OREO TRUFFLES



Ingredients:

1 package Oreos (for mint, choose mint Oreos; for peanut butter, choose peanut butter)
1 bag of semisweet chocolate chips (12 ounces)
1 package of cream cheese, softened
1-2 teaspoons canola oil


Directions:

Smash the Oreos up as small as possible so your truffles aren't lumpy. Mix in the cream cheese, then roll them all into quarter-sized balls. Place the dough balls in the refrigerator to harden for at least 20 minutes. Once your time is almost up, pour the chocolate chips into a bowl, along with the canola oil, and microwave in 25-second intervals, stirring in between, until the chocolate is fully melted. It should be about as thick as cake batter. Cover truffle in a cloak of chocolate, and stick it on a parchment-lined baking sheet.

From there, send it back to the fridge for another 20-minutes. Leave overnight in fridge if you want, this is just so melted chocolate can harden.
