# 1.2 Care and Maintenance

WARNING: Damage caused by misuse is not covered by your warranty. It is critical to understand and comply with the following guidelines.

WARNING: The lubricants and other accessories provided are for use with the accompanying patient simulator only. The lubricants and other accessories are not suitable for human use or medical treatment/diagnosis and should never be used for such purposes.

#### General

- · Ball point pens, ink, and markers permanently stain the skin.
- · Do not wrap this or any other Gaumard product in newsprint.
- Replacement parts are available from Gaumard Scientific or from your Distributor

### **IV** Arm

- Only use Gaumard's provided simulated blood. Any other simulated blood containing sugar or any additive may cause blockage and/or interruption of the vasculature system.
- The use of needles larger than 25 to 27 gauge will reduce the lifetime of the lower arms' skin and veins.
- Always purge with clean water and then drain the vein reservoirs at the end of the simulation session. Doing so will retard the formation of mold and prevent clogging of the system.
- We recommend flushing veins with 70:30 solution of clean water to isopropyl alcohol (IPA) at least once per month to prolong the life of the vasculature.
- When the arm skin and/or arm requires replacement, refer to the "Consumables" section of this guide. For more information regarding the replacement of consumable items please contact customer service.



# **Operating Conditions**

- · The simulator will only power on when connected to the AC power supply.
- Operating temperature: 50°-95° F (10°-35° C)
- · Humidity: 5%-95% (non-condensing)

# **Storage Conditions**

- · Store Simulator in a cool, dry place. Extended storage above 85 degrees Fahrenheit (29 Celsius) will cause the simulator to soften and slowly warp
- Humidity: 40%-60% (non-condensing)
- Do not stack or store heavy materials on top of the carton.

WARNING: To avoid damage to the simulator, please store and ship it in the clear poly bag provided.

#### **Procedures**

- · Do not attempt to intubate without lubricating the airway adjunct with mineral oil lubricant. Failure to lubricate the device will make intubation very difficult and is likely to result in damage to the simulator.
- · Mouth to mouth resuscitation without a barrier device is not recommended, as it will contaminate the airway.
- · Treat the simulator with the same precautions that would be used with a real patient.

### Cleaning

- · The simulator should be cleaned with a cloth dampened with diluted liquid dish washing soap.
- · Remove all traces of any lubricant.
- · Do not clean with harsh abrasives.
- · Do not use povidone iodine on the simulator.
- · Dry thoroughly.
- · The simulator is "splash-proof" but not water-proof. Do not submerge or allow water to enter the interior of the simulator.

- Articulated head, neck, jaw, arms and legs

- Bilateral lung expansion with realistic chest rise
- Accommodates assisted ventilation
- Ventilation is measured and logged

#### Circulation

- Chest compressions are measured and logged
- Umbilical pulse

#### **Simulator**

- Physical size is 50th percentile at 28-30 weeks gestational age
- Realistic airway with tongue, vocal cords, trachea and esophagus
- Heart, lungs and ribs



### **Venous Access**

- Patent umbilicus
- Intraosseous access at tibia
- IV training arm

# 2.2 Terminology

### **Facilitator**

The person conducting the simulation; an instructor or lab staff member.

# **Provider**

A person participating in the simulation as a healthcare provider.

# 3. Equipment Setup

### 3.1 Overview

# **Unpacking**

Lift the simulator from the soft blue case carefully with two hands. Remove the clear poly bag and lay him on a flat surface.

WARNING: To avoid damage to the simulator, please store and ship it in the clear poly bag provided.

# **Power Supply**

Connect the power supply to the power input located on Premie Blue's left side, and then connect the power supply to the wall outlet.

Always operate Premie Blue with the power supply connected.



#### **OMNI® 2 Connection**

OMNI® 2 controls Premie Blue's responses with the touch of a button. The tablet operates Premie Blue wirelessly.

Premie Blue can be operated using a wired connection. Please refer to the OMNI® 2 user guide to set up a wired connection.

Follow the steps below to connect to OMNI® 2:

- 1. Turn on OMNI® 2 by pressing and holding the ON button on the right side of the tablet.
- 2. Select "Allow" to turn on Bluetooth for the tablet.





3. A startup screen is shown while OMNI® 2 is detecting the simulator features.



- 4. Follow the on-screen tutorial OMNI 2 for a brief overview of the features of OMNI® 2.
- 5. Move onto the next steps in the Tutorial by selecting "GOT IT".
- 6. Exit the Tutorial at any time by selecting "HOME".

Please complete the tutorial once or it will continue to appear at start-up.



After the tutorial, OMNI® 2 will automatically proceed to the Favorites page and establish a connection to Premie Blue.

WARNING: Do not connect Premie Blue or OMNI® 2 to a computer, LAN network or unathorized diagnostic equipment. Doing so will cause serious damage to the equipment.



# 4. Premie® Blue Features

# 4.1 Airway Management

# **Pulmonary Ventilation**

Practice BVM techniques using an infant sized mask. Bilateral lung expansion is perceived with realistic chest rise. Effective CPR with Premie Blue and obtain feedback information via the OMNI® 2 tablet on the cadence and depth of chest compressions and airway ventilations.



Practice BVM techniques using an infant sized mask having a thick seal.

### Intubation

Premie Blue airway can be intubated orally and nasally using a 2.5 mm ID Endotracheal tube. An LMA can be used to ventilate Premie Blue orally.



WARNING: Nasogastric intubation is only for teaching placement technique. Fluids cannot be inserted through nasogastric tubes as internal damage will result.

WARNING: Before inserting ET, NP, or OP tubes always lubricate the distal end of the tube with provided lubricant. Failure to do so will damage the airway.

# 4.2 Circulation

# Palpable Pulses


Generate palpable umbilical pulses using the squeeze bulb. Connect the squeeze bulb to the port on the left side of the simulator.





#### **IV Access**

Premie Blue has IV access in the lower right arm that can be used for bolus or intravenous infusion as well as for draining fluids.





Applying pressure via the syringe permits the vein to stand out, simulating a clenched fist or a tourniquet situation. Release of the pressure simulates collapsed veins.

The IV training kit includes a blood dispensing syringe, synthetic blood concentrate, and spare arm skin.

# **Directions for Use**

# Filling IV System

Tube 1: filling

Tube 2: drainage tube



1. Place the end of the tube 2 into a drainage container and open the adjustable clamp.

# Drainage container not included in kit.

- 2. Fill the dispensing syringe with fluid.
- 3. Connect the syringe to the filling tube.
- 4. Allow fluid to flow through the system and into the drainage container.
- 5. Close the adjustable clamp of drainage tube.
- 6. Remove the syringe from the filling tube.









For IV simulations, place the end of the tube into a drainage container and open the adjustable clamp.

WARNING: Use only Gaumard's provided simulated blood. Any other simulated blood brand containing sugar or any additive may cause blockage and/or interruption of the vasculature system.

Use a 25-27 gauge needle set.

#### **IV Maintenance**

# Replacing the arm skin

- Gently pull the IV arm skin.
- 2. Add a small amount of lubricant to the arm.



3. Slide the replacement skin onto the arm.



#### Replacing IV arm


Replace the lower arm in case of damage or excessive fluid leakage.

The lower arm is connected to the upper arm at the elbow joint with a screwdriver and its recessive socket.

1. Undo the screw at the elbow joint.



- 2. Remove the screw and its socket from the joint.
- 3. Gently pull out the lower arm until the black electrical connector is visible.








5. The male electrical connector resides in the upper arm.



- 6. Locate the replacement item.
- 7. Take the female connector of the lower arm and attach to the male connector of the upper arm.







9. Attach the lower arm to the elbow joint.



10. Insert the screw socket into the elbow joint colser to the median plane of the simulator.



11. Place the screw into the other side of the elbow joint and fasten until the connection is secure.



# 4.3 Intraosseous Access

Setting up an intraosseous access line is an invasive procedure that can be simulated with the Premie Blue.

The intraosseous access kit includes: modified tibia bones, a fluid dispensing syringe, synthetic blood concentrate, and an additional skin cover.






The tibia bones supplied with your simulator are made from hard plastic that can be pierced by an intraosseous needle. Once holes have been made in the tibia it can leak. We have minimized leakage by controlling fluid pressure in the bone using inlet and drain valves.

### **Directions for Use**

Tube 1: filling

Tube 2: drainage tube



1. Place the end of tube 2 into a drainage container and open the adjustable clamp.



- 2. Fill the dispensing syringe with fluid.
- 3. Connect the syringe to tube 1 and release the fluid. Allow fluid to flow through the system and into the drainage container.



4. Once fluid is seen draining, close the tube 1 adjustable clamp.









- 5. Perform IO exercises.
- 6. When the training session is completed, open the drainage tube 2 adjustable clamp and drain the fluid. If needed, use the dispensing syringe full with air to push remaining fluid out the system.



If blood mix is used, flush the system with 2-3 syringes full of clean water.

Holes in the bone(s) that are made by the IO needle can be sealed with "Superglue".

# **Replacing the Tibia Bones**

#### Items needed:

- Tibia bone skin cover
- Replacement tibia bone
- Drainage container
- Drain all the fluids from the system.
- 2. Remove the syringe connector from the filling tube and clamp from the draining tube.



3. Remove the tibia cover.





4. Pull out the tibia bone out of the leg.



5. Insert the new tibia. The filling and drainage tubes are first, followed by the bone.



6. Re-attach tibia cover.



7. Connect the syringe connector to the filling tube and the clamp to the draining tube.





# 4.4 Cyanosis

Premie Blue features the SmartSkin in its forearms and lower legs to cause the skin to turn from a normal healthy color to a blue color indicative of peripheral cyanosis. It also features the SmartSkin in the cheeks to



indicate central cyanosis. This feature is controlled by the OMNI® 2 tablet.

Perform ventilations, and OMNI® 2 will automatically detect the ventilations to determine whether they meet or exceed conventional neonatal CPR standards. If acceptable, the OMNI® 2 tablet causes the skin to turn to a more healthy color, if inadequate or non-existent, OMNI® 2 causes the skin to turn toward a blue color. This feature is designed to work in tandem with the hypoxia model in th OMNI® 2 tablet control program.

# 4.5 Umbilical Catheterization

Premie Blue's umbilical cord can be filled with 1-2 cc of water using the syringe provided. Students can insert a lubricated umbilical catheter.

### **Directions for Use**

1. Remove the caps on the ports



2. Attach the drainage tube provided to the port on the Premie Blue's right side








- 3. Place the end of the tube into a drainage container and open the adjustable clamp.
- 4. Fill the syringe with fluid.
- 5. Connect the syringe to the port on the right side of the Premie Blue and push in fluid. Allow the fluid to flow through the system and into the drainage container.





6. Once the fluid is seen draining, close the adjustable clamp.

For catheterization, use an umbilical catheter.



WARNING: Lubricate the distal tip of the catheter before inserting in umbilical cord.

7. Perform umbilical catheterization exercises.



#### Heelstick


The right heel is molded of a soft material suitable for use with conventional Heelstick devices. Simulate Heelstick maneuver for capillary blood sample.



# 5. Using OMNI® 2

# 5.1 Main Screen

OMNI® 2 opens at the Favorites Page upon start up.




# **Changing a Vital Sign**

Vital signs can be quickly changed from the Favorites Page or from the "Vitals" page. Follow the steps below to change one of the parameters:

1. Tap on a vital sign.



- 2. Adjust the vital sign by utilizing the slider or the +/buttons.
- 3. Select "APPLY NOW".



Refer to the OMNI® 2 User Guide for more information on changing vital signs.



# 5.2 Hypoxia

In order to simulate a hypoxic event, navigate to the Hypoxia Page. This model allows users to treat the emergency with appropriate airway and ventilation exercises.

OMNI® 2 will detect ventilations automatically and will measure whether or not they meet or exceed documented CPR standards.



To start a hypoxia session, follow the steps below:


Select the initial state of the simulator. Choose from none, peripheral, or central cyanosis.



Premie Blue will display full cyanosis or partial cyanosis or a healthy state from these Hypoxia Stages.



- 2. Change the rate of deterioration and improvement so that the patient becomes more hypoxic if no ventilations are performed.
- Increase or decrease rate of deterioration
- 4. Increase or decrease rate of improvement per round of correct ventilation



5. Tap "START" to begin the session.



# 5.3 CPR

The CPR Page incorporated in the OMNI® 2 tablet was designed to help teach CPR by monitoring cadence and depth of cardiac compressions and airway ventilations in real time.


WARNING: Do not perform mouth to mouth ventilation since the simulator airway can be difficult to clean afterwards and will contaminate the airway.





# **Feedback Graphics**

Monitor the CPR session in real time. The CPR value ranges are AHA compliant.





# **Actions**

Buttons	Function
START STOP	Begin and end a CPR session
RESET	Reset a CPR session
METRIONOME	Activate an audible coach for training
<b>₩</b>	Virtually defibrillate the simulator

### Calibration

Before running a CPR scenario, please make sure to calibrate the compressions.

Perform the following to calibrate the compressions:

1. Tap the gear on the upper-right of the screen.




2. Select "Calibration".







3. Select "Compression" once the calibration window appears.




4. Adjust the Target compression depth with the +/- and tap "START"





- Connect the provided router to the wall.
- 2. Tap the gear on the top right of the screen.









The network name will be "GaumardSimulatorSerialNumber"

5. Exit the page by tapping the back button.





6. Tap the gear on the top right of the screen.



7. Select "Virtual Monitor".



- Follow steps 9-10 if the activation code was not inputted.
- 9. Verify that the serial number corresponds to the manikin.



10. Input a valid activation code.

The activation code is casesensitive.

Note that the activation code above is just an example. It is not a valid code.

- 11. Take note of the OMNI IP and OMNI port.
- 12. Select "CONNECT".






13. On the monitor, connect to the same network as OMNI® 2.



14. Once connected to the WIFI, open the Gaumard Monitors software.



15. Tap the V on the top left and then select "Comm Setup".



16. Verify that the IP address in the "Wireless Communication Noelle Setup" matches the Omni IP and Omni Port noted before.



17. Select "Connect".

# 7.2 Troubleshooting

# **Communication/Power Issues**

Communication with the simulator cannot be established		
Controlling tablet is too far away from simulator	Minimize the distance between sim- ulator and the tablet. Should not be over 10 meters away	
More than one device is paired	Open Bluetooth Connection Setup. Select the Gear to the right and click "Forget" the network	
Manikin is not paired	Disconnect the simulator from the power supply, turn off bluetooth on OMNI® 2 tablet. Plug the simulator back in and turn on bluetooth.	
Power supply is not connected to simulator	Ensure that the power supply is connected to the simulator	
Miscellaneous Issues		
CPR is not detected		
Compression sensor is not calibrated	Tap the Gear on the top right and select Calibration. Calibrate the compressions	
Ventilations are not detected	Tap the Gear on the top right and select Calibration. Reset the Ventilations sensor.
