

#### The Corinthian Conundrum




#### THE CORINTHIAN CONUNDRUM


**Lesson 3: Christ—The Power and Wisdom of God** (1 Corinthians 1:18–2:5)

- **I.** The message of the cross: Paul preached the cross of Christ, which is considered foolishness by the world but is, in fact, the power of God and the wisdom of God—1 Corinthians 1:18–25.
  - **A.** While the unbelieving world views the gospel as moronic, God chooses to save those who believe in the message of the cross—1 Corinthians 1:18–19.
  - **B.** God uses the foolishness of the gospel to refute those who rely on their philosophical, religious, or argumentative superiority—1 *Corinthians* 1:20–21.
  - **C.** Jews trip over the message of the cross and Gentiles mock it as foolishness, but those who embrace it receive its power and wisdom—1 Corinthians 1:22–25.
- **II.** The people of cross: God uses weak and insignificant folks to demonstrate His excellence and power over the so-called wise and mighty of this world—1 Corinthians 1:26–31.
  - A. God typically works in the lives of common people who humbly believe His message—1 Corinthians 1:26.
  - **B.** He demonstrates His superiority through a foolish message, through a helpless people, and through despised ideas to nullify worldly wisdom so that no one can boast in His presence—1 Corinthians 1:27–29.
  - **C.** Christ embodies His wisdom and provides us with a right relationship with Him that includes being set apart and purchased for His purposes—1 Corinthians 1:30.
  - **D.** The only appropriate object of our praise and confidence is the Lord—1 Corinthians 1:31.
- **III.** Paul's preaching of the cross: Paul did not base his preaching on skillful oratory or convincing arguments, but on a simple and clear declaration of the cross of Christ—1 Corinthians 2:1–5.
  - **A.** Paul preached the message of Christ's death, burial, and resurrection in simple, straightforward language— *1 Corinthians 2:1–2.*
  - **B.** Paul ministered in humble dependence upon the Lord so that their faith would rest in God's powerful truth— 1 Corinthians 2:3–5.
