

The Purpose of Wisdom Literature



The biblical books of wisdom are important because they teach us how to live in the *real* world; the world that God created, and for which he established its material and moral order and purpose.

The wisdom books are primary sources for training in spiritual and moral knowledge, virtue, and practical wisdom—for children as well as adults—guides for "walking by the Spirit" (Gal. 5:16), cultivating the fruit of the Spirit (Gal. 5:22 - 23, and resisting being molded by the cultural zeitgeist (Rom. 12:1-2).

Wisdom?)

Biblically, wisdom is knowledge, understanding, and practice that lead toward *shalom* in personal, community, and national life.

Shalom refers to human life before God in holiness, harmony, creativity, and abundant joy; with oneself, with others, and with creation; in accordance with the way God has made the world.

The first principle of wisdom:

"The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom." (Pr. 9:10; see Pr. 1:7; Job 28:28; Eccl. 12:13; Ps. 111:10)

The fear of the Lord "means that God is constantly in the centre of our thought and apprehension, and life is characterized by the all-pervasive consciousness of dependence on him and responsibility to him." (Murray)

The Worldview of Wisdom Literature

- There is one God ("Yahweh"; the covenant God of Israel; the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob).
- God is the sole sovereign creator of the world and humanity.
- Creation including humanity has a material order and a moral order established by God.
- All human actions receive just recompense from God.
- Character is destiny.


The Worldview of Wisdom Literature

- Contemporary Implications

- Reality is determinate; it will not change according to our desires, designs, or delusions.
- Truth is one, objective, absolute, and indivisible; it cannot be overridden by "my truth" or "lived experience."
- Good and evil, right and wrong are real and objective moral distinctions they are grounded in God's character and will; they are not just humangenerated values or personal preferences.
- Personal identity is not self-determined nor infinitely malleable; it is formed in relationship & community.
