Message Title: New Life in Christ is Changing Everything

Message Text: Ephesians 4:1-3

Introduction:

The day you received Jesus Christ, all things became new with you. "Therefore if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature: old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new." (2 Corinthians 5:17) If that happened twenty years ago or if it was last week, it is still true. However, we have to be reminded often of this newness so we can act accordingly. Paul wrote to the Ephesian believers to help them to understand the beauty of their eternal salvation in Jesus Christ. "For by grace are ye saved through faith; and that not of yourselves: it is the gift of God: 9 Not of works, lest any man should boast." (Ephesians 2:8–9) He then urged them to walk in a way that would compliment their new life in Christ. "In brief, God says in Ephesian chapters 1–3, 'I have made you a saint.' In chapters 4–6, He says, 'Now, live a saintly life." (Wuest) This same exhortation is needed in our lives today.

Ephesians 4:1 I therefore, the prisoner of the Lord, beseech you that ye walk worthy of the vocation wherewith ye are called,

NOTE — Belief drives behavior.

DEFINITION—WALK: behavior, a decision to live of behave in a specified manner

DEFINITION—WORTHY: in a manner befitting or deserving (of some person or other object).



Philippians 1:27 Only let your conversation be as it becometh the gospel of Christ: that whether I come and see you, or else be absent, I may hear of your affairs, that ye stand fast in one spirit, with one mind striving together for the faith of the gospel;

DEFINITION—VOCATION: calling (state); all that is expected of a person who accepts God's summons to the hope of salvation in Jesus.

2 Timothy 1:9 Who hath saved us, and called us with an holy calling, not according to our works, but according to his own purpose and grace, which was given us in Christ Jesus before the world began,

Ephesians 4:2 With all lowliness and meekness, with longsuffering, forbearing one another in love;

DEFINITION—LOWLINESS: humility; the disposition of valuing or assessing oneself appropriately; especially in light of one's sinfulness or creatureliness.

QUOTE: The lowliness of mind which springs from a true estimate of ourselves—a deep sense of our own moral smallness and demerit. — Expositors

DEFINITION—MEEKNESS: gentleness; acting in a manner that is gentle, mild, and even-tempered.

QUOTE: A grace of soul...temper of spirit. — Trench

DEFINITION—LONG-SUFFERING: patient endurance of pain or unhappiness.

NOTE — This is patience with respect of persons, rather than patience in respect of things. —Trench

DEFINITION—FORBEARING IN LOVE: to bear; to endure something unpleasant or difficult whether on one's own behalf or on behalf of someone else.

QUOTE: We are to bear with one another "in love." It is in the sphere of the love that God the Holy Spirit produces in the heart of the yielded believer (Gal. 5:22), that we are to be patient with each other as misunderstandings arise, as cutting words are said, as unkind actions are done. The love shown at Calvary was a forgiving love. Ours should be the same. —Wuest
