The easy (download 155kb) scans the installed applications on your PC in seconds, compares the installed version with the FileHippo.com database to check for new releases, and then all detected updates in the browser in a list, as well as links to download updates. Read moreSynaptic/APT (Linux, Free)The Advanced Packaging Tool, also known as APT, is a free tool built into most Linux distributions and many versions that handle the installation, removal and upgrade of software packages. APT is a tool that has gone a long way towards making Linux a little friendlier to the masses who are not comfortable installing or compiling software packages for Linux, but running from the command line, so it's still not all that friendly people join Linux in Windows or mac worlds. Here comes the sun. Synaptic is APT's graphical foreground manager, which makes the device wildly more user-friendly and - yes - manages software monitoring and updating with aplomb. (People using Ubuntu, the most popular Linux distribution among Lifehacker readers, note: Synaptic will replace ubuntu software center with another APT-based update tool in April 2010.) There are dozens and dozens of distributions occupying all sorts of wide and niche markets.... Read moreAppFresh (Mac OS X, Free)AppFresh is an automatic update checker for Mac OS X. The tool checks your computer for installed software and checks for new versions against the database website I use this. Aside from including features of Apple's built-in Software Update utility (if you install this, you don't need to run it), the app filters updates and installed apps in a number of useful ways, and includes a description of each device in a handy information panel and along with release notes. Perhaps most impressively, AppFresh can automate the upgrade process with many apps, so you don't have to go through the tedious process of downloading and installing each update manually. AppFresh is free (although currently in Development Preview, which could mean it will eventually cost money), Mac OS X only. Update Notifier (Windows, Free)Update Notifier is a small portable software update utility that quickly scans installed applications and lists available updates in a small window, complete with links to websites where you can download updates. The app includes the option to filter all installed applications, only updates, major updates (2.0-3.0), minor updates (2.0-2.1), and install updates (2.0.0-2.0.1). If you sign up for an account on the CleanSofts.org website (the companion page of the application), you can also create a watch list and let your site email you when updates applications on the watch list Available. BearBear is a unique kind of note-taking app designed to make it easier for Mac users to take notes on the go. This will create

to-do lists, provide reminders, and outline future brainstorming sessions. It comes with many different inline styles, so you can customize your notes to your personal preferences and remember the environment in which you wrote them. HazelHazel from noodlesoft is an automated organization tool designed for Mac that helps you automatically organize your files based on every custom rules you want to create. For example, you can move untouched items from one folder to another folder, which is tagged with action items if they have not been addressed within a week.
