2013 GLVC FOOTBALL NOTES

Focused on Four

For the first time this season, just four games will be on Saturday's GLVC football slate as all eight league teams will be competing in conference action. Truman State will look to move to 2-0 in GLVC play with a road contest at William Jewell (0-2 GLVC), while Indianapolis (1-0) and McKendree (1-0) square off in Lebanon. Elsewhere, Saint Joseph's (1-0) will vie to stay on top of the standings following a road trip at Quincy (0-1), and Missouri S&T and Kentucky Wesleyan will battle in Owensboro for their first GLVC win of the year.

Rain Hinders GLVC Football Action Last Week

In early GLVC football action last Saturday, Truman State earned its first-ever conference win with a 33-0 shutout at Quincy, while Saint Joseph's bested Kentucky Wesleyan, 35-9 in a game that was called in the third quarter after a two-hour delay for lightning. In non-conference action, McKendree dropped its Homecoming matchup to Findlay, 38-21. Two games were also on the docket Saturday evening as Indianapolis survived frequent downpours and lightning to top Missouri S&T 34-3, while William Jewell fell 34-17 on the road at Fort Hays State.

Uindy Maintains at No. 21 in AFCA Top 25 Poll

Indianapolis, the defending GLVC Champion, remained 21st in the latest American Football Coaches Association Division II Top 25 Poll, following its 34-3 victory over Missouri S&T last Saturday. The Greyhounds actually share the No. 21 spot with Tarleton St. (Texas), which moved up from 22nd last week.

Pumas Moving the Ball on Offense

In the latest NCAA Statistics report released Monday, Saint Joseph's is found among the top-25 NCAA Division II programs in both rushing and total offense, as well as passing efficiency. The Pumas enter the weekend ranked 15th overall with 259.2 rushing yards per game and 20th in the country at 494.0 yards of total offense each time out. Senior quarterback Billy VandeMerk is also among the nation's most efficient passers, ranking 19th overall with a QB rating of 156.1.

Uindy Putting a Stop to Opposition

Just as impressive as Saint Joseph's has been on offense this season, Indianapolis has been equally dominant on the defensive side of the ball. After five weeks of play, Uindy ranks 10th in the nation in scoring defense, allowing just 15.4 points per game. The Greyhounds also rate 12th in passing defense (157.8) and 17th in total defense (297.8).

Places to Go

Last week two GLVC rushers set impressive conference marks in yardage per carry. McKendree's Ryan Herring carried eight times for 104 yards in a loss to Findlay, which equated to an average of 13.0 -- the best clip in the conference this year. Not far behind him was Missouri S&T's Chris Kennard, who rushed for 12.0 yards per carry last Saturday at Uindy. He finished the night with six attempts for 72 yards.

When Returns Are Allowed

While heavy rains halted much of the GLVC's offensive units this past week, the special teams success continued to shine as yet another punt return was taken back for a touchdown. Kentucky Wesleyan's Jeff Ward returned a Saint Joseph's punt 79 yards for the Panthers' lone touchdown of the game. The runback was the longest punt return in the conference this season and is the second-best in conference history, matching Quincy's Jarrod Sergeant's mark set last year against McKendree. Ward's return also marked the third punt return to be run back for a touchdown this season, while the GLVC also boasts four kickoff returns for scores this year.

Returns Revisited

The GLVC continues to be represented by some of the nation's top return games this season. In punt returns, three conference squads rank in the top five nationally, including No. 1 McKendree (42.0), No. 2 Kentucky Wesleyan (30.8), and No. 5 William Jewell (21.2). In kickoff returns, Truman State (31.13) ranks second overall, followed by No. 12 McKendree (26.06). Individually, a pair of Truman State standouts rank in the top 10 among kickoff returners nationwide. Tremaine Millender (40.0) has the nation's third-best average, while teammate Aaron Hartfield (32.5) is ninth.

Pick Five or Pick Six?

Speaking of returns, while there have been a total of seven punt and kickoff returns taken back for scores this season, not one "pick six" has occurred in the secondary. However, Uindy has become a favorite of the "pick five" this season, having now twice picked off five interceptions in a game. The Greyhounds first accomplished the feat against Saint Xavier on Sept. 14 and then matched that mark last week in the driving rain against Missouri S&T. With the Hounds' five picks last week, they soared to No. 1 on the Division II charts with 12 interceptions and fourth overall with 15 turnovers gained on the year. Junior defensive back Andre Smith snatched a conference-record three interceptions in the game and was named GLVC Defensive Player of the Week for his efforts.

GLVC, MIAA Enter Strategic Scheduling Alliance in 2014

The GLVC and the Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association (MIAA) announced jointly last week that the two NCAA Division II conferences have entered into a Strategic Conference Football Scheduling Alliance, which will enable MIAA members Lincoln University and Southwest Baptist University to join the GLVC in the sport of football only. The proposed four-year agreement, which is slated to begin in 2014, will give both Lincoln and Southwest Baptist associate member status within the GLVC. Each school will remain full active members of the MIAA in all other sports and will continue those MIAA competitive schedules.

The Strategic Conference Football Scheduling Alliance provides scheduling stability and non-conference flexibility for both conferences moving forward, while also addressing two major scheduling goals for each league, including:

1. The desire of Lincoln and Southwest Baptist to obtain more flexibility with their non-conference schedule;
2. A scheduling model for the MIAA that would allow all conference schools to play one another; thus crowning a true league champion at year's end;
3. The GLVC's interest in growing and stabilizing its football membership;
4. A schedule for the GLVC that addresses challenges current membership has faced with non-conference scheduling.

GLVC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

University of Indianapolis junior defensive back Andre Smith and junior kicker Scott Miller, as well as Truman State University senior quarterback Conrad Schottel have been named the Great Lakes Valley Conference Players of the Week, it was announced by the league office Monday. Schottel was named Offensive Player of the Week, Smith was picked as Defensive Player of the Week, while Miller was selected as Special Teams Player of the Week.

Schottel shined in Truman's 33-0 victory at Quincy on Saturday, completing 20-of-28 passing attempts for 197 yards with a 10-yard touchdown pass and a one-yard scoring plunge. After missing on his first two passes of the day, Schottel completed 16-of-19 the rest of the first half, including 10-of-11 in the second quarter in which Truman scored 23 points to put the game away. The Kearney, Mo., native used eight different receivers on the day before leaving the game in the fourth quarter. This is the first weekly honor for Schottel and the first for a Truman offensive player this year. The Bulldogs' Tremaine Millender and Jacob Lamp were both named on GLVC Special Teams Player of the Week on Sept. 9 and 23, respectively.

Smith registered a career-high three of Uindy's five interceptions in the Greyhounds' 34-3 victory over Missouri S&T on Saturday night. A native of Carol Stream, Ill., Smith stopped a Miner drive late in the second half with his first pick of the game. He tacked on a 23-yard return to help set up a Greyhound touchdown with just 22 seconds left, giving the Hounds a 17-3 edge at the break. On the second S&T drive of the third quarter, Smith notched his second INT of the game, leading directly to a Uindy field goal. He capped his heroics with a third interception early in the fourth, picking off quarterback Peter Simpson deep in Miner territory and setting up a 14-yard Uindy rushing TD one play later. Though he came one short of tying the school record for interceptions in game, Smith's three INTs were the most by a Greyhound since before 2002, the first season game-by-game interception statistics are readily available. He also added two pass break-ups and a solo tackle. A two-year starter at corner, Smith leads the GLVC with four interceptions on the season, while his six passes defended rank fourth. This is his first weekly honor and the third GLVC Defensive Player of the Week award for the Greyhounds this year. Todd Hacker earned the accolade on Sept. 9, while teammate Vince Maida followed suit last week on Sept. 30.

Handling place kicking, kickoff and punting duties for the Hounds, Miller had a solid all-around performance in the driving rain Saturday against Missouri S&T. The Indianapolis, Ind., native racked up 10 points on the night, connecting on both field goal attempts and all four extra points, while also pinning the Miners deep with his effective kickoff and punting work. Miller made good on a game-tying 20-yard field-goal attempt midway through the second quarter, and later split the uprights from 35 yards out to make it 17-3 in the third. He also dropped all four of his punts inside the Miner 20-yard line with his rugby-style approach and also averaging 60.3 yards on seven kickoffs. Also on the night, Miller became just the fifth-ever Greyhound and second kicker to surpass 200 career points. His career field goal percentage of 75.6 is tops in the Uindy record books, and he is just nine extra points shy of breaking the school's career mark for PATs. This is Miller's second career weekly nod as he was also recognized by the conference on Oct. 29, 2012 -- the last time a 'Hound earned the league's special teams award.
