Message Title: Jesus is Hope for the Lonely who have Suffered Loss

Message Text: Luke 2:36-38

Introduction:

1 Timothy 1:1 Paul, an apostle of Jesus Christ by the commandment of God our Saviour, and Lord Jesus Christ, which is our hope;

There are many intriguing characters that play a part in the Biblical narrative of Christ's birth. Most of them were very common, unpopular and even hurting people. Whether it was the poor shepherds, the longing Simeon or the lonely Anna, the mere sight of Jesus as a baby brought great hope to their hearts. Hope because God's promise of a Messiah had indeed come true. Hope because Jesus Himself is hope. Today, we will look at the only three verses in the Bible concerning Anna and see how Jesus is hope for the lonely who have suffered loss. Do you know someone like Anna? Can you identify with her? May her story encourage your heart and draw you toward Christ who is our hope.

1. A Portrait of Compounded _____

(36-37a)

Luke 2:36-37a And there was one Anna, a prophetess, the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Aser: she was of a great age, and had lived with an husband seven years from her virginity; 37 And she was a widow of about fourscore and four years...

NOTE: A prophetess was a woman who was known for declaring God's truth. Anna is the only woman inside the New Testament to be called a



prophetesses. Miriam, Deborah, Huldah and Noadiah were Old Testament "prophetesses".

VIRGINITY — she had honored God and kept herself pure.

ANNA KNEW PAIN

Pain of a Broken ______ — Asher was one of the northern tribes that was lost during the exile.

Pain of Great _____ — Anna was likely over 100 years of age.

Pain of the Loss of _____ — Anna had lost her husband.

Pain of a _____ Womb — Anna did not leave the temple from the time she was widowed. (Proverbs 30:16)

Pain of a Lonely ____ — Anna had no husband as a companion or provider.

Pain of ____ — Anna faced continual poverty as a widow.

2. A Pattern of _____ Service (37b)

Luke 2:37b ...which departed not from the temple, but served God with fastings and prayers night and day.

TEMPLE — The temple was the center of life in Jerusalem.

NOTE: Being at the temple would provide many "triggers" for Anna and all the loss she had experienced.

DEFINITION—SERVE: to serve as an act of worship

3. The Power of _____ Expectation (38)

Luke 2:38 And she coming in that instant gave thanks <u>likewise</u> unto the Lord, and spake of him to all them that <u>looked</u> for redemption in Jerusalem.

JESUS WAS ANNA'S HOPE

GAVE THANKS — to profess openly in honor of another, whether in praise, thankfulness, or acknowledgement.

Matthew 12:34 ...out of the abundance of the heart the mouth speaketh.

BECAUSE JESUS WAS ANNA'S HOPE SHE SPAKE HIM TO OTHERS

DEFINITION—LOOKED: to wait; to look forward to the occurrence of or arrival of; to hope

DEFINITION—REDEMPTION: salvation; the buying back of a person from sin and its consequences via the death of Jesus Christ on the cross.

NOTE: Anna was aware of the others in Jerusalem that had this hope in the coming Messiah and He bound their hearts together.

Psalm 62:5 My soul, wait thou only upon God; For my expectation is from him.
