3. The Bob Kerrey Pedestrian Bridge in Omaha is the Largest Pedestrian Bridge Connecting Two States

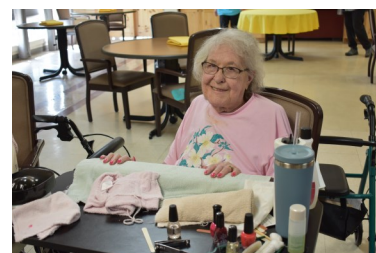
4. The Town of Cozad Sits Exactly at the 100th Meridian.
