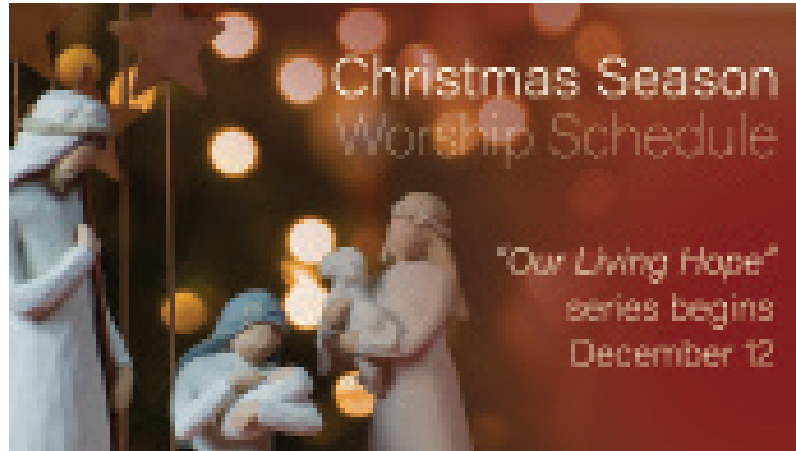

*No connecting hour classes. Childcare for nursery-aged children only.*

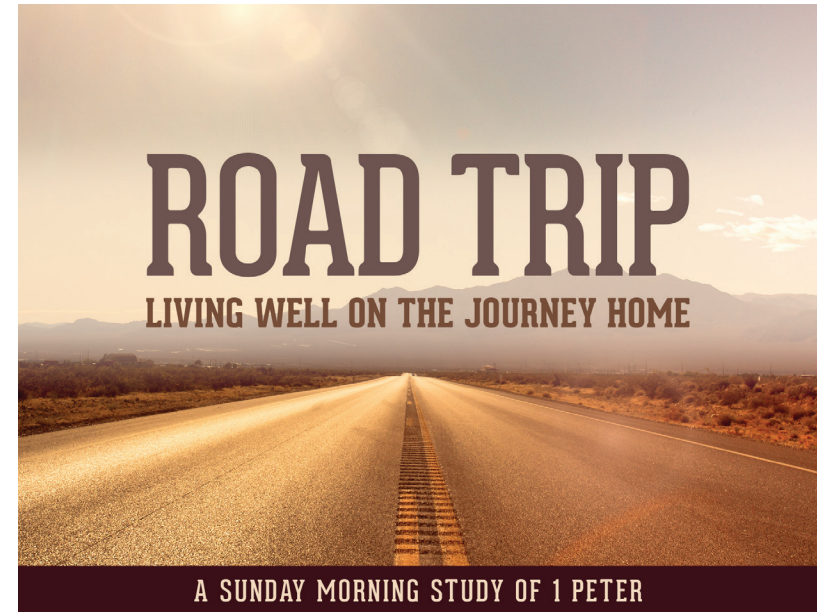

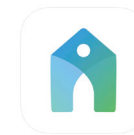


## WELCOME

MESSAGE | 1 PETER 4:7–19

**Road Trip, Lesson 8: Living with the End in Mind**  
Joe Cook, Pastor to Middle Adults

- I.    **Live with Intentionality**
- A.    Peter emphasizes the end of all things is imminent and he exhorts his readers to allow that reality to impact their prayer life—*1 Peter 4:7*.

B.    Peter emphasises that love for others should permeate actions, attitudes, and speech—*1 Peter 4:8–11*.
- II.   **Live with Expectation**
- A.    Peter describes a specific kind of suffering that is intense and should not surprise followers of Jesus but rather produce rejoicing—*1 Peter 4:12–16*.

B.    Peter explains that judgment comes to all and God starts with His own people—*1 Peter 4:17–19*.

Discussion Questions:

How have popular movies depicted the end of the world?  
How does knowing the end of a journey affect your perspective along the way?  
Who or what would be your priority today if you knew Christ was returning?  
How does the prospect of a fiery trial make you feel?
