PHASE ONE

Grace Church moved to Stone Lake Drive and began worshipping here in 2004. Over the past 18 years, our church family has grown and changed in a number of ways... and we believe it's time for our building to do the same. We have identified the projects listed below as the first phase of necessary changes and stand ready to begin construction when the Lord, through you, provides the financial resources to do so.



WEST HALLWAY

This crowded hallway at the west end of our building is currently used by families in the nursery, people entering the building, and adults heading upstairs.



CHILDREN'S AREA

We're relocating the primary entrance for our children's ministry area to allow more space, faster check-in, and better security for our kids and their families.



FAMILY RESTROOMS

It can be difficult on a Sunday morning for families to find the space they need to take care of their kids, change a diaper, and wash up. We're adding more.



EAST HALLWAY

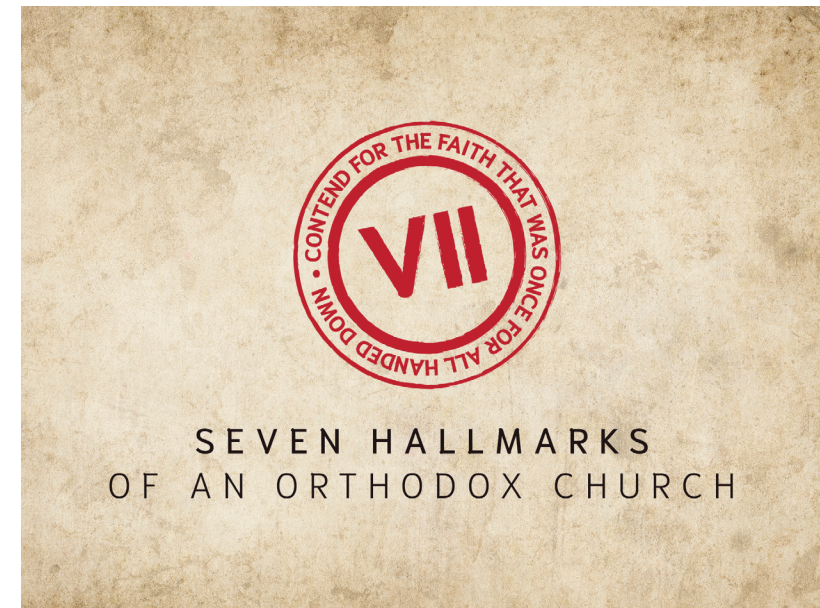
We're securing another entrance to our children's ministry at the far end of the building and adding on an additional office for our growing team.

A video this morning will introduce each of the projects above.

When will we build? We do not enter into debt and we will only begin construction when the necessary funds are in hand.

What are the next phases? We have plans in place to modify our adult classrooms upstairs, develop new large group gathering spaces, provide additional parking, and eventually remodel our main auditorium.

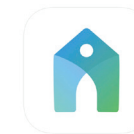


WELCOME

Week 5: Atonement

- I. We believe that Jesus Christ died for the world's sin as our substitutionary sacrifice. His sacrifice was acceptable before God on the basis of His own sinlessness. Only those who believe in Him are declared righteous and eternally acceptable before God—*Isaiah 53:4–5; Mark 10:45; Romans 3:24–26; 2 Corinthians 5:21; Colossians 1:19–20; 1 Timothy 2:5–6; 1 Peter 2:24, 3:18; 1 John 2:2.*

We believe that Jesus Christ physically rose from the dead and ascended into heaven, where as our High Priest, He is interceding for us and directing the church—*John 20:24–27; Acts 1:9–11; Romans 1:4; Ephesians 1:19–21; Philippians 2:9–11; Colossians 1:19; Hebrews 4:14.*
- II. **The Substitutionary Death:** Jesus Christ died both physically and spiritually on the cross by intentionally giving His life in the place of sinners who rightfully deserved death.

A. **Substitution:** Jesus died in the place of the sinner—*2 Corinthians 5:21.*
B. **Redemption:** Jesus paid the purchase price for the sinner's deliverance—*1 Corinthians 6:20.*
C. **Propitiation:** Jesus satisfied God's righteous demand against sin by paying the amount that was owed—*Romans 3:25.*
D. **Reconciliation:** Jesus changed man's relationship with God—*2 Corinthians 5:18–19.*
E. **Attestation:** Jesus is the greatest demonstration of God's love for humanity—*Romans 5:8.*
- III. **The Resurrection:** Jesus Christ's crucified body was raised from the grave into an imperishable body that is a prototype of every believer's future resurrection body—*1 Corinthians 15:17–19, 23.*


A. **Significance:** The good news of the Gospel is predicated on Jesus' death and resurrection—*1 Corinthians 15:3–8.*
B. **Trustworthiness:** Jesus said that He would rise from the dead—*Matthew 20:19; 1 Corinthians 15:13–19.*
C. **Effectiveness:** Jesus' ministries, on behalf of believers, as High Priest, Intercessor, Advocate, and Head of the Church continue—*Hebrews 2:17; Romans 8:34; 1 John 2:1; Ephesians 5:23.*
- IV. Some takeaways from an orthodox understanding of the Atonement, Substitutionary Death, and Resurrection:


1. Our eternal security is found in the finished work of Christ on the cross.
2. We can trust the "seemingly impossible" promises of Scripture.
3. We have a living High Priest Who is actively loving, serving, and leading on our behalf.
