
Welcome



Discuss

These questions are offered each week to facilitate further discussion of this morning's topic in small group settings such as Community Groups or over dinner with family and friends. We hope you find them helpful to your spiritual growth.

- 1. As they waited on Jesus, Peter and the other disciples returned to what they knew prior to becoming disciples in order to pass the time: they went fishing. Have you ever felt anxious waiting on God? How, in those instances, do you pass the time as you wait for Him?
- 2. Jesus invited His disciples to bring some of the fish He'd directed them catch so that He could add them to the meal he'd prepared for them. Think back to a time when God called you to service. How have you seen God use the fruits of your labor as a means of providing for you?
- 3. In Jesus's third post-resurrection appearance, He took time to sit and feed His disciples. In what ways have you felt most intimately loved by God? How has He taken care of you and shown His affection for you as His child?
- 4. Peter was obviously ashamed of his betrayal of Jesus, Who then gave him the opportunity to deal decisively with and be restored from that betrayal. Have you ever felt that you came up short or failed God in His calling for you? What would it mean to have the same conversation with Jesus that Peter had? How do you think Peter felt after Christ publicly reinstated him?
- 5. Peter had once boasted that he would never betray Jesus, overestimating, and perhaps overly-romanticizing, the magnitude and power of his feelings. In asking Peter three times about his love for Him, Jesus was leading Peter to an honest and realistic assessment of his affections. Have you ever found yourself swept up in emotion or zeal and perhaps over-estimating your faithfulness, only to be even more let down in your failure? What does it mean to you that Jesus sorted through that with Peter, and showed that He simply wants us to take our faith one day at a time?



Chapel Project Update

As is our custom, we are only committing to portions of the chapel project as the funds become available. We now lack just 3% of the total project cost, with about \$200,000 in new giving needed to finish landscaping, stained glass, and other features.
