Lesson 2: Jeremiah’s Message—*Jeremiah 9:17–25*

- I.** In the midst of a turbulent time in the life of Judah, Jeremiah called God’s people to boast only in their relationship with Him—*Jeremiah 9:23–24*.

A. God’s judgment had come upon the nation of Judah.

B. In the midst of this judgment, God’s people were warned against boasting in their own wisdom, might, or riches.

C. Instead, they were to boast in knowing God’s character.
1. God exercises lovingkindness; He shows favor beyond reason.

2. God exercises judgment; He punishes the evil and saves the good.

3. God exercises righteousness; He always does the right thing.

II. When we understand and know the Lord, we become the type of person God calls us to be.

A. We trust Him and Who He is.

B. We model His character.

C. We realize He has us here, now.

D. We speak the truth appropriately.
