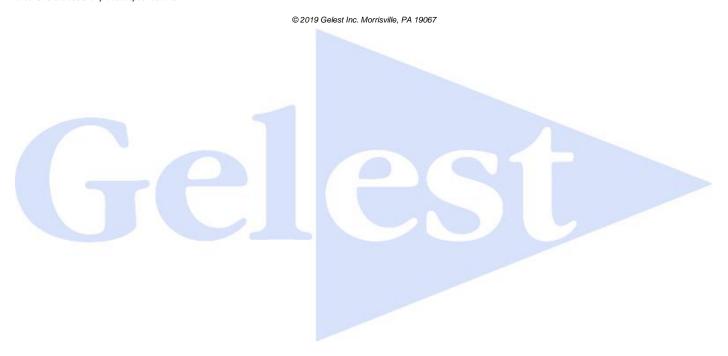

Pot life is 3-4 hours. Pour or syringe around part or into cavity. Cure at 115-120°C for 30-60 minutes or at room temperature for 48 hours. If the gel is too firm (low penetration) increase the ratio of A to B to 1.1:1, 1.2:1 etc.
