South Carolina has seen its star rise again in the collegiate softball world, and head coach Beverly Smith has guided that process since arriving as head coach in July of 2010. She oversees all aspects of the program and works most closely on the field with the pitchers. As a head coach, Smith became only the second Gamecock softball coach with over 300 career wins.

in 2021, the Gamecocks finished the season 26-26, defeating Auburn in the first round of the SEC Tournament.

From 2013-19, Smith guided the Gamecocks to a program record seven-consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances. Carolina was well on its way to its eighth-consecutive postseason trip in 2020 before the season was ended early due to the COVID-19 Pandemic.

The Gamecocks have competed in the regional championship four-consecutive completed seasons (also a program record), while the 2018 team reached the program's second-ever super regional.

Carolina closed the 2020 season with a 17-6 record after the season was cut short due to the COVID-19 Pandemic. In the shortened season, the Gamecocks recorded wins over Ohio State, Kansas, No. 8 Michigan, Iowa State and No. 13 Georgia, among others. Haley Simpson led the way with a .353 batting average while Kenzi Maguire posted a team-best 20 hits. Katie Prebble had a team-high six home runs and 25 RBI. In the circle, Karsen Ochs posted an SC-best five wins while Kelsey Oh led the pitching staff with 51 strikeouts in 32.2 innings of work.

South Carolina finished the 2019 season with a respectable 38-19 record and reached its fourth-straight regional final under Smith. Under her leadership, the Gamecocks have now won 30 or more games each of the past seven years, the first time the program has done so since 2002 when it had 16-straight years of 30 or more-win seasons. South Carolina notably had a 15-game winning streak for the second-consecutive season, marking the first time since the 1996 and 1997 seasons the program won 10-straight games (or more) in back-to-back years. Smith earned her 300th career win as head coach at South Carolina in a 5-4 victory over Duke on March 20, 2019. The Gamecocks earned back-to-back series wins over Alabama and Auburn, becoming just the third team in the conference since 2005 to do so (11 chances). Carolina outscored the two rivals 30-20 over the two weekends with eight home runs. It was the first time since 2009 Carolina took the series over Alabama. Another notable streak continued in 2019 as the Gamecocks have had more than 30,000 fans come to Carolina Stadium for the past six-consecutive years. Carolina tied the program record for largest single-game crowd against Alabama with 2,250 which was previously set in 1997.

Many Gamecocks have broken out with their hard work under the watchful eye of Smith and her coaching staff. The 2018 leaders proved to be Mackenzie Boesel at the plate and Cayla Drotar in the circle. For the second-straight season, Boesel led the Gamecocks in nine different offensive categories (at bats, on-base percentage, hits, triples, batting average, runs, total bases, RBI and slugging percentage) while she paced the Gamecocks in two categories (doubles and walks) for the first time in her career. In the circle Drotar led the Gamecocks with 21 wins, becoming the first 20-game winner since 2015 and just the second in the past 16 years at Carolina. Drotar became the first pitcher not named Jessica Elliott or Nickie Blue to lead the team in innings pitched and wins since 2013. In league honors the Gamecocks had two players (Maguire and Tiara Duffy) named SEC Player of the Week while Johns became the first freshman in program history to be named SEC Freshman of the Week twice.

Prior to coming to South Carolina, Smith served as the top assistant at North Carolina, working mostly with the pitchers and catchers. The final three years, she was the associate head coach after nine as an assistant. Smith helped the Tar Heels to two Atlantic Coast Conference titles in 2001 and 2008 and eight of their nine NCAA Tournament appearances. She served as the lead recruiter for the Tar Heels during that time, helping to bring in five All-Americans into the UNC program. She also helped North Carolina achieve a top-25 ranking in the USA Today/NFCA Coaches Poll at least once per season from 2006-10.

CAROLINA SOFTBALL IS FUELED TO BOUNCE BACK IN 2022

After missing the postseason last year for the first time since 2012, South Carolina softball looks to stay healthy and bounce back in 2022.

"It was tough to end the season and not make the NCAA Tournament," said head coach Beverly Smith, who enters her 12th season with the Gamecocks after a 26-26 overall record last year. "A lot of the forecasting had us in, and I think we were one of the last ones out. It's been fuel for the returners. The student-athletes that were in that room don't want to feel that again. It has offered a very renewed focus for us at practice. It's something that has really been fuel for us to get better."

Injuries to the pitching staff created some challenges last year, but with six of seven pitchers back in 2022, As a new season gets started this weekend, Smith will rely on experience to make an impact in the circle.

"I think having nearly the entire staff return from last year is a positive for us," Smith said. "They've all worked hard. (Jr.) Karsen Ochs (3-3, 4.60 ERA) has come out and really made strides in the fall. Her work ethic and focus has been really dialed in, and she is one of those who doesn't want a repeat of last season. She is someone looking to make this year different. Her focused energy is in the right direction.

"After some injuries the last couple of years, I think we all know what a healthy (Gr.) Kelsey Oh (3-7, 4.12 ERA) looks like. (So.) Leah Powell (10-7, 2.76 ERA) had some great innings for us last year, and she won't sneak up on anybody this year. If they continue to work as hard as they did in the fall, we have a lot of nice options in the spring."

The Gamecocks also return junior Bailey Betenbaugh (5-0, 2.18 ER), senior Rachel Vaughan (2-2, 4.35 ERA), and sophomore Skylar Trahan.

"Rachel Vaughan has done a great job," Smith said. "She has taken on the responsibility of ensuring our success. She looks out for everybody on the team. I think she is going to do a great job helping as a leader."

Perhaps the biggest question to be answered is who will make up the middle infield following the matriculation of graduate shortstop Kenzi Maguire (.427, 3 HR, 38 RBI) and second baseman Mackenzie Boesel (.416, 6 HR, 37 RBI), who both earned All-SEC and All-Region honors, with Boesel also earning Third Team All-American accolades.

THIS IS CAROLINA - TRADITION LIVES HERE

- South Carolina softball has made 22 trips to the postseason, a number that started in 1982. The Gamecocks have reached two super regionals and three WCWS. In conference play, Carolina owns two SEC Championships.
- Carolina rolls into the 2022 season with a 45-48 record all-time in postseason games and a 14-15 mark under Beverly Smith.
- Fans and opponents have become accustomed to seeing the Gamecocks play on Sundays in the postseason. Carolina had reached the regional final four-straight years (2016-19). The Gamecocks are 2-3 in those past five Sunday games.
- Since 1982, the Gamecocks are just 2-11 against host schools and 0-7 under Smith. On the flip side, South Carolina is 4-2 at home in the postseason under Smith having advanced to just the program's second super regional in 2018 with two win-or-go-home games against Liberty.

THE GAMECOCKS

- South Carolina comes into the 2022 season looking to rebound from a 2021 season that saw them miss the postseason for the first time in seven seasons.
- The Gamecocks earned an SEC Tournament victory over Auburn before falling to #16 LSU in the second round.
- Carolina will have a young roster this season, featuring 12 underclassmen (seven sophomores and five freshmen).
- The Gamecocks welcome five freshmen to the program (Olivia Cook, Giulia Desiderio, Natalie Heath, Marissa Gonzalez, Emma Sellers).
- Carolina will have seven left-handed batters available in the lineup. It had nine in 2021, five in 2020, seven in 2019, eight in 2017 and six in 2016. Of the seven left-handed batters, three (Carlie Henderson, Haley Simpson and Aaliyah White) are listed as slap hitters.
- 12 Georgia natives help make up the Gamecock roster. It's the most from any single state. For comparison, Georgia also has 12 on its roster.

THAT'S...INTERESTING!

- South Carolina and Auburn played two extra inning games during their SEC series. Saturday's game went 11 innings, while Monday's went 10 innings. They are the only two teams in Division I to play 10 innings or more in a series. Only six other games this season in Division I have gone more than 11 innings. Only 12 teams in Division I have played two games of 10-or more innings this season.
- South Carolina will have at least one student-athlete on from the state of California for the 26th-consecutive year dating back to 1994 in 2022. Freshmen and California natives Marissa Gonzalez and Emma Sellers could continue on for three decades.
- Carlie Henderson won't be the first in her family to achieve at a high level in sports. Her grandpa, Billy Shaw, played football at Georgia Tech and went on to play offensive line for nine years with the Buffalo Bills before being inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 1999. Her father, Chip, played baseball at Shorter University and has been the baseball head coach at Calhoun High School for 26 years. He's won more than 600 games with three state titles (and had eight players drafted into MLB).
- Maddie Gallagher and Giulia Desiderio have actually played for new volunteer assistant coach Kevin Maguire before. Their travel ball team was coached by Maguire and was based out of Tampa, Fla., even though Gallagher lived in Port Washington, N.Y.
- Katie Prebble sits in the top-50 of active Division I players in three different categories.

IT'S GOOD TO BE HOME

• For the second straight season, South Carolina is set for 34 home games. Carolina will host the Gamecock Invitational, Carolina Classic, and Garnet and Black Round Robin. They will play just six non-conference road games and six neutral site games. The schedule also includes 12 road SEC games

IF YOU BUILD IT, THEY WILL COME

- South Carolina is 212-104 (.671) at home during the Beverly Smith era, which includes a 4-1 record at home while hosting a regional at Carolina Softball Stadium at Beckham Field.
- The Gamecocks have lost more than 10 games at home in a single season just four times in her 11 years.
- Carolina has finished .500 or better at home seven of Beverly Smith's ten years.
- Prior to 2021, South Carolina had not lost double digit games at home in seven years and has won 20 or more six of the past seven seasons (2020 included).

NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS IS NOTHING NEW FOR SC

- South Carolina is 215-57 (.790) over the past eight years in games outside the SEC. Notable wins include Texas, Penn State, Houston, Arizona State, North Carolina, Florida State, California, Virginia Tech, USF, Long Beach State, Hofstra, Liberty, and UCF.
- Carolina had won 26-straight non-conference games (regular season) before a loss to Texas Tech in the second weekend of the 2020 season.

CAROLINA HOSTS TOURNAMENTS... AND WINS A LOT

- Carolina is an amazing 35-5 over the past seven seasons in the Gamecock Invitational. The 2021 tournament was canceled due to weather.
- The Gamecock pitching staff has shined in the tournaments. In the 33 games during that span, Carolina pitching staffs have allowed three or more runs 12 times. On the flip side, nine games have ended as shutouts for South Carolina.
- Including the Carolina Classic and Black & Garnet Challenge, the Gamecocks are 54-6 in their past 57 home tournament games. Carolina's other home tournament loss during that stretch, before North Carolina this season, were Troy in 2020 and South Alabama back in 2015.

GAMECOCKS VS. RANKED OPPONENTS

- South Carolina is 149-351-1 (.298) against opponents ranked in the NFCA top 25 since 1995.
- Broken down by site, the Gamecocks are 71-121 (.370) at home, 36-157 (.187) on the road and 43-72-1 (.375) in neutral-site outings.
- In 2021, the Gamecocks went 4-17 against ranked opponents. Earning victories over #3 Florida, #16 Tennessee, and two against #20 UCF.

HANG IT ON THE WALL

- South Carolina's all-time winningest coach Joyce Compton, will have her jersey retired in a ceremony prior to Ole Miss game on Saturday, April 23.
- A legendary figure in the softball world, Joyce Compton retired following the 2010 season after 24 years at the University of South Carolina, while helping take the program to the Women's College World Series twice and to NCAA tournaments on 13 occasions. Three times her teams won an NCAA regional.
- Compton's jersey will be unveiled on the outfield wall at Carolina Softball Stadium at Beckham Field. She will become the second to have her jersey retired, joining her former student-athlete and Gamecock great Trinity Johnson who had her jersey retired in 2019.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS FOR SOFTBALL'S KELSEY OH

South Carolina softball graduate student Kelsey Oh has unfinished business, on and off the field. Oh is continuing her education and has nearly completed requirements for her master's degree, while also taking advantage of one more year of eligibility on the diamond. Between the COVID-19 pandemic taking away one season, for which student-athletes were later granted an extra year of eligibility, as well as overcoming a rash of injuries that have interrupted a promising career, the elder stateswoman on the roster is excited for what lies ahead.

"It's a lot to juggle, but it's also an amazing challenge," said Oh, who is 23 and in her fifth year at South Carolina after double majoring in marketing and management to earn a business administration degree last spring. "We have an amazing program with the Masters of International Business program, which is ranked among the best in the world, and I truly couldn't imagine not playing sports because I've played it so long. It's kind of a balancer in my life. Being a student-athlete has taught me to never back down from a challenge."

Oh has had her share of struggles. After a remarkable freshman year, she missed parts of two other seasons due to two separate ankle injuries, including having Lisfranc surgery in year three.

"That took about a year to come back from, so I still was not 100 percent healthy in coming back from that last year," Oh said. "Dealing with all those obstacles was one of the hardest mental things I've done. It breaks you down. Coach Bev (Smith) helped so much, and I feel like what doesn't kill you, makes you stronger."

Oh credits constant communication with her parents in helping her stay focused, in addition to the medical personnel on campus.

Time management is a key element in finding success as student-athlete with the demands of a sport and class requirements. Graduate classes don't make it any easier.

"Grad school classes are a lot harder and a lot longer, but I also love them a lot more so I want to devote all the time I can do read and research more," said Oh, who will finish her masters class work this spring before moving to Paris, France, to complete her Master of Management program there. "I'm looking to specialize in marketing manager/sustainability there."

Despite getting knocked down a few times in her career, she is ready to get back up and tackle the challenges that come up in the classroom and on the field.

HENDERSON FAMILY - LOTTA ATHLETES

For Carlie Henderson, playing sports is in her blood. The South Carolina softball freshman outfielder from Calhoun, Ga., is the daughter of an outstanding high school baseball coach and the granddaughter of a member of the NFL Hall of Fame

"I guess you could say I'm a product of my environment," said Henderson, who is studying retail with a minor in biology. "I tried to just be sponge and soak in all the information that my grandfather and my dad and my sister (Cassie) taught me growing up. I wouldn't have it any other way. I'm proud to be a coach's kid. Nothing comes easy, and nothing is given to you. I wouldn't trade it for the world.

"As long as I can remember, I've been at the ball field. I think it has shaped me into who I am today."

Her grandfather, Billy Shaw, played football at Georgia Tech, went on to play offensive line for nine years with the Buffalo Bills, and he was inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 1999. Her father, Chip, played baseball at Shorter University in Rome, Ga., and has been the head the baseball coach at Calhoun County High School for 26 years, where he has won more than 600 games, captured three state titles, and has had eight players selected in the Major League Baseball draft. Her older sister plays softball at West Georgia, where she is a senior.

While she didn't necessarily feel pressure to be great in sports, the coach's kid learned to compete and prepare the right way.

"I've been a part of some huge wins and huge losses, not just with my team, but with my dad," Henderson said. "It has taught me that there is more to it than just winning and losing. It's how you handle those wins and losses and how you come back from adversity.

"My dad didn't cut me any slack growing up. He was very hard on me, maybe harder on me than his baseball boys, but there wasn't any pressure. He wanted me to follow my dreams, and my family supported me in whatever I did. It would have been OK with my parents if we didn't play sports, but I'm a product of my environment, and we love it!"

Henderson also competed in basketball and track growing up. Having an older sibling who was competitive was a big factor in her development as well and helped lead her to playing at the highest level in college athletics.

DAWN STALEY AND THE GAMECOCKS

- It's no secret at this point, legendary coach Dawn Staley is a fan of the soft-ball program, having traveled to numerous road games over the years and making it to plenty of home games.
- Staley threw out the ceremonial first pitch during the Gamecock's Title IX 50th anniversary game on March 12 against Georgia.
- Softball head coach Beverly Smith returns the love by doing the same, cause that's what friends do right? The two even used live down the street from each other, as well.
- And of course, Champ Staley (Coach Staley's dog) can be found at plenty of games supporting the softball program.
- Best friendship in sports? We won't argue with that.

CAROLINA RUNS THIS STATE

- Under the direction of head coach Beverly Smith, Carolina owns a 74-8 mark against other Palmetto State schools.
- That mark includes a 31-game winning streak that stretched over five seasons before Coastal snapped the streak in 2017.
- South Carolina went 7-1 last season against in-state foes.

SOME OF THE GREATS THAT HAVE COME THROUGH

- **Trinity Johnson:** 2004 Carolina Hall of Fame inductee, three-time All-American, 1996-97 Honda Award for Softball Player of the Year (the first Honda award winner for any sport at Carolina). She recently became the first Gamecock in program history to have her jersey retired. (Jersey was retired on the Saturday of the Alabama series in 2019).
- **Tiffany Tootle:** Three-time All-American, Led the nation in hits and runs in 1992 and 1993, one of four three-time All-Americans in school history. Was inducted into the UofSC Hall of Fame in 2006 and was the second to receive the honor.
- **Dr. Megan Matthews Buning:** 1999 NFCA All-American, led the nation in saves in 2000, two All-SEC nods and the 2000 SEC Tournament MVP award.
- **Darleen Lowery:** was a 2014 UofSC Hall of Fame inductee after a career in which she was named a two-time All-American. Notably led the nation with 9.49 strikeouts per seven innings in 1987.

WOMEN AT SOUTH CAROLINA: THEY RUN THINGS, Y'ALL

- South Carolina athletics has had plenty of high points to talk about with women's sports since athletics director Ray Tanner took over in 2012. Since that time, women's teams have posted 164 All-Americans, 232 All-Conference selections, 30 different national honors, eight national championships, 14 Conference Championships, seven conference tournament championships, finished the season ranked 50 different times and reached the postseason 63 times (11 teams).
- The past five years have been equally impressive with 103 All-Americans, 167
 All-Conference selections, 21 national awards, four national championships 12
 conference championships, five conference tournament championships, finished ranked 40 times and reached the postseason 47 times.

WHAT WILL THEY WEAR TODAY?

- South Carolina has worn more than 20 different uniform combinations during the past four years based solely on jersey, pants and socks/stirrups.
- Talking just jersey, pants and socks/stirrups the Gamecocks have close to 40 different combinations they could use this season.
- When you add in visors and/or belts, Carolina has more than 100 different looks at its disposal. With those two accessories thrown into the equation, South Carolina could go more than two seasons without wearing the exact same look in a season.
- Uniform combinations are selected by the senior class.
- South Carolina will have one student-athlete, Kelsey Oh, wearing the SEC graduate patch this season.

THE BRAND

- Since 1892, the colors garnet and black have been associated with the University of South Carolina's athletics teams. Carolina has a pair of primary logos you'll see in use with the softball program (the Block C and SC Logo).
- South Carolina softball represents the brand with garnet, black and white options for jerseys, pants and socks/stirrups.
- Carolina or Gamecocks can be found across the front of each jersey with the SEC patch on the right and Under Armour logo on the left.
- Starting with the 2007 football season, Carolina partnered with Under Armour, Inc., as the official outfitter of the University's athletics department. South Carolina was previously with Russell Athletics.
- South Carolina and Auburn are the only SEC schools wearing Under Armour apparel.
