Gallagher, Carlie Henderson, Kylee Gleason, Zoe Laneaux, Aaliyah White, Skylar Trahan, Leah Powell, Carly Robbins, Riley Blampied and Chooch Carroll.
- Carolina will have nine left-handed batters available in the lineup. It had five in 2020, seven in 2019, eight in 2017 and six in 2016. Of the nine left-handed batters, four (Carlie Henderson, Kylee Gleason, Haley Simpson and Aaliyah White) are listed as slap hitters.
- 13 Georgia natives help make up the Gamecock roster. It's the most from any single state for the 2021 season. For comparison, Georgia has 14 on its 2021 roster while Georgia Tech has 17.

WE'RE PLAYING 56

- The SEC coaches have been together on their messaging since the fall they want to play 56 games this year.
- South Carolina is set for 34 home games, 15 road games and five neutral site games. In comparison, the Gamecocks had 28 games at Beckham Field in 2019, 14 road games and 15 neutrals.
- Carolina is scheduled to go to Chapel Hill, head coach Beverly Smith's alma mater, for the first time since 2017. The Gamecocks longest trip of the year, by miles, is College Station. Other road trips include Oxford, Gainesville and Lexington.
- Other notable schedule notes include an opening weekend tournament with at least two power five conference opponents for the first time since 2019 and the first time in Columbia during the Smith era. UCF returns to the schedule for the first time since 2015 and just the second time ever they'll be in Columbia. The one Gamecock fans everywhere at circling? The April 21 game against cLemson. The two teams were set to meet for the first time last year but now will get the chance this season.

UP THE MIDDLE

They don't have flashy nicknames. There aren't any colorful superstitions either, but South Carolina's senior middle infielders Kenzi Maguire and Mackenzie Boesel are among the most dynamic duos in college softball.

"Nope, I'm just 'Mack," Boesel said.

"My dad calls me 'mouse' because I looked like a rat as a baby," Maguire deadpanned. "My mom said I was the cutest thing ever, and that he couldn't call me 'rat,' so he called me 'mouse.' I'm not offended. I did look like a rat. No nicknames here. I'm just Kenzi. She's just 'Mack.' I'm not superstitious; I'm scarred. My brothers played allstars and my mother and her best friend kept a dead lizard for two weeks because my brothers' team kept winning. I don't have any dead lizards. I braid hair and chew gum."

South Carolina's team theme this year is "Linked," and the veteran middle infielders have certainly been that over the last several years, even if they came from different paths. Boesel was a gymnast as a youngster and grew up in California, while Maguire was a cheerleader from Florida. Gamecocks fans are thankful they found softball.

Individually, Maguire and Boesel have drawn comparisons to some of the all-time diamond greats for their outstanding work at their positions and going into their fourth season playing side by side at shortstop and second base, they're one of the best combinations in the country. Each has earned All-SEC honors in their careers. They rarely make errors and can make the impossible look routine.

"It's really helpful, and it's really rare that two people get to play so closely together for four years," Boesel said. "It's like I can read her mind, and I know what she's going to do. I know when a ball is hit to her, how she's going to throw it and where it's going to be. We have that bond where we know how each other plays. We just sort of read each other's minds on how the other is going to play and how they think in different situations."

"I think we've been successful because we have played next to each other every day for so long," Maguire said. "We just have that interaction where I know what she is going to do before she does it, and she knows what I'm going to do before I do it. It's really fun. We'll just laugh because I'll do this flip where she can't see the ball, but she'll say, 'I knew it was coming, so it's fine!"

THIS NEW CLASS... IT'S A 10/10!

- South Carolina will have 10 newcomers on the 2021 roster. The group (Maddie Gallagher, Carlie Henderson, Kylee Gleason, Zoe Laneaux, Aaliyah White, Skylar Trahan, Leah Powell, Carly Robbins, Riley Blampied and Chooch Carroll) bring a mix of power and speed to the plate and plenty of versatility defensively.
- Two newcomers (Gallagher and Blampied) bring national team experience with them after playing on the gold winning U-17 squad this past summer.
- The freshmen class is comprised of five infielders, two outfielders, two pitchers and one catcher.
- Majors in the group include pre-business (Gallagher), retailing (Henderson, Laneaux, Trahan, Powell, Blampied and Carroll), exercise science (Gleason), cardiovascular technology (White) and biological science (Robbins).

GUESS WHO'S BACK. BACK AGAIN. GO TELL A FRIEND

- They aren't Slim Shady... but the four 2020 Carolina seniors are back to finish what they started in 2021. Cayla Drotar, Lauren Stewart, Kenzi Maguire and Mackenzie Boesel all announced over the summer they'd be returning.
- With their return, nine of the top-10 individual batting averages from the 2020 season will return for this upcoming year. The returning pitching staff of Bailey Betenbaugh, Drotar, Kelsey Oh and Rachel Vaughan bring back 12 of Carolina's 17 wins in 2020 (71 percent) and its lone SEC winner in the circle last year (Ochs).
- As a team, Carolina brings back 85 percent of its 2020 runs scored, 86 percent of its hits, 83 percent of its doubles, 85 percent of its home runs and 87 percent of its RBI.
- Boesel returns looking to secure her spot as one of the all-time greats at Carolina. She comes into her final season as one of just five Gamecocks ever to be in the top-10 for 10 or more career offensive records and is on pace to break many of them. Off the field, she's also a threetime Academic All-American.

THAT'S... INTERESTING!

- South Carolina will have at least one student-athlete on from the state of California for the 26th-consecutive year dating back to 1994 in 2021. With a signing class that includes two more (Marissa Gonzalez and Emma Sellers), the streak could continue on for three decades.
- Kenzi Maguire's 2021 season will be her sixth season in Columbia, meaning she's been here for more than half of the Beverly Smith era (11 years).
- Carlie Henderson won't be the first in her family to achieve at a high level in sports. Her grandpa, Billy Shaw, played football at Georgia Tech and went on to play offensive line for nine years with the Buffalo Bills before being inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 1999. Her father, Chip, played baseball at Shorter University and has been the baseball head coach at Calhoun High School for 26 years. He's won more than 600 games with three state titles (and had eight players drafted into MLB).
- Maddie Gallagher has actually played for one of her teammates. Maguire was her assistant coach this past year on Gallagher's travel ball team. The team was coached by Maguire's dad, Kevin, and was based out of Tampa, Fla., even though Gallagher lived in Port Washington, N.Y.

MUST WIN AT HOME! AND THE GAMECOCKS DO

- South Carolina is 193-89 (.665) at home during the Beverly Smith era, which does not include a 4-1 record at home while hosting a regional at Carolina Softball Stadium at Beckham Field.
- The Gamecocks have lost more than 10 games at home in a single season just three times in her ten years.
- Carolina has finished .500 or better at home seven of Beverly Smith's ten years.
- South Carolina has not lost double digit games at home in seven years and has won 20 or more six of the past seven seasons (2020 included).

NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS IS NOTHING NEW FOR SC

- South Carolina is 198-51 (.780) over the past eight years in games outside the SEC. Notable wins include Texas, Penn State, Houston, Arizona State, North Carolina, Florida State, California, Virginia Tech, USF, Long Beach State, Hofstra and Liberty.
- The 198 wins are notable because they account for 64 percent of the Carolina wins during that time (yeah, it's really tough to win SEC games and of course there are more opportunities to win non-conference games. But still).
- This year Carolina is set for at least 27 more non-conference games.
- Carolina had won 26-straight non-conference games (regular season) before the loss to Texas Tech in the second weekend of the year.

CAROLINA HOSTS TOURNAMENTS... AND WINS A LOT

- Carolina is an amazing 32-1 over the past seven seasons in the Gamecock Invitational.
- The Gamecock pitching staff has shined in the tournaments. In the 33 games during that span, Carolina pitching staffs have allowed three or more runs nine times. On the flip side, nine games have ended as shutouts for South Carolina.
- Including the Carolina Classic and Black & Garnet Challenge the Gamecocks are 51-2 in their past 53 home tournament games. Carolina's other home tournament loss during that stretch, before Troy in 2020, came in a 4-1 loss to South Alabama way back in 2015.
- South Carolina went 4-0 in the Gamecock Invitational last season, outscoring teams 40-13.

GAMECOCKS VS. RANKED OPPONENTS

- South Carolina is 144-333-1 (.293) against opponents ranked in the NFCA top 25 since 1995.
- Broken down by site, the Gamecocks are 69-112 (.358) at home, 33-149 (.154) on the road and 43-71-1 (.407) in neutral-site outings.
- During the notable 2018 season, the Gamecocks went 8-14 against ranked teams, including an 8-1 record in home games. The Gamecocks notably swept Tennessee and Mississippi State in home series against ranked teams last year. The Gamecocks also took two of three games against Arkansas, as well.
- Last season, the Gamecocks went 2-5 against ranked foes with wins over Michigan and Georgia.

KRUPIT AROUND THE WORLD

South Carolina softball's Kassidy Krupit can wear a lot of different hats in terms of playing various positions around the infield. Before she wears the Garnet and Black of the Gamecocks for the first time, the sophomore transfer had the opportunity to don a different jersey as she played with the United States Junior Women's National Team this summer.

"Learning different cultures and playing softball at the highest level possible was the best part," Krupit said. "I started tearing up a little bit when I made the team. It hit me that it was the USA. I was excited at the trials, but when I made the team, there were a ton of emotions for me and my family. I was really happy.

"Putting on the jersey was cool. I just put it on and thought, this fits well. It was a feeling I had never felt before. It was such a great honor playing on that team, wearing those colors."

Mixed in with all that excitement was trying to decide where she would continue her college softball career after electing to transfer from Baylor where she hit .235 with 10 home runs and 29 RBI in a successful rookie campaign last spring. After accepting invitations to visit a few different schools, she decided South Carolina was the right choice for her career as a student-athlete and life after that.

"As soon as I visited, I knew this was where I had to be," Krupit said. "Coach Bev (Smith) is great. I trust her process, and I trust (Associate Head Coach Lisa Navas) Nav's process and (assistant) coach (Kaela) Jackson's process. I'm studying sports management, and I want to get into coaching, so this was the right fit for me."

With the decision made Krupit could focus on training camp with Team USA in Houston, Texas.

"The first week made me realize how much more I could grow," Krupit said. "Overall, this experience has made me a better player and a better teammate. It's a different group of people, and all the people on my team were the top players in the nation. Just being around them, you're going to learn a lot. I learned a lot of infield skills from our coaches, which helped me tremendously. They helped me a lot with my approach to hitting."

From there, the team went to Paris to take on the French, as well Japan's U-23 team. Then it was off to Ireland to play the Irish National Team.

"When I was younger, I rocked a skirt with cropped leggings," Oh said with a laugh and eye roll. "That was a bad one. Oh, and a glitter shirt that said 'brats' or something like that.

"Ever since I was really young, I would think about what clothes went together and what didn't go together. I always used to try to wear different things to middle school and cool headbands. I just really loved different things, and it was awesome to see what other people liked. What I like about fashion is the creativity. It's ever changing. You're always wearing clothes, so it impacts everyone's life in different ways."

Oh and recent South Carolina equestrian alumna Hanna Powers were among 21 students from a dozen universities around the country who went to the "Big Apple" earlier this month as the fashion world converged on New York City for the Spring 2020 Fashion Week. She recently took part in South Carolina's Beyond Sports Professional Development and Summer Internship Program, for which she interned with Granger Owings Clothiers in Columbia. Director of Student-Athlete Development Megan Stoltzfus presented the opportunity to go to New York, and the New Jersey native jumped at the chance.

"New York Fashion Week is something I've always wanted to attend because I lived so close to New York City, and I love fashion," Oh said. "Meeting the other students from all the universities was awesome because we had a chance to talk about our futures and what we love in the fashion industry.

What I'd love to do is trend forecasting, which mixes marketing and statistics. 2020 NOTABLES

- South Carolina finished the 2020 season with a 17-6 record after the season was cut short due to the Covid-19 pandemic. Softball was the last Gamecock Athletics event in the spring with its Mar. 11 2-0 win over Winthrop.
- Carolina had notable wins over Ohio State, Kansas, No. 8 Michigan and No. 13 Georgia.
- For the fourth-straight year, the Gamecocks closed the season ranked in the top-25 polls. They closed the season tied at No. 15 in the ESPN/ USA Softball rankings and No. 15 in the USA Today/NFCA Coaches Poll.
- Carolina has been ranked in every poll since Feb. 23, 2018. This marks the first time since 2001 it opened and closed back-to-back seasons ranked while the four-straight years having appeared in the final coaches poll of the season is the longest streak in program history dating back to 1995 when the NFCA Coaches Poll started.
- South Carolina had two Academic All-American selections (Mackenzie Boesel and Kenzi Maguire) for the just the second time in program history and first time since 1989.
- This marks the fourth-straight year the Gamecocks have had at least one Academic All-American, the longest streak in program history. Victoria Willaims (third team) started the streak in 2017.
- Boesel became the first student-athlete in program history to earn multiple first-team Academic All-America honors. She joined Ashley Smith (2003-06) as the only two Gamecocks with three Academic All-America honors.
- Speaking of Boesel, with a grand slam in Clearwater she is now responsible for 11 percent of all grand slams since 2011.
- South Carolina posted the 16th-best fielding percentage in the country in 2020 and the second-best in the SEC.
- The Gamecocks are one of six SEC teams to finish in the top-12 for national attendance each of the past five years.
- Newcomers Karsen Ochs and Bailey Betenbaugh stole the show during the Gamecock Invitational (Feb. 21-Feb. 23). After watching ace Kelsey Oh go down in the opening game against Boston College knowing Cayla Drotar was still out after an injury in the Clearwater Invitational the prior weekend, the freshmen pair posted a couple complete-game shutout performances against No. 8 Michigan (Ochs) and Elon (Betenbaugh). The Elon game was Betenbaugh's first career start.
- For her performance, Ochs was named the SEC Freshman of the Week on Feb. 24. Ochs was the first South Carolina freshman to receive the honor since 2019 and earned the 17th honor in program history.
- Prior to her season-ending injury, Kelsey Oh was named the SEC Pitcher of the Week on Feb. 10. It was Carolina first SEC Pitcher of the Week honor since Dixie Raley in 2019 while Oh became the 12th player in program history to earn the honor. Oh went 3-0 on the week with wins over Ohio State, Southern Illinois and UNCG with 22 strikeouts and just one extra-base hit allowed. It was her first SEC Pitcher of the Week selection.
- Carolina did not lose a game in which it scored more runs than the opposing team
- South Carolina celebrated 10 years under the direction of head coach Beverly Smith.
- Following the conclusion of the season, thanks to the NCAA's ruling, all four Carolina seniors (Mackenzie Boesel, Kenzi Maguire, Cayla Drotar and Lauren Stewart) all decided to come back for the 2021 season.
- South Carolina scored at least one run on every play where they hit a ball over the wall.

LET'S TALK ABOUT IT... WHAT A SEASON 2018 WAS

- 2018 will go down as one of the more special seasons in South Carolina softball history as the program reached its second ever super regional thanks to a 49-17 season. The 49 wins were the most under Beverly Smith and the most since 1999.
- You've probably heard the underdog story by now. The Gamecocks were picked to finish 12th in the SEC but chose not to listen, finishing 15-9 to take third. The 15 wins were the most in the Beverly Smith era and the most since winning 18 in 2003.
- Carolina had five players named to the All-SEC Teams (Kenzi Maguire, Mackenzie Boesel, Alyssa VanDerveer, Jana Johns and Kelsey Oh). The five overall recognitions were the most since the program also had five in 1997.
- Home was home sweet home for the Gamecocks as Carolina posted an impressive 29-3 record at Carolina Stadium. South Carolina outscored opponents 173-63 and posted a .983 fielding percentage.

THE GAMECOCKS ALL TIME - THE COACHES

- South Carolina is 1,571-842-7 in its 46 years of softball (2,427 games). 350 of those wins have come during the Beverly Smith era.
- The Gamecocks have had nine coaches during the program's history, starting with Vivian Hamilton in 1975. By far the longest tenured and winningest coach in program history was Joyce Compton.
- Compton coached from 1987-2010, winning 951 games (most in school history) with 182 conference wins and 13 NCAA Regional appearances.
- Smith and Compton are the only two who have stayed more than four years.

SOUTH CAROLINA HISTORICAL RECORD

- South Carolina has played 2,427 games in its softball history, going 1,571-842-7 (.647) in its 46 years of history.
- The Gamecocks have posted 30 or more wins each of the past seven full seasons under the direction of head coach Beverly Smith.
- Carolina has protected home well, also, with 20 or more coming in friendly confines each of the past six full years, not counting 2020 in the past two notes.
- The Gamecocks have posted a combined 67 conference wins over the last five years (including one in 2020, at Georgia, before the rest of the SEC slate was canceled).

HENDERSON FAMILY - LOTTA ATHLETES

For Carlie Henderson, playing sports is in her blood. The South Carolina softball freshman outfielder from Calhoun, Ga., is the daughter of an outstanding high school baseball coach and the granddaughter of a member of the NFL Hall of Fame.

"I guess you could say I'm a product of my environment," said Henderson, who is studying retail with a minor in biology. "I tried to just be sponge and soak in all the information that my grandfather and my dad and my sister (Cassie) taught me growing up. I wouldn't have it any other way. I'm proud to be a coach's kid. Nothing comes easy, and nothing is given to you. I wouldn't trade it for the world.

"As long as I can remember, I've been at the ball field. I think it has shaped me into who I am today."

Her grandfather, Billy Shaw, played football at Georgia Tech, went on to play offensive line for nine years with the Buffalo Bills, and he was inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 1999. Her father, Chip, played baseball at Shorter University in Rome, Ga., and has been the head the baseball coach at Calhoun County High School for 26 years, where he has won more than 600 games, captured three state titles, and has had eight players selected in the Major League Baseball draft. Her older sister plays softball at West Georgia, where she is a senior.

While she didn't necessarily feel pressure to be great in sports, the coach's kid learned to compete and prepare the right way.

"I've been a part of some huge wins and huge losses, not just with my team, but with my dad," Henderson said. "It has taught me that there is more to it than just winning and losing. It's how you handle those wins and losses and how you come back from adversity.

"My dad didn't cut me any slack growing up. He was very hard on me, maybe harder on me than his baseball boys, but there wasn't any pressure. He wanted me to follow my dreams, and my family supported me in whatever I did. It would have been OK with my parents if we didn't play sports, but I'm a product of my environment, and we love it!"

Henderson also competed in basketball and track growing up. Having an older sibling who was competitive was a big factor in her development as well and helped lead her to playing at the highest level in college athletics.

- It's no secret at this point, legendary coach Dawn Staley is a fan of the softball program, having traveled to numerous road games over the years and making it to plenty of home games.
- Softball head coach Beverly Smith returns the love by doing the same, cause that's what friends do right? The two even used live down the street from each other, as well.
- And of course, Champ Staley (Coach Staley's dog) can be found at plenty of softball games supporting the softball program.
- Best friendship in sports? We won't argue with that.

SOUTH CAROLINA STAFF HAS TOP CREDENTIALS

- South Carolina head coach Beverly Smith has been a part of 15 NCAA Tournament teams as a coach (eight at UNC and seven at Carolina).
- Associate head coach Lisa Navas has been to 10 NCAA Tournaments as an assistant coach (seven at Carolina. two at UNC and one at Missouri) and eight as a head coach (six Division II at Barry, two at NC State).
- Carolina added hitting coach Kaela Jackson to the staff in 2019.
 Jackson joined the Gamecocks from Michigan State before her playing days at South Carolina for head coach Beverly Smith.
- Volunteer assistant Heather Gelbard joined the Gamecocks last season from FIU. Gelbard will be the third coach on staff with head coaching experience with stops at FIU and UMBC (three years total).

BETTER LOOK INTO BOESEL

- Hit .317 in 23 games with 23 starts in 2020 before returning for one more "full" senior season. Brought home 11 runs while scoring 17 of her own with a .500 slugging percentage and .475 on-base percentage.
- Tied the career mark for grand slams during the Beverly Smith era (3) with a monster grand slam against Virginia Tech in Clearwater on Feb. 14
- Named a CoSIDA Academic All-American for the third-straight year in 2020 and selected to the first team for the second-straight year. In during so, she became the first in program history to earn multiple first team selections and just the second ever with three Academic All-America honors.
- Career record watches include: Runs, doubles, home runs, total bases, slugging percentage, RBI, walks.

BETTER LOOK INTO MAGUIRE

- Finished the shortened 2020 season with 20 hits, 22 runs and 2 home runs. Hit a career best at .328. in 23 games and started all 23 of them, always at shortstop. She returns in 2021 as a graduate player.
- Is just two hit by pitches away from tying the school record (60) for a career.
- Had a 41-game reached base streak, dating back to 2019, until it was snapped Mar. 11 against Winthrop.
- Named a CoSIDA Academic All-American for the first time in her career.

BETTER LOOK INTO OH

- In 2020, went 4-2 with a 2.14 ERA in 32.2 innings of work.
- Pitched three complete games and one shutout.
- In her seven appearances last season, she allowed just 24 hits with 10 earned runs. Had an impressive 51/16 strikeout-to-walk ratio.
- In the season opener against Ohio State, she went all seven innings with two allowed runs and eight strikeouts to help Carolina to a 3-2 victory. On Feb. 10, she was named SEC Pitcher of the Week for the first time in her career.

BETTER LOOK INTO OWENS

- Had an impressive sophomore season in 2020 with the second-best Carolina batting average in the shortened season at .340 in 21 games with 19 starts. Notably had 17 hits with 10 runs, 10 RBI and a .389 on-base percentage.
- Team-best six multi-hit games and four multi-RBI contests.
- Career bests in slugging percentage at .560 and in home runs with three on the season.
- Moved to left field for the first time in her career and recorded a perfect fielding percentage in 31 chances in the shortened season.

BETTER LOOK INTO ALYSSA KUMIYAMA

- Did not play due to injury in 2020.
- Hit .346 in 35 games of action in 2019 as a sophomore with 27 starts. Of her 28 hits that season, 14 went for extra bases. Produced with 34 RBI and slugged .765. Went on to be named to the third-team AII-Region squad for the first time in her career.
- Opened her Gamecock career as a freshman in 2018 with 58 games and 36 starts. Hit .235 with 10 home runs and 38 RBI to go along with her .529 slugging percentage.
- Sister, Hannah, plays on the team.

FRIENDSHIP FRIDAY

Building team chemistry doesn't happen overnight, and South Carolina softball coach Beverly Smith is taking time out of practice for weekly one-on-one conversations in what has become known as Friendship Friday. The aim is to build personal relationships and allows the players and coaches to get a better understanding of who they all are as individuals and how their past experiences shape who they are today.

"At the end of the day, you're building the relationship," Smith said. "It's easier to correct or direct someone when you have a foundation of a relationship. Relationships don't happen just because you wear the same uniform. It's something intentional that we do to get them to have face to face conversation with eye contact and communication that's not on a cell phone or computer screen. It's really direct.

"To be a high performing team, there has to be a level of trust. I think this is a group activity that will build that muscle of trust. We talk about how we are going to have to solve hard problems together, and to be able to do that, we have to be able to communicate and trust each other. It doesn't mean that it's always going to be 'sing-song, we all get along.' That's not reality. We are going to have bumps in the road, so how are we going to handle it, have these honest conversations and work through the hard times together?"

Each student-athlete and coach is paired up with another member of the team, and the tandems go somewhere in the softball facility to chat with their partner about a specific question.

"We put the question on the board, and you have a six-minute conversation with your partner," Smith explained. "Coaches are included. We have it on a grid, so every Friday you meet with four people on the team. We come back after six minutes and then the next question goes up and you go with the next partner. We're doing it for seven weeks, so by the end you'll have met with everybody on the team with a detailed prompt or question."

"It can be a little hard to open up sometimes, but that's the whole point of this," said senior Mackenzie Boesel. "As an upperclassman, I try to start the conversation and be vulnerable with my younger teammates so they can feel comfortable doing it as well. Getting to know them on a personal level outside of softball helps us understand how they are on and off the field and how we can help them during a game and what their personality is. It helps us connect as teammates, and that will translate on the field."

BETTER LOOK INTO STEWART

- Hit .315 in 23 games with 23 starts in centerfield. Stewart showed her power at the plate with a team-best 23 hits and 17 runs in the shortened season. Recorded 10 RBI, a home run, triple and four doubles. She had five multi-hit games and three multi-RBI competitions.
- Proved her speed on the bases going 4-for-5 on stolen base attempts. She finished the season with a 17-game reached base streak.
- Finished a perfect 1.000 in 21 chances on the field.
- In 2019, had a (Carolina) career-best in at-bats, runs, hits, doubles, triples, home runs, RBI, total bases, slugging percentage, walks, hit by pitches, on-base percentage, stolen bases, putouts and assists.

BETTER LOOK INTO PREBBLE

- Opened the season strong with a home run in the first game of the year against Ohio State on Feb. 7 in a 3-2 win. Not long after, she launched her first Gamecock grand slam on Feb. 19 in a 19-1 (5) win over NC Central. She had seven extra-base hits, six of which were home runs, on the season.
- Hit career best .302 in 22 games with 22 starts and 63 at bats.
- Also had career bests with a .603 slugging percentage, six home runs, 25 RBI, six hit by pitches and a .366 on base percentage.

BETTER LOOK INTO GALLAGHER

- Prior to Carolina, Maddie Gallagher never hit below .549 in her high school career for a season. Her highest mark of .638 came in 2018 with 37 hits.
- The freshman from Port Washington, New York Had 51 extra-base hits, 15 of which were home runs, in her career. She brought home 52 career runs while scoring 86 herself.
- Selected to the 2019 Team USA 17U squad that played in, and won, the Pan American Games in Colombia.
- She was the 2019 Nassau County Player of the Year and was a twotime All-State selection.

BETTER LOOK INTO WHITE

- South Carolinian Aaliyah White stood out at Grayson High School as a four-year letter winner.
- Showed impressive speed on the bases with 172 stolen bases in four years, averaging 43 a year. In 2017, she stole 53 bases which was the most in a single season in her high school's history. She also holds the career stolen bases record ar her high school.
- Never hit below .443, including a .485 mark her sophomore year on 40 hits.
- In 2016, she scored her school's most runs (33) and was named to the First-Team All-Region and All-County squads.

BETTER LOOK INTO OCHS

- Made her Carolina debut with a 5-3 record and 3.18 ERA in 39.2 innings of work. In her second career game, she pitched all seven innings against No. 8 Michigan in a complete-game shutout, allowing just two hits. Tossed four complete games in the shortened season.
- Recorded one save and finished with an impressive 30 strikeouts.
- Helped Carolina to a 4-2 win with nine strikeouts in her first SEC appearance over No. 13 Georgia.
- Named SEC Freshman of the Week on Feb. 24.

CAROLINA RUNS THIS STATE

- Under the direction of head coach Beverly Smith, Carolina owns a 66-7 mark against other Palmetto State schools.
- That mark includes a 31-game winning streak that stretched over five seasons before Coastal snapped the incredible streak three seasons ago on April 11.
- South Carolina went 2-0 last season against in-state foes, outscoring them 12-2.
- Carolina is set to face in-state opponents eight times this season, including the first-ever meeting with rival cLemson on April 21 in Columbia.

COACH KENZI AND MADDIE GALLAGHER

Kenzi Maguire has made a career of spectacular plays with her whip-like, sidearm delivery on the softball diamond. Now South Carolina's redshirt senior shortstop has a protégé in freshman infielder Maddie Gallagher, who became a pupil when Maguire helped coach her travel ball team in Florida.

"I just knew she would be a role model for me, and it would be good to be under her wing so I could be where Kenzi is one day," Gallagher said.

Gallagher, who is from Port Washington, New York, had been impressed with the travel ball team in Tampa that was coached by Maguire's father, Kevin, several years ago and decided to make the commitment to play with them. Maguire was assisting her father during the summer and began to show Gallagher her unique delivery.

"I had met a bunch of my future (travel ball) teammates at a UF (University of Florida) camp," Gallagher said. "We just hit it off, and I wanted to be seen more by SEC coaches. I thought the Tampa team would give me more of an opportunity to do so. I didn't know Kenzi would be helping out."

"I wasn't really that big of a part of the team when she first joined," Maguire said. "She was already on the team when I met her. I was more like a defensive coach and the mental coach. I think I was more like a big sister than a coach. We had a lot of fun. I just tried to teach them everything that I know because defense is my favorite. I pride myself on defense."

Maguire has been featured in ESPN's top plays more than once in her career, and Gallagher is showing a lot of promise after an outstanding high school career. She was the 2019 Nassau County Player of the Year, a two-time high school All-American, and was selected to the United States 17-U National Team that won the Pan American Games. Even with the accolades, she thought she could get better.

"Obviously, it's very different," Gallagher said of the throwing style. "I've watched Kenzi play several times, and I've seen how fast she gets rid of the ball. It obviously works, so I was willing to do anything I could to get those 2.5 and 2.6 slappers out. When I first started, I could not reach first base. It took a lot of reps, and I got really used to it. It's second nature now."

"She didn't throw like me at first, but she does now," Maguire said with a smile of satisfaction. "My dad and I both worked long hours with the girls to try to get them to throw like me. It takes a lot of practice."

SOME OF THE GREATS THAT HAVE COME THROUGH

- Trinity Johnson: 2004 Carolina Hall of Fame inductee, three-time All-American, 1996-97 Honda Award for Softball Player of the Year (the first Honda award winner for any sport at Carolina). She recently became the first Gamecock in program history to have her jersey retired. (Jersey was retired on the Saturday of the Alabama series in 2019).
- Tiffany Tootle: Three-time All-American, Led the nation in hits and runs in 1992 and 1993, one of four three-time All-Americans in school history. Was inducted into the UofSC Hall of Fame in 2006 and was the second to receive the honor.
- Megan Matthews Buning: 1999 NFCA All-American, led the nation in saves in 2000, two All-SEC nods and the 2000 SEC Tournament MVP award. Notably calls home games on the SEC Network + for the Gamecocks
- Darleen Lowery was a 2014 UofSC Hall of Fame inductee after a career in which she was named a two-time All-American. Notably led the nation with 9.49 strikeouts per seven innings in 1987.

WOMEN AT SOUTH CAROLINA: THEY RUN THINGS, Y'ALL

- South Carolina athletics has had plenty of high points to talk about with women's sports since athletics director Ray Tanner took over in 2012. Since that time, women's teams have posted 164 All-Americans, 232 All-Conference selections, 30 different national honors, eight national championships, 14 Conference Championships, seven conference tournament championships, finished the season ranked 50 different times and reached the postseason 63 times (11 teams).
- The past five years have been equally impressive with 103 All-Americans, 167 All-Conference selections, 21 national awards, four national championships 12 conference championships, five conference tournament championships, finished ranked 40 times and reached the post-season 47 times.
- Last year alone Carolina's women's teams had 24 All-Americans, 35 All-Conference selections, seven different national awards, nine conference awards, two national championships, two conference championships, one conference tournament championship, finished ranked 11 times and reached the postseason 10 times.
- Category leaders since 2012 include: Track and Field with 93 All-Americans, 63 All-SEC Selections, Women's Tennis with 15 national awards, Equestrian with 37 conference awards, Track and Field with six national championships, Swimming and Diving with five conference championships, Women's Basketball with four conference tournament championships, Women's Golf along with Equestrian and Basketball with seven seasons finishing ranked and Track and Field with eight postseason trips.

STEWART IS BACK

Lauren Stewart always seems to be smiling. South Carolina's redshirt senior outfielder has seen the highs and lows each year of her collegiate career, but patience has paid off as a reliance on her faith and a solid personal support system within the team and at home helped her become a big part of the Gamecocks' success in 2019.

"My mindset over the summer was that I was going to come back better than I've ever been and this is going to the best season I've ever had," Stewart said.

The Alpharetta, Ga., native began her college career at Purdue where she started every game as a freshman, batted .306, and led the team in runs and doubles while ranking seventh in the Big 10 Conference with 18 stolen bases. While things seemed to be going well, a desire to be closer to home led Stewart to transfer to South Carolina.

"I definitely loved Purdue. I loved the school, the atmosphere and the softball team," Steward said. "I just figured that a new place was going to be best for me. As soon as I visited South Carolina, I knew there was definitely something there for me. With it being closer to home, and it being in a big conference with the SEC, I knew it was going to be a great fit.

"The best part about being here at South Carolina is the culture of all the sports, the fans in the community, and how we have such a big impact on not only people who come to our games and the little girls that see us and look up to us, but on the community as a whole and how this university is represented."


Stewart didn't recapture the same individual on-field success initially with the Gamecocks. Although South Carolina was an NCAA Tournament team in 2017, Stewart played more of a reserve role, playing in 50 games with 11 starts in the outfield while being used primarily as a pinch runner and defensive replacement. She went 2-for-14 in limited plate appearances, but Stewart stayed patient and wasn't worried.

"It was definitely mentally challenging, but I wanted to be the best teammate possible," Stewart said. "I tried not to focus on things I couldn't control. I was just trying to be prepared for when my name was called and tried to stay as positive as possible. I was still only a sophomore, and while I do have very high expectations for myself, I knew that the team still needed me. So, I tried to focus more on the team. It drove me to keep working, and I tried to focus on what I could bring to the table, whether it was my speed, my hitting, or my play in the out-field


- South Carolina has worn more than 20 different uniform combinations during the past four years based solely on jersey, pants and socks/stirrups.
