## Bible Study JONAH 2

- A Living Grave: Jonah's death seems certain as he plunges into the depths T. and is swallowed by a massive sea creature—Jonah 1:17-2:2
  - Surther Reference: Matthew 12:40-41
- A Foxhole Prayer: Jonah acknowledges that God is involved in his II. desperate situation and, in fear for his life, calls out to the only one who can deliver him.
  - A Downward Spiral: Jonah's prayer reveals a deep knowledge of the Α. Psalms, and he employs this knowledge in lamenting his deadly descent—Ionah 2:3-6
    - Q Further Reference: Psalm 3:4, Psalm 42:7
  - A Promise Made: It is implied that Jonah makes a vow to the Lord B. and anticipates he will be delivered—Jonah 2:6
    - **Q** Further Reference: Psalm 3:8
- A Second Chance: Jonah is indeed given an unusual deliverance to walk in III. the land of the living—Jonah 2:10
  - Turn to: Matthew 5:43-45
