Nokia originally developed a short messaging service to send short text messages between phones. Later, Nokia and Intel created Smart Messaging, a special protocol for transmitting functional, non-textinformation via SMS. By default, smart SMS messages are coded so that your phone can recognize graphics, ringtones, etc. The most common way to send ringtones over the airwaves is to visit ringtone websites, select tones, enter phone numbers and allow site administrators to send messages directly to your phone. Alternatively, you can use the SMS Gateway site to send specific messages directly to the phone. This means you can find the code for the ringtone you want, search for it in the appropriate format (such as Nokia binary format) and copy it to a smart message. Drag your music files to the iTunes Music library or tap Ctrl-O to get them. Find a song in your music library or playlist. Right-click on the file name and select Get information. In the open window, click the Options tab. Next to the start time and stop time of the song, change the time so that the box and the song length is 30 seconds or short. To start a song in less than a minute, change the start time to 1:00 and the stop time to 1:30. OK. Right-click the song. This time, select the Create AAC version to make a copy of the song in the AAC format. If you don't see this option, you'll need to change your iTunes preferences (see next steps). A duplicate 30-second version of the song appears in the music library below the original. If you don't have the option to create an AAC version of a song, tap Ctrl-B to reveal the iTunes menu bar. Then, in the edit menu, select your preferences and click the Get Settings button on the General tab. Click on the Use Import menu and select the AAC encoder. Double OK to close the preferences window. Right-click on the original song file - a file that still displays a full-time length - and choose to receive information again. Highlight and delete the start and stop times, and then click OK. This returns the original song file to a normal length. Open the Windows control panel, select Shape and Personalization, and then click the folder options. Click the View tab, and then clear the check box next to Hide Extension for known file types. You should be able to see the file extension of the song to make the ringtone file. Right-click on the 30-second AAC version of the song in iTunes and select Open in Windows Explorer. In Windows Explorer, right-click on the file and select Rename. Highlight the .mp3 extension and replace it with the .m4r file extension used for ringtones. Press Enter. In the upper-left corner, click the menu button in iTunes to say 'Music' and select a tone. A new ringtone appears on this page, indicating that you have made the correct changes to the file extension. Use a USB cable to connect your iPhone to your computer. Select your iPhone when it appears in the top right corner of the iTunes window. Click the Tone tab, and then click the Tone Sync button. After the sync is complete, apply it, then click Sync, close iTunes, and remove the USB cable. Start setting sit on the iPhone's home screen. Scroll down to touch the sound. Scroll down again to touch the ringtone. You can now select custom ringtones from the list of available options. Options.
