Introduction:

Does defeat cause you to call out to God? If we are honest, it certainly does. We can identify with the individuals in Psalm 44. They were in the midst of defeat that prompted they to cry out to God. Interestingly, remembering the stories of God's marvelous works, that their fathers communicated to them, inspired them to call out to God from the midst of their defeat. Tonight, we will observe how that fathers have a long-reaching impact on the faith of the next generation.

Psalm 44:1 We have heard with our ears, O God, Our fathers have told us, What work thou didst in their days, in the times of old.

NOTE: These fathers had seen the powerful hand of God at work in days of old.

1 Chronicles 5:20–22 And they were helped against them, and the Hagarites were delivered into their hand, and all that were with them: for they cried to God in the battle, and he was intreated of them; because they put their trust in him. 21 And they took away their cattle; of their camels fifty thousand, and of sheep two hundred and fifty thousand, and of asses



two thousand, and of men an hundred thousand. 22 For there fell down many slain, because the war was of God. And they dwelt in their steads until the captivity.

Psalm 44:2-3 How thou didst drive out the heathen with thy hand, and plantedst them; How thou didst afflict the people, and cast them out. 3 For they got not the land in possession by their own sword, Neither did their own arm save them: But thy right hand, and thine arm, and the light of thy countenance, Because thou hadst a favour unto them.

NOTE: The past works of God was common conversation within the homes of godly Israelites.
