Jude wrote to believers who were experiencing the pressure from within and without to compromise Christian doctrine. There is nothing new. God's truth has always been questioned beginning in the Garden of Eden. However, throughout the Bible, God's people have been reminded of their personal responsibility to cultivate their own relationship with God regardless of the pressures around us. *John* 21:20–22, 2 Timothy 3:12–14, Jude 20–21) One of satan's most devious tricks is to get us to focus horizontally rather than vertically. DEFINITION—ABLE: to be sufficient to meet a need or task.

A. To Give you _____ in the Present (24a)

Jude 24 Now unto him that is able to keep you from falling...

DEFINITION—KEEP: guard; to keep watch over

Psalm 121:3-4 He will not suffer thy foot to be moved: He that keepeth thee will not slumber. 4 Behold, he that keepeth Israel Shall neither slumber nor sleep.

DEFINITION—FALLING: not stumbling; not walking unsteadily; (sure-footed as a horse that does not stumble—Wuest)

1 Corinthians 10:12 Wherefore let him that thinketh he standeth take heed lest he fall.



1 Corinthians 9:27 But I keep under my body, and bring it into subjection: lest that by any means, when I have preached to others, I myself should be a castaway.

B. To Guarantee your _____ in His Presence (24b)

Jude 24b ... and to present you faultless before the presence of his glory with exceeding joy,

DEFINITION—PRESENT: to stand up; to put into an upright position.

DEFINITION—FAULTLESS: unblemished; free from physical or moral defects.

John 17:24 Father, I will that they also, whom thou hast given me, be with me where I am; that they may behold my glory, which thou hast given me: for thou lovedst me before the foundation of the world.

Exodus 33:22–23 And it shall come to pass, while my glory passeth by, that I will put thee in a clift of the rock, and will cover thee with my hand while I pass by: 23 And I will take away mine hand, and thou shalt see my back parts: but my face shall not be seen.

Ephesians 1:4 According as he hath chosen us in him before the foundation of the world, that we should be holy and without blame before him in love:

POWER — ruling authority

Matthew 7:29 For he taught them as one having <u>authority</u>, and not as the scribes.
