
Sunday Morning

THE CORINTHIAN CONUNDRUM

Lesson 2: When Personal Preferences Cause Divisions (1 Corinthians 1:10–17)


I. The directive: Paul appealed to the authority of Jesus Christ in directing the Corinthians not to allow their personal preferences to undermine their unity in the Body of Christ—*1 Corinthians 1:10*.


The process of a private, personal preference morphing into a faction:

- **1.** We start with a personal preference, taste, or opinion (valid and good).
- **2.** Next, we make a public statement about a personal preference taste, or opinion (still good, but calls for caution in how far we go).
- 3. Then, our public preference or opinion becomes a position, which divides people (wrong).
- **4.** Our public position becomes a platform, which is delineated in black-and-white terms.
- **5.** Our platform becomes a sect or faction, which has a life of its own.
- **II.** The problem: The apostle had been apprised of a four-party division within the Corinthian church— *1 Corinthians 1:11–12.*
 - **A.** Paul informed his readers that he had become privy to a major rift in their church through the outbreak of rivalry among them—1 Corinthians 1:11.
 - **B.** He identified the rift in the church as the fallout from the Corinthians taking a public stand on their personal preferences of at least four prominent leaders—1 Corinthians 1:12.
- **III.** The rebuke: Paul assaulted the presence of a sectarian spirit within the Corinthian church by appealing to the nature of the gospel and the ordinance of believers' baptism—1 Corinthians 1:13–17.
 - **A.** These divisions among believers are an offense to the person and work of Jesus Christ as the Head of His body— *1 Corinthians 1:13.*
 - **B.** The apostle was grateful that he had not contributed to the confusion among the Corinthians by baptizing any more than a handful of believers in the church—1 Corinthians 1:14–16.
 - **C.** Paul had been personally commissioned by the Savior Himself to proclaim the good news about Jesus Christ in a simple and straightforward manner, rather than invest himself in baptizing believers—1 Corinthians 1:17.
 - 1. Water baptism is not an inherent part of the Gospel of Jesus Christ.
 - 2. Believers' baptism is an important step on the pathway of discipleship in providing us with an opportunity to publically acknowledge our faith in Jesus Christ (*Matthew 28:19–20*).
