KIDS AND FAMILIES

10:45 AM: Kids in Pre-K through third grade begin in the worship service with their families and stay until parents take them to an age-appropriate Bible lesson around 11:05. Grades 4 and up stay in worship with their family through the entire service.

Note: Pre-registration is currently required for nursery care due to social distancing capacity limits. If you're visiting today, though, please inquire at the check-in table about remaining space that may be available for your children!



MESSAGE | EPHESIANS 5:22-33

Lesson 14: A Transformed Marriage

- Experiencing a Genesis 2 Marriage in a Genesis 3 World— Genesis 2:18–3:19 (ESV).
- II. As the wife walks in the Spirit—Ephesians 5:22–24
 - A. The Calling: The Christian wife is to voluntarily yield herself to her husband's leadership as she honors the Lord—Ephesians 5:22.
 - **B.** The Reason: God has established the husband to serve as the sacrificial leader in the Christian marriage—*Ephesians 5:23*.
 - C. The Parallel: The wife's role in the marriage is analogous to the Church's submission to Christ where submission is both a voluntary act of worship and is intended to be complete—*Ephesians 5:24*.
- III. As the husband walks in the Spirit—Ephesians 5:25–32.
 - **A.** The Calling: The Christian husband is to unconditionally love his wife by following Christ's example of selfless and sacrificial love for the Church—*Ephesians 5:25*.
 - **B.** The Reason: God designed the role of the husband to love and serve his wife in ways that create the environment for her to grow in her spiritual maturity as she honors the Lord—*Ephesians 5:26–27.*
 - C. The Parallel: The husband's role in marriage is analogous to the Lord's intimate role in loving, nurturing, and cherishing the Church—*Ephesians 5:28–32*.
- IV. The Christian Marriage Summarized—Ephesians 5:33
 - **A.** The husband is to selflessly and sacrificially love his wife— *Ephesians 5:33a.*
 - **B.** The wife is to honor and respect her husband—*Ephesians 5:33b.*
