Mrs. Loaring's favorite childhood memory was getting their family Christmas tree. And she remembers washing her dad's feet after he would come in from plowing. He would also give her all the change from his pockets.

She graduated from Carrollton High School in 1952. Her first job was at Belknaps in Louisville. She worked there as a stenographer. Unfortunately, Belknaps is no longer around. Humana has purchased the building.

When Eva was 16 years old, a friend who was in the Army asked a friend of his if he wanted to write to a good country gal. Lorne and Eva wrote each other for 2 years. He even called her one day while she was in school. The principal let her take the call. She finally met him when she was 18. He was supposed to come see her one day. However, he never made it and didn't call her. Eva was upset with

him. A week or so had passed and her brother invited her to go to a movie in town. She was sitting in the movie theater when suddenly, her dad was standing there.
