This Morning

The Parable of the Good Samaritan—*Luke 10:25–37*

- **I.** The setting for this parable: An expert in the law sought to test Jesus regarding the question of how one inherits eternal life—*Luke 10:25*.
- II. Christ turns the tables: Christ answers a question by asking the lawyer what he thought— Luke 10:26.
- **III.** The correct answer: The lawyer answered by quoting the two greatest commandments, to which Jesus said for him to do this and he would live—Luke 10:27–28.
- IV. Self justification: The lawyer wanted to reassure himself that he was obeying the second greatest commandment by wanting to know who one's neighbor would be—Luke 10:29.
- V. The parable: Christ told the parable of a man who was assaulted, robbed and left for dead and three individuals who came upon him—Luke 10:30–36.
 - **A.** A traveler journeyed down from Jerusalem to Jericho and robbers beat him and took his possessions, including his clothing—*Luke 10:30*.
 - **B.** A priest came upon the man and passed by to the other side of the road—*Luke 10:31*.
 - **C.** A Levite came upon the man and passed by to the other side of the road—*Luke 10:32*.
 - **D.** A Samaritan came upon the man and showed mercy and care to him by bandaging his wounds and taking him to the inn where he employed the innkeeper to provide for him—*Luke 10:33–35*.
 - **E.** Christ asked the lawyer which of these men demonstrated that he was a neighbor to the wounded man—*Luke 10:36*.
- **VI.** The clear conclusion: The one who showed mercy proved to be a neighbor to the wounded traveler—*Luke 10:37a*.
- **VII.** The convicting exhortation: Christ instructed the lawyer to show mercy to people who are in need—*Luke 10:37b*.
