

Jamaica Deaf Village Trip



Discussion Questions

- I. What traits or characteristics of Jesus' do we see displayed in this passage? Where in your life have you observed those aspects of God's power or character?
- **II.** What do you think Peter must have been thinking when Jesus told him to cast his nets in deep water? Have you ever found yourself feeling like what God calls you to do seems almost pointless or futile? What might cause you to think that way?
- **III.** What do you think it was in Peter's mind or in his heart that caused him to fall down before Jesus upon getting this glimpse of His glory? How do you think Peter's heart had been prepared for that moment?
- **IV.** What might it look like in your own life to prepare your heart for worship at the sight of God's power? When has God displayed His power in your life? What has been your response in those times?
- V. After performing this miracle, Jesus tells the disciples that they will now be "catching men." Why do you think it was important that Christ first performed this miracle before telling them they would become fishers of men? What do you think He was showing them about Himself and about that mission?
- VI. Look at the response of the disciples when Christ called them. Perhaps God isn't calling you to leave your job or your home, but when He does call you to something, do you display this same kind of obedience and willingness to follow? What might that look like in your life?

GLIMPSES OF GLORY

Lesson 6: Authority over Men's Lives (Luke 5:1-11)

- I. The popularity of Christ's ministry: In light of healing many people, including Simon Peter's mother-in-law, Christ's ministry began to grow—Luke 5:1–3.
 - **A.** The popularity of Christ's ministry in Galilee grew as He continued to preach in the area of the sea of Galilee, also called the Lake of Gennesaret—Luke 5:1.
 - **B.** Christ encountered Simon Peter and his friends who had spent the previous night fishing and were now mending and cleaning their nets—Luke 5:2.
 - **C.** Christ got into Simon Peter's boat and had him go away from the land so He could more effectively teach the multitudes—Luke 5:3.
- II. The power of Christ over creation: Jesus directed these experienced fishermen to cast their nets in order to get a huge catch of fish—Luke 5:4–8.
 - A. Christ told them to let down their nets for a catch—Luke 5:4.
 - **B.** In a patronizing manner Peter agreed to let down his nets, even though they had fished all night and caught nothing—Luke 5:5.
 - **C.** These fishermen, who had caught nothing all night, have a catch that begins breaking their nets and requires another boat—Luke 5:6–7.
 - D. Simon Peter became convicted of his doubt and unbelief in seeing this huge catch—Luke 5:8.
- III. The power of Christ to call men: Christ called these fishermen to join him in bringing men to Himself—Luke 5:9–11.
 - **A.** Christ gave these astonished fishermen a new calling which was to catch men for Him—Luke 5:9–10.
 - **B.** Simon Peter and his friends willingly left their fishing enterprise in order to become fishers of men by following Jesus—Luke 5:11.
