Message Text: Matthew 2:1-11

Introduction:

Matthew introduces us to some Christmas characters who were wealthy, wise men. They were foreign dignitaries whose profession was to provide insight and counsel to royalty based in part on their study of the stars. Similar to the experience of Daniel, these men would have known the opulence of being in the presence of a king. However, neither wealth nor wisdom had been able to satisfy the deepest cravings of their hearts. Today we will see how they found hope in Jesus Himself.

A. They were Diligent to _____ (1-2)

Matthew 2:1–2 Now when Jesus was born in Beth-lehem of Judaea in the days of Herod the king, behold, there came wise men from the east to Jerusalem, 2 Saying, Where is he that is born King of the Jews? for we have seen his star in the east, and are come to worship him.

NOTE: Likely these men traveled from Babylon, a center of astrology and astronomy. (550+ miles)

QUOTE: The fact that these magi undertook the long journey to Jerusalem in order to discover the newborn "King of the Jews," whose star they had seen, indicates that they were not Jews, but also that the great Messianic hope of the Jews, a hope in which they as Gentiles had place and part, had been communicated to them by Jews and had fascinated their hearts.—Lenski

THE PROPHECY OF THE STAR FROM BALAAM'S DIVINELY COERCED BLESSING UPON ISRAEL.

Numbers 24:17 I shall see him, but not now: I shall behold him, but not nigh: There shall come a Star out of Jacob, And a Sceptre shall rise out of Israel, And shall smite the corners of Moab, And destroy all the children of Sheth.

B. They were Undeterred by the ______ (3-8)

Matthew 2:3–8 When Herod the king had heard these things, he was troubled, and all Jerusalem with him. 4 And when he had gathered all the chief priests and scribes of the people together, he demanded of them where Christ should be born. 5 And they said unto him, In Beth-lehem of Judaea: for thus it is written by the prophet, 6 And thou Beth-lehem, in the land of Juda, art not the least among the princes of Juda: for out of thee shall come a Governor, that shall rule my people Israel. 7 Then Herod, when he had privily called the wise men, inquired of them diligently what time the star appeared. 8 And he sent them to Beth-lehem, and said, Go and search diligently for the young child; and when ye have found him, bring me word again, that I may come and worship him also.

DEFINITION—TROUBLED: distress or affliction or danger or need

HEROD DEMANDED ANSWERS FROM THE SCRIPTURES (4-6)

HEROD THE GREAT reigned from 73^{BC} - 4^{AD}. He was a paranoid tyrant.

Micah 5:2 But thou, Beth-lehem Ephratah, Though thou be little among the thousands of Judah, Yet out of thee shall he come forth unto me that is to be ruler in Israel; Whose goings forth have been from of old, from everlasting

HEROD PRETENDED TO BE A GENUINE SEEKER OF THE MESSIAH (7-8)

Jeremiah 29:13 And ye shall seek me, and find me, when ye shall search for me with all your heart.

A. Demonstrated in their _____ (11a)

Matthew 2:11 And when they were come into the house, they saw the young child with Mary his mother, and fell down, and worshipped him...

Philippians 2:9–10 Wherefore God also hath highly exalted him, and given him a name which is above every name: 10 That at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of things in heaven, and things in earth, and things under the earth;

DEFINITION—WORSHIPPED: bow down; to ascribe worth; to reverence.

See Revelation 5:12-14

NOTE: They did not worship _____, they worshipped Jesus.

Revelation 4:11 Thou art worthy, O Lord, to receive glory and honour and power: for thou hast created all things, and for thy pleasure they are and were created.

QUOTE: We must never rest until everything inside us worships God. — A W Tozer

John 4:24 God is a Spirit: and they that worship him must worship him in spirit and in truth.

QUOTE: It is not enough for us to be where God is worshipped, if we do not ourselves worship him. —Matthew Henry

B. Demonstrated in their _____ (11b)

Matthew 2:11b ... and when they had opened their treasures, they presented unto him gifts; gold, and frankincense, and myrrh.

GOLD, FRANKINCENSE AND MYRRH — costly gifts worthy of a King.

NOTE: It is likely that these gifts provided the resources for Joseph, Mary and Jesus to travel and stay in Egypt. (2:14)

What can I give Him, poor as I am? If I were a shepherd, I would bring a lamb; If I were a wise man, I would do my part; Yet what can I give Him? Give Him my heart. —Christina Georgina Rossetti

Romans 12:1 I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that ye present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable unto God, which is your reasonable service.

Romans 10:9 That if thou shalt confess with thy mouth the Lord Jesus, and shalt believe in thine heart that God hath raised him from the dead, thou shalt be saved.
