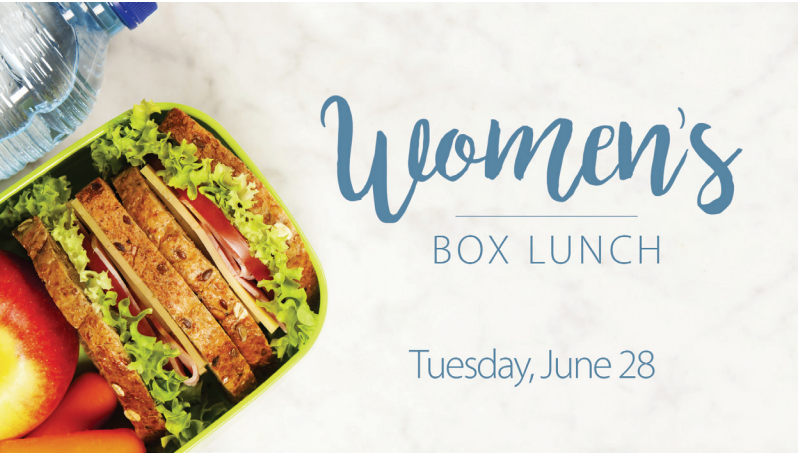

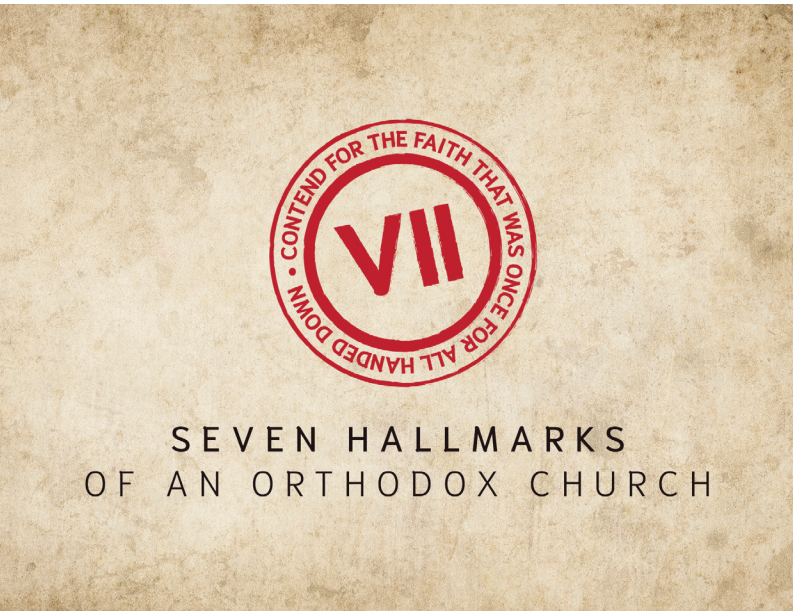

MESSAGE | SEVEN HALLMARKS

Week 7: The Second Coming of Christ

We believe that the church age will end with the following sequence of events, which could begin at any moment:

- I. **The Rapture:** Christ will appear and instantaneously gather all Christians to Himself (*see 1 Corinthians 15:51–58; 1 Thessalonians 4:13–18*).
- II. **The Tribulation:** This seven-year period under the domination of the Antichrist is characterized by divine judgments (*see Daniel 9:24–27; Revelation 4:1–18:24*).
- III. **The Return of Christ:** Christ will personally and visibly return, with His church, to Earth to defeat the forces of the Antichrist and bind Satan (*see Zechariah 14:1–15; Revelation 19:16–21*).
- IV. **The Millennial Kingdom:** Christ will personally reign on Earth over this thousand-year period of peace and righteousness. At the end of the millennium, Satan will rebel, again be defeated, and be cast into the lake of fire for eternity (*see Isaiah 11:1–16; Revelation 20:1–10*).
- V. **The New Heavens, New Earth and New Jerusalem:** Believers will eternally dwell in fellowship with God in this new creation (*see Hebrews 12:22–24; Revelation 21:1–22:5*).

Some takeaways from an orthodox understanding of the Second Coming

- 1. Believers are to live in a state of constant expectancy and hope—*Titus 2:13*.
- 2. Believers are sustained by the Lord’s promises and provisions as they eagerly await Jesus’ return—*Hebrews 9:28*.
- 3. Believers are to have the mindset of a steward who has been entrusted to care for the Master’s interests and await His commendation—*Matthew 25:21*.


