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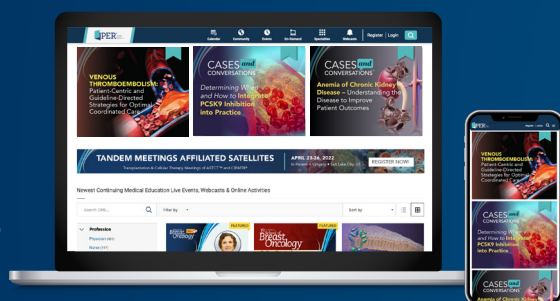

Originally from Venezuela, Narjust Duma, MD, completed a residency in internal medicine at Rutgers New Jersey Medical School and a fellowship at the Mayo Clinic in Rochester, where she served as chief fellow from 2018 to 2019. She is the associate director of the Cancer Care Equity Program at the Dana-Farber Cancer Institute and a thoracic medical oncologist at the Institute and at Harvard Cancer Center.

Her clinical interests include targeted therapy for lung cancer and the care of women with lung cancer, including the unique aspects of their survivorship. She is the principal investigator of the Sexual Health Assessment in Women with Lung Cancer (SHAWL) Study, the largest investigation to date into sexual dysfunction in women with lung cancer.

Dr Duma is also a leading researcher in cancer health disparities and gender/racial discrimination in medical education and medicine and a co-founder of #LatinasInMedicine, a Twitter community now numbering more than 6500 members worldwide. She has received numerous awards, including the 2018 Resident of the Year Award from the National Hispanic Medical Association, the Mayo Brothers Distinguished Fellowship Award, and the 2020 Rising Star Award from LEAD, the national conference for women in hematology and oncology.

In addition, the Duma Lab's long-term goals are to create a welcoming environment for medical trainees from groups historically underrepresented in medicine and improve care for vulnerable populations. Since its founding in 2019, the Laboratory has received funding from national agencies, published over 15 studies and editorials, and presented findings at national and international conferences, including the Annual Meeting of the American Society of Clinical Oncology and the World Conference on Lung Cancer. Dr Duma's work has been featured in *The New York Times*, STAT, Healio, *OncLive*, *The ASCO Post*, and Doximity.

A past president of the American College of Physicians, Dr López has dedicated her career to ameliorating health inequities through community-based participatory research and clinical trials that assess telecommunications technology as a means to facilitate access to clinical care and education. She has authored some 70 peer-reviewed articles and numerous book chapters. Dr López earned an MD from the Sidney Kimmel Medical College of Thomas Jefferson University and trained in internal medicine and hematology/oncology, earned an MPH in health policy and administration, and received a Cancer Prevention and Etiology Fellowship (T32, NCI) at the University of Arizona. She has served on the PCORI Advisory Panel on Addressing Disparities and the Advisory Panel on Healthcare Delivery and Disparities Research.
