Most of our Community Groups begin meeting together next Sunday evening for a new season of building relationships. If you'd like be part of a group this semester, contact Nolen Smith.





## **This Morning**

Lesson 13: The Resurrection and the Life—John 11:1–46 Reggie Coe, Family Pastor

- Christ and the request: Christ did not immediately respond to Mary and Martha's request in order that the Son of God would receive greater glory—John 11:1-7.
  - Α. Christ had a close relationship with the family of Lazarus, Mary and Martha— John 11:1–3.
  - B. Jesus saw the bigger purpose of God glorifying Himself through Lazarus's illness and death—John 11:4.
  - **C.** Christ waited until Lazarus had been dead several days in order to insure that everyone that witnessed this miracle would fully understand that Lazarus had died-John 11:5-6.
- II. Christ and the disciples: Rather than being controlled by the fear of the Jews, Christ chose to walk in light and chose to go to Bethany—John 11:7–16.
  - **A.** The Jews had tried to stone Christ—see John 10:39.
  - B. Christ refused to be controlled by the death threats of the Jews but went ahead in order to bring glory to God—John 11:7-15.
  - **C.** The disciples decided to follow Jesus, knowing it meant their lives were in jeopardy— John 11:16.
- **III.** Christ and Martha: Martha stated her faith in Christ as the Messiah and the one who would bring about the resurrection of the last days—John 11:17-27.
- IV. Christ and Mary: Mary goes to her familiar place, at the feet of Jesus, receiving comfort in the midst of her pain—John 11:28-37; see Luke 10:38-42; John 12:3.
- V. Christ and Lazarus: Christ brought Lazarus back to life, demonstrating again that He was the Messiah—John 11:38-44; see Matthew 11:2-5.
- VI. Christ and the crowd: While some believed in Him as Messiah, others reported this miracle to the chief priests and Pharisees—John 11:45-46.

## Discuss

These questions are offered each week to facilitate further discussion of this morning's topic in small group settings such as Community Groups or over dinner with family and friends. We hope you find them helpful to your spiritual growth.

- 1. When Jesus received word of Lazarus' illness, He did not immediately go to him. When was an instance you felt a desperate need for Jesus, only to feel like He wasn't working within your timeframe? What was your response in that instance?
- 2. When in your life has the Lord allowed you to experience loss or pain? Do you now see a greater purpose for that experience? How was God glorified through that?
- 3. The disciples urged Jesus not to return to Judea for fear of death, but Jesus' desire to obey and glorify God outweighed fear. What might be a decision you're facing right now that fear is influencing? How is God asking you to respond?
- 4. Martha had a good theology. She knew who Jesus was and what He was ultimately going to do in eternity, but that didn't seem to bring her comfort in her present circumstances. Have you, in your times of distress, ever felt like knowing God's eternal plan wasn't bringing you comfort in your present reality?
- 5. Jesus drew Martha's focus from the "grand scale of eternity" down to her exact needs in that moment. He showed her that He could raise her brother from the dead. In those moments of greatest need, do you believe Jesus cares deeply about exactly what you're going through? How would that belief affect the way you handle those struggles?
- 6. As Jesus came to Lazarus's grave, He wept. Have you ever felt that in your pain, God is distant, and perhaps even unsympathetic? How might this passage challenge that belief? What does it mean to you that Christ, who could and would bring Lazarus back to life, would take the time to weep with Martha and Mary first?
