- » GIVE AT ANY TIME: Financial giving in Grace Church is an act of worship to be done freely, joyously, and only as prompted by the Lord. Gifts can be made at any offering box or online through Church Center.

Bible Study | PHILIPPIANS 2:14-30

- Jesus' example of faithfulness (see 2:1–11) informs how we should live Philippians 2:14–18
 - A. Christ's ultimate faithfulness leads us to follow his example without complaining or arguing 2:14
 - B. This attitude allows us to live as lights in a dark world -2:15-16
 - c. Paul understands there is a purpose behind his suffering 2:17–18
- II. Timothy's example of faithfulness Philippians 2:19–24
 - A. Timothy was a model of self sacrifice for the sake of others, a living example of Paul's exhortation (see 2:3–4).
- III. Epaphroditus' example of faithfulness Philippians 2:25–30
 - A. Epaphroditus brought the gifts from Philippi to Paul and stayed with him to support in the work of ministry (see 4:18).
 - B. Paul's humanity and selflessness is on display in his eagerness to send Epaphroditus back to Philippi.
 - c. Epaphroditus models willingness to obey "to the point of death" like Christ.
