How do I sign up for a study or event? Paperless registration for everything is now available online through our website or the Church Center app on your smartphone. Visit gracechurch.com and click “Sign Up” on the front page or open Church Center and tap “Sign Up” in the menu at the bottom of the screen to get started.

General registration opens this Thursday, February 9, at 10:00 AM.

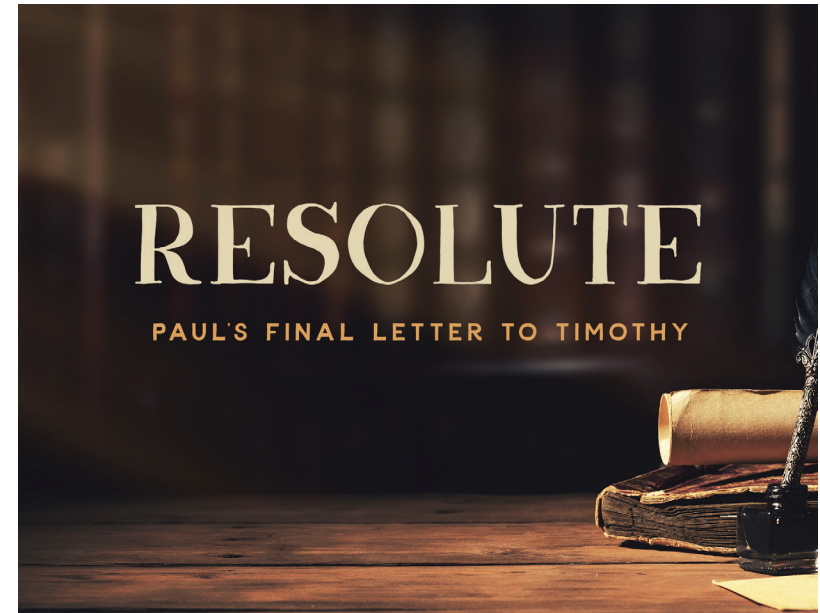

MESSAGE | 2 TIMOTHY 3:1–13

Resolute, Week 5: *These Last Days*

- I. The “last days” will be hallmarked by 19 destructive patterns in society from which believers are to avoid—2 Timothy 3:1–5.

A. The societal collapse in the “last days” refers to the entire period of time between the 1st Century and Christ’s return—2 Timothy 3:1.

B. Believers will see this collapse unfold as they observe 19 characteristics in their culture—2 Timothy 3:2–4.

1. Their Passions: Self-centered and consumed by greed (3:2a–3:2b).

2. Their Arrogance: Inwardly and outwardly proud who see no need of God, parents, or others (3:2c–3:2g).

3. Their Ungodliness: No respect for God’s standards, heartless towards others, and unforgiving (3:2h–3:3b).

4. Their Behaviors: Attack others with no internal control, they are savages who despise what is beneficial, they betray others without a care for others because they are arrogant and their god is their own pleasure (3:3c–3:4d).

C. Believers are to steer clear of those who merely look religious without embracing the true power of God—2 Timothy 3:5.

II. Until they are exposed, false teachers wreak havoc in the lives of spiritually weak people—2 Timothy 3:6–9.

A. These false teachers earn the trust of others and then seize the opportunity to manipulate and control the unsuspecting according to each person’s sin, guilt, and regret—2 Timothy 3:6–7.

B. These false teachers have been disqualified to teach the faith due to their corrupted minds—2 Timothy 3:8.

C. False teachers will be exposed for who they truly are—2 Timothy 3:9.

III. Since opposition is inevitable, believers are to follow the example of faithful believers and wait on the Lord’s salvation—2 Timothy 3:10–13.

A. In times of opposition, follow the examples of the godly believers who have modeled faithfulness and wait upon the Lord—2 Timothy 3:10–11.

B. The believer will face consistent and increasing opposition for pursuing a life of righteousness—2 Timothy 3:12–13.
