Here we are already about halfway through another year. We have done some pretty fun things in activities, and we are hoping to add in some more new stuff that we hope the residents will enjoy.


We had a Cinco De Mayo party complete with Sangria(the real stuff), chips and salsa and of course a performance of the Macarena by the staff.
