Message Text: Psalm 1:1-6

Introduction:

Life can be complicated. It seems there are many big and little decisions that can radically change the outcome of one's life. However, in reality, it is not that complex.

The world urges us to listen to its news anchors, its scholars and above all do not disregard "science." In important life decisions, listen to friends and family and maybe a few co-workers too. Make sure that most of your counsel comes from those that are about the same age as you. The older generation just does not understand you.

God calls us to simply hear his voice, to be still and know that He is God assuring us that He will always be exalted above the heathen. God specifically revealed His Word giving mankind all that is needed relating to life's decisions and to godly living. The person who delights and meditates in God's Word will abundantly thrive even in the midst difficulty. While those who refuse it will experience total ruin. Truly, the decision to delight in Word of God is life-changing.

DEFINITION—favored (as by	BLESSED: characterized by happiness and being highly divine grace).

B. He _____ in the Word (2)

Psalm 1:2 But his delight is in the <u>law of the Lord</u>; And in his law doth he meditate day and night.

DEFINITION—DELIGHT: a feeling of extreme pleasure or satisfaction.

QUOTE: He finds it to be immensely interesting and relevant. It brings him joy and satisfaction. —Ellsworth

DEFINITION—MEDITATE: to murmur; to mutter; speaking to one's self in a low voice

QUOTE: Read the Bible, and read it again, and do not despair of help to understand something of the will and mind of God, though you think they are fast locked up from you. Neither trouble yourself, though you may not have commentaries and expositions; pray and read, and read and pray; for a little from God is better than a great deal from man. —John Bunyan

C. He ______ in the World (3)

Psalm 1:3 And he shall be like a tree planted by the rivers of water, That bringeth forth his fruit in his season; His leaf also shall not wither; And whatsoever he doeth shall prosper.

NOTE: The ungodly are likened to a heath in the desert — bramble; thorny, fruitless bush, *Geremiah 17:5-8*)
